# From the Pastor's Desk

ewer than two weeks until Christmas... Third Sunday of Advent... Gaudete Sunday, or the Sunday to Rejoice! Time is running out, and some of us are beginning to panic... with everything still to get accomplished. I offer some thoughts, or "admonitions," today that might be useful during these last frantic days until Christmas.

Shout for joy! Be glad and exult! Is there any reason to shout for joy? Come up with three reasons.

The Lord has removed the judgment against you! Do I really believe that? Do I really believe that God is merciful beyond all human understanding? What will it take for me to embrace this mercy?

Fear not, don't be discouraged! Why am I afraid? What's causing my discouragement today?

God is in your midst! Really? Is God really here? How is God concretely in my life today?

God will sing joyfully because of you! *Give me a break!* Why would God sing about me? Come up with three reasons.

Your kindness will be known to all. So, what? Who cares about my kindness and does it really make any difference? When **has** my kindness made a difference?

Have no anxiety. Make your requests known to God. Does God really care about my anxieties? Do, I turn my anxieties and worries over to God or even let God know what they are?

The peace of God will guard your hearts and minds. If only I knew were to find that peace. An open heart might help the peace to be found. Do I really prefer conflict and am I the cause of conflict? Am I letting God's peace guard my heart and mind?

Share your clothes, food, and resources with those who have nothing. Would I share what I have with Jesus? Jesus is in the poor, so what am I sharing with the poor? What do I need to do to welcome Jesus?

John the Baptist preached Good News to the people. Sometimes, the Good News is bad news for me. What is the bad news I need to embrace in my life? How is grace present in the bad news?

These last several days can be a challenge as we struggle to finish up the Christmas chores. The greatest chore we

need to complete before Christmas Day that of finding time for our hearts to connect with the love that God has for us, the mercy God offers us—the joy and excitement that God shows us in God's creation. Perhaps we can refocus ourselves; our "chores" can be gifts to others through our gladness, our courage, our faith in God's presence among us, our joy, and our kindness, our freedom from worry and anxiety, our peaceful hearts, and our sense of hospitality to all God places in our path of life. This is the Good News that John the Baptist preached.

We remember the words attributed to St. Francis of Assisi: "Preach always and only use words when necessary."

For the next 10 days of Advent, I suggest that we take one of the "admonitions" listed above and let it become our advent meditation.

"Who are you?" Pope Francis responded simply, "I am
a sinner." By acknowledging this reality, Pope Francis also fully


Help Decorate for Christmas Wednesday, December 23 4:00-5:30 pm • 7:00-8:00 pm

#### Paint Restoration Half Finished!

he restoration of the ceiling and upper walls of the rear half of the Church has been completed. Over the next couple of weeks, work will continue on the lower walls, the vestibule, the stairway to the choir loft and in the Reconciliation Room. We will have a few weeks' respite from scaffolding



until December 28, when scaffolding will be erected in the nave and altar areas and remain through February 16. Pews will be removed from the naves, and scaffolding supports will be placed near the side doors, so be careful when entering or exiting the Church from those doors.

Thank you all for your help and cooperation over the last several months. We could not have gotten so much done so quickly without everyone's support. We are half-way through the project!
