Day to day affairs of running the school are being managed by the Principal assisted by appropriate staff under overall supervision of the School Committee comprising 3 or 4 representatives of the Trust, the Principal and a representative of the teaching and non-teaching staff. The School Building is spacious with all modern facilities and is designed to accommodate students from Std. I to Std.. XII with a seating capacity of 3,400 students; working in two shifts. The motto of the school reads " "which means "MODESTY ADORNS KNOWLEDGE."

The school does not receive any Grant-in-Aid from the Government and the only source of income is the amount of fees collected from the students.

The Trust holds exemption u/s 80G of the Income Tax Act and is registered with the Charity Commissioner under Registration No.E8297 (BOM) dated 17-8-1981 as a Public Charitable Trust with the object to establish and/or run educational institutions.

Any constructive suggestion from the parents whose children are being admitted to the school shall always be welcome. The Trust Office is housed in the Yashodham High School Building, Goregaon (E), Mumbai - 400 063. where such constructive suggestions can be recorded with the Trustee-in-charge.

Parent-Teacher Association has been established on 16.12.1997 vide circular from School Education Department of Government of Maharashtra. Each parent shall be a member of the PTA.

SCHOOL INFORMATION

- LAKSHDHAM HIGH SCHOOL was inaugurated on 12.6.08. The medium of instruction in the school is English. The school is permanently unaided.
- The School prepares students for INDIAN CERTIFICATE OF SECONDARY EDUCATION EXAMINATION (ICSE).
- 3. The aim of the school is to develop all the facets of the personality of a student through liberal education and broad curricula. The school stands for academic excellence, development of skills and formation of character through curricular and extra-curricular activities which help to broaden the mental outlook of the students and provide opportunity to discover and develop the latent talents in them.
- 4. The objective of the school is to prepare the students to face challenges of life, to encourage the creative ability, to help them understand their obligations to society and to inculcate humane and aesthetic values. This objective is realized by arranging various activities like mock parliamentary sessions, competitions, exhibitions, field-trips, seminars, 'Zero Hour'. Hobby classes, swimming facilities and free coaching for different games and sports is also available.
- The school has a well-equipped Auditorium Computer Laboratory, Physics, Chemistry and Biology Lab Library and an audio-visual room with latest equipments and offers Computer Education for both Primary and Secondary Sections.
- 6. a) Hindi is taught from Std. I upwards and there is provision for opting for the regional language from Std. I onwards.
 - b) Hindi and Marathi is offered as IInd language in Std IX & X.
- Physical training, and outdoor games are compulsory, unless a doctor's certificate is produced.
- 8. Admission of children to the school is open to all irrespective of caste, creed, religion and sex.
- 9. At the time of admission to the school the age limit prescribed by the B.M.C. (for Std.l) shall be rigidly adhered to. child seeking admission in Std.l shbuld complete 5 years by the 15th June of the year in which the admission is sought. No relaxation in the age limit will be made.
- 10. Should the Parent / Guardian feel that his/her child is not making progress the principal should be contacted for guidance. Our Teachers are not permitted to offer Private Tuitions. The parents are advised to refrain from engaging teachers either from the school or from outside for coaching as such tuitions normally do more harm than good. It encourages students to be inattentive in class


ADMISSIONS / WITHDRAWALS

- Parents seeking admission for their ward in Std. I will have to produce any one of the following documents to confirm the date of birth.
 - a. Birth certificate given by hospital / municipality.
 - b. School leaving certificate from the Pre Primary school.
 - c. Affidavit filed by the parent.
- For seeking admission the parent / guardian will have to fill the admission form online and attach scanned copy of necessary documents not exceeding the size as per the format given in the admission notification published on the school website.
- 3. At the time of admission to the School, the age limit prescribed by the State Government shall be rigidly adhered to. For Std. I admission, the child should be born between 1st June 2009 to 31st May 2010.
- 4. On being granted admission, the parent / guardian will have to Produce the necessary documents in original for verification.
- 5. A child coming from a recognized school will be admitted only when a school leaving certificate from the school he / she has last attended, is produced. The school leaving certificate or transfer certificate should bear the recognition number of that school. In case of students coming from schools outside Maharashtra State / or from other boards, the School Leaving Certificate must be countersigned by the Educational Inspector of the area in that state from where he / she comes.
- 6. All withdrawals from the school can be made only on the written request for the same giving one calendar month's notice or paying fees equivalent to one month in lieu of the notice period by the parent / guardian of the child to the Principal. Application for a leaving certificate, should be made by the parent / guardian on the prescribed form provided in the school calendar. Signatures of both the parents, is mandatory on the application form.
- 7. In case of request for a duplicate of the school leaving certificate, the parent / guardian, will have to produce an affidavit stating therein what has happened to the original certificate and why a duplicate School Leaving Certificate is needed.
- 8. In case of adopted children, a certified copy of adoption document is to be submitted at the time of admission.
- In all matters regarding admission, Principal's decision shall be final and binding on parents.



