Pre-School and kindergarten students would love to read and listen to nursery rhymes, fables, and fairy tales. First and second grade students love joke books, riddles, and tongue twisters. Third graders can start to enjoy longer more involved books like chapter books and novels. When you spend this time with your child, ask them specific questions about the characters, the plot of the story, and how they think it connects to their life. Fifteen minutes of daily reading is the most positive educational boost you can give your child.

Whenever it is possible during these cold winter months, the students will have outdoor recess. Please remember to send your child to school with mittens and a hat. Students who walk home from school or to their carpools are reminded to stay on the sidewalks and off the neighbors' properties often. Please reinforce this at home. 

Science Lab is a blast as we continue our Geology Unit, working as geologists as we explore different types of rocks and their characteristics.


