IN PREPARATION FOR 4 JANUARY 2015— EPIPHANY OF THE LORD



First Reading: *Isaiah 60:1-6* The last part of the book of Isaiah contains the words of a prophet who lived after the Jews returned from exile in Babylon, (which is modern-day Iraq). They found their temple destroyed and the city leveled. But with great faith the prophet envisions a wonderful future for Jerusalem.

Second Reading: Ephesians 3:2-3,5-6 The Ephesians were a community in which Jewish and Gentile converts to Christianity lived side-by-side. The author of this letter confirms that God's saving grace is available to everyone, whatever their ethnic or religious background.



ST. LUKE BOOK CLUB: Thursday, January 15th at 7:00 PM in the rectory is the discussion of the book, "A Star for Mrs. Blake" by April Smith. In 1929, US Congress passed a law to cover

expenses for over 6000 Gold Star Mothers to visit the graves of their sons in France – a little known fact in the Depression Era of American history.

Amid other interesting historical facts, the author develops the stories of five of those mothers, all of whom are affected differently by the loss of their sons. <u>CALENDAR ALERT!</u> The Holy Father and the Bishops of the world met in Rome in October and completed a first draft of a document on issues facing family life in the Catholic Church today. This year is set as side to

listen and dialogue with different publics on how the Church is perceived in terms of ministry to God's People. Next October of 2016, a final document will be published. Does the Church grasp contemporary family life? Will there be changes in how we perceive marriage and those preparing for it? Is there discrimination in pastoral practice? Are we sensitive to the burdens society places on families? Will ministry to the divorced be considered? Cohabitation? Declining birthrates? Will change in our current Catholic practice emerge from this Synod?

On three Wednesdays, January 28, February 4 and February 11th. the document will be reviewed, current teaching explained, and conversation encouraged. The rectory conference room will be the site for a morning and an evening session; morning from 9:30-11:00 AM and evening from 7:00-8:30 PM.