RULES REGARDING LEAVE, ABSENCE ETC.

- 1. Regular Attendance is essential.
- Students must be present in the school after holidays/vacations on the re-opening day of the school. They must also remain present in the school on the last working day of the school, preceding the holidays/vacations. School authorities must be informed immediately in case of emergencies/exigencies arising on these days.
- 3. School authorities must be informed immediately in case of emergencies / exigencies arising on these days.
- 4. A medical certificate with supporting medical papers will have to be produced immediately in case of absence due to sickness and while resuming school after sickness, a medical fitness certificate must be submitted by the student.
- 5. A student should not remain absent from the school except in case of emergency. On the day on which he/she returns to school, the student must produce a note in the calendar from his/her parent/ guardian stating the reason for the absence. The School accepts no responsibility if due to failure in producing this note from the parent/ guardian, the student is sent back home during class hours.
- 6. If the child is ill or is suffering from some contagious disease, the Principal should be informed of the same within two days by the parent/guardian supported by a medical certificate. The child should not be sent to school till he/she is free from any danger of carrying infection. At the time of resuming school, the child must produce a medical fitness certificate.
- 7. Unexplained absence over a period of a month renders a pupil liable to have his/her name struck off the roll. If he/she is re-admitted, the admission fee must be paid again.
- 8. Any student who is late in attending school, should bring with him/ her a written application from his/her parent/guardian for late attendance. Child will be sent home with the parent.
- 9. No student will be permitted to leave school early. **No half day leave** will be granted.
- 10. Attendance and wearing of P.E. Uniform at official school functions, like Sports day, Independence day, Republic day etc. is compulsory. Absentees will be penalised.

RULES FOR THE STUDENTS

- 1. This is an English medium school. All the students are expected to speak in English.
- 2. Students must bring the calendar everyday to school.
- 3. The school uniform and identity card must be worn every day. A student without proper uniform will be sent back.
- 4. Uniform worn should be neat and tidy, hair properly combed and shoes well polished.
- Students should not wear jewellery, costly wrist watches and should not bring valuable items to school.
- 6. Books not recommended, magazines, comics etc. should not be brought to the school. No article liable to be a source of disturbance should be brought to school. Use of Mobile Phones in the school premises is strictly prohibited.
- 7. Students are expected to arrive at school before the assembly bell. Habitual late comers will be sent home after three late remarks.
- 8. Any student coming late will not enter the class unless he/she brings a note to the teacher from the Vice-Principal/Principal.
- 9. Students must maintain silence in the school. They must maintain discipline when moving from one class to another. They should move in a single file only.
- 10. No student will be excused from physical education without a Doctor's Certificate.
- 11. No collections will be made by the students unless permitted by the Principal in advance.
- 12. Students are not allowed to give presents to the teachers.
- 13. Students are not allowed to distribute sweets/presents/eatables of any kind on their birthday. Instead they can voluntarily donate a book/s to the school library, to inculcate the good habit of reading and sharing.
- 14. Students should look after their books, clothes, pens, wrist watch, money, etc. School does not accept any responsibility for loss of such things.
- 15. Students should be regular, courteous, well-behaved, disciplined and clean in their dress and habits.
- 16. A student who is persistently insubordinate, wilfully mischievous, guilty of misconduct and/or has unwholesome influence on fellow students is liable to be expelled from the school.
- 17. A student is responsible to the school not only for his/her behaviour in the school but also for his/her general behaviour outside. Every effort should be made by the student to keep up the good name of the school by his/her manners and deportment. Students should greet their teachers/visitors when they meet them.
- 18. Students will not take part in any political activities.
- 19. During the absence of the teacher, the Prefect or Monitor will be responsible for the order and discipline of the class.
- 20. It is forbidden to buy eatables from street vendors.
- 21. Students are expected to keep THE SCHOOL PREMISES CLEAN.
- 22. All **Lakshlites** are expected to:
 - show respect to all the teachers.
 - avoid shouting, whistling or running in the school building.
 - avoid using indecent language.
 - avoid throwing paper, stones etc. anywhere in and around the School premises, except in the bins provided for the purpose.

- 6. It is imperative for parents to collect their children from the point at which they are left by the school bus otherwise the children will be brought back to school.
- 7. Parents should explain the concept of good touch and bad touch to their children.
- 8. Parents can form car pool groups for leaving and bringing children to and fro from school.
- Parents should supervise/stay with the children when they go down to play.
- 10. Sending children to shops/shopping centre, alone should be avoided.
- 11. Parents should give their children a Re. 1/- coin so that children can call home from the nearest P.C.O. in case of emergency.
- 12. Parents should ensure that the correct phone numbers of the residence and office are written in the calendar and their signatures are at relevant places
- 13. Parents are advised not to send their children to school if they are

RULES FOR THE SCHOOL LIBRARY

- 1. The Library is open from Monday to Friday: 07.00 a.m. to 06.15 p.m. Saturday: 10.00 a.m. to 01.00 p.m.
- 2. Pupils will be given library cards for borrowing books and each pupil is responsible for the books taken on his/her card. The librarian shall confiscate the cards of the students who contravene the library rules.
- 3. Books will be issued for the use of the BORROWER only.
- 4. A pupil can borrow or return books once a week only.
- 5. Books should not be kept for more than a week. At the end of each period the books may, if desired, be renewed at the discretion of the Librarian. However, for such a renewal, the book must be produced.
- 6. Failure to return a book on the expiry of the period of a week, the pupil will be penalised (Re.1/- per day).
- 7. Books must be kept clean and used carefully. No marking should be done in the Library book. Any imperfection found in them or any damage done to them must be reported to the School Librarian before taking the book home. The damage done to books or magazines and loss of books will have to be made good by the pupil concerned.
- 8. Reference books and magazines cannot be borrowed or taken out of the Library.
- Students can borrow parallel text-books of ICSE syllabus against their library cards.
- Students must consult the Librarian/teacher for the books recommended for their specific age group and record should be maintained in the calendar (Library Record)
- 11. All books must be returned in good condition before the beginning of each Terminal Examination and before a Leaving Certificate is issued. The borrower who fails to return a book must pay a fine equal to the value of the book.
- 12. No personal books, bags, satchels, electronic gadgets and eatables are allowed in the library. Any personal books found will be confiscated. Only note-books, school calendar and a pencil may be taken in.
- 13. Every pupil should help to keep the Library clean and tidy and see that the books and magazines are kept in their proper places.
- 14. Strict silence must be observed in the Library and conversation should be kept to the minimum and sound should be low.
- 15. The Library should be used <u>only</u> for perusing reference books, parallel text books, periodicals and reviews.
- 16. Before taking the School Leaving Certificate/Hall Ticket every student is requested to return all Library books and get the Librarian's signature in the application for Clearance Certificate. Necessary form is provided at the end of the calendar.
- 17. Library will be closed on Public and National Holidays.

RECOMMENDATIONS TO PARENTS

- Parents and Guardians are reminded that without their help and co-operation not much can be achieved by the efforts made by the school to mould and improve the character of the child. They are earnestly requested to instil discipline.
- 3. Parents are also earnestly requested to peruse and sign the reports of the child, or any other remarks made by the School Authorities in the calendar and do the needful in the matter.
- 4. Parents should not engage school teachers as private tutors, vide item 10 under School Information. We strongly discourage private tuitions. Instead, we would suggest that you inculcate in your ward the habits of self-study and regularity in study. And also create at home a conducive atmosphere to study. Avoid all kinds of disturbances like T.V. radio, video, Internet etc. Let your child surf the net only for essential information under your supervision.
- 5. Parents are requested to refrain from giving any gifts to the members of the staff.
- 6. Parents are requested to refrain from celebrating their child's birthday in school in any way.
- 7. If any student is found to have done damage of any kind in class or in and about the school premises the parents/guardian will have to make good the loss. Decision of the Principal regarding the amount to be paid will be final.
- Criticism of your child's teachers in the presence of children should be avoided as it encourages them to lose respect for their teachers. In case of any grievance kindly meet the Principal.
- 9. IDENTITY CARD FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS/SERVANTS IS A MUST FOR ENTERING THE SCHOOL PREMISES. Parents are requested to refrain from entering the school premises except for meeting the Principal or Teachers by appointment. Parents are requested to advise servants/guardians who come to collect your wards from school and not to remain in the school premises any longer than is necessary.
- Parents are advised to make it a point to attend the Open House as indicated in the calendar. <u>They will not be allowed to meet</u> the teachers without prior permission from the Principal on other working days.

- 11. If your child is suffering from infections conditions like viral fever.  - 1. Telephone Number of Parents.
 - 2. Person to be contacted immediately incase of emergency.
 - 3. Medication / First Aid to be given.
 - 4. Telephone number of the Doctor.
 - 5. Brief medical history of the child.
- 13. Parents and guardians are requested to notify the school of any change in their address and telephone number.
- 14. There will be a penance study class for an hour for those who fail to do homework, or for any other reason that the teacher or the Principal will state in the calendar.

 Please Note:

If the child is detained or sent back during school hours due to said reason, in that case the responsibility towards security of the child will not be that of the school.

- 15. Parents are informed that their children are liable to be sent home for any of the following reasons:-
 - (i) Arriving late for school.
 - (ii) Not wearing proper uniform with IDENTITY CARD
 - (iii) Not having a remark made by the School Authorities in his/her calendar signed by his/her parent/guardian.
 - (iv) Repeatedly forgetting to bring books. Not submitting work on time.
 - (v) Not acknowledging the receipt of worksheets/circulars/report cards.
- 16. Parents are advised not to request for half days or leave, as project assignments and assessments will be conducted regularly. Absence will lead to irregularity in testing procedures and incompletion of day to day work which will result in forfeiting honour cards and grade points. Please note no **MAKE-UP TEST** will be conducted.

RULES REGARDING FEES

- Term fees must be paid in June along with I-Quarter Tuition Fee and in December along with III-Quarter Tuition Fee. Fees can be paid Quarterly, half-yearly or yearly.
- 2. Fees for the months of April and May must be paid in March, and this holds good even for those who wish to leave the school in March, April & May.
- 3. The delay of payment beyond 3 months renders a pupil liable to be struck off the roll. If the pupil is re-admitted the admission fee must be paid again.
- 4. If a student is to be withdrawn, one calendar month's notice should be given in writing by the Parent/Guardian to the Principal of the school to arrange for the refund of the balance of tuition fees. In exceptional circumstances of withdrawal, one month's tuition fee in lieu of one calendar month's notice will have to be paid. Amount collected as Term Fee or Tuition Fee will not be refunded.
- 5. Students whose fees are not paid will be considered as defaulters.
- 6. Unless all dues are paid by the student, the results of the examinations/tests conducted by the school will not be communicated to the student. School Leaving Certificate will not be issued till all the outstanding dues from the student at the time of leaving the school are paid and clearance certificate from the concerned authority is obtained.
- 7. Students who leave the school in the month previous to any vacation must pay the fees for the vacation.
- 8. No deduction in fees will be allowed for vacations or for broken period of the month. Full month's fee will be payable if the student's name appears on the roll on the 1st day of the month. Admission fee will not be refunded even if the student, for any reason, leaves the school immediately after securing admission.
- 9. Std.X (ICSE) students will have to pay fees till May, in the month of December.



- 2) Payment made from the 11th of the due month will be received in cheque only at the school office and will be subject to a surcharge of Rs.20/- till the end of the month. **Thereafter** a surcharge of Rs.40/- per month or part thereof shall be paid additionally.

BUS FACILITY

The school provides bus service to the students of the Primary Section and Secondary Section of LHS under the aegis of G.A.E.T.

INSTRUCTIONS:

- The bus facility is extended to students only when there is an availability of seats and is offered at the Principal's discretion. This offer can be withdrawn any time.
- Students will board and alight only at fixed bus stops. Parents
 and children are requested not to ask the driver or attendant to
 stop the buses at unauthorised bus stops.
- Parents are not permitted to change the bus stops, without prior permission. In case there is a change in the bus stop, the parents must inform the school in writing.
- Children must obey and must be courteous to the bus-in-charge.
 Children found misbehaving in the bus will not be allowed to continue availing the bus facility.
- In the event of the child not being at the stop at the scheduled time the bus will proceed without the child. It will be the responsibility of the parent/guardian to drop the child to School. In the event of there being no one to receive the child at the stop of the return journey the child will be brought to the school and the parents will have to collect their child from the school authorities on presentation of their Identity Card.
- If the parent doesn't want their ward to avail the bus facility for some reason on a particular day, the school must be informed about it in writing.
- In case of any grievance, parents must inform the school authorities in writing for appropriate action. Parents must not enter/board the school bus for any reason.

BUS FACILITY

IDENTITY CARD:

- Children using the bus facility need to carry a Bus ID Card issued by the School.
- In case there is a change in the residential address the school office must be notified immediately and a fresh ID Card must be obtained.
- If the Bus ID Card is lost a written application requesting a duplicate ID Card must be submitted in the school office immediately. Collect the duplicate ID Card from the School Office.

WITHDRAWAL

- Parents must note that no refund will be made against bus fees Paid.
- One month advance notice in writing must be given by the parents to the school office, in case they wish to discontinue the bus facility.
 (Applicable only if student is leaving school or changing residence.)
 Viz -
 - * For withdrawal after I term written notice must be submitted by 10th of October.
 - * For withdrawal after II term written notice must be submitted by 10th of April.

Note:

- One month's fee is payable as Admission Fee (Non-refundable) at the time of enrolment.
- Bus enrollment form should be filled and submitted along with each installment of the Bus fees.
- Medical Health Report form is printed at the end of the school calendar.
- No bus child will be permitted to go home without submitting the permission letter duly signed by the authorised signatories.


