Secondly, a family story is that the Minahan's left Troy for a four year time span to live in Memphis Tenn. I recently have come to think it might have been between 1896 - 1900 that they did live in Memphis. They were back in Troy for the 1900 census. The only way to prove my theory true or not is to find them in Troy somehow between 1896-1900. Are there street directories or any way someone can think of that I could find them (or not) in Troy in that time frame.

Story of the First Through Ellis Island Is Rewritten By SAM ROBERTS

Annie Moore is memorialized by bronze statues in New York Harbor and Ireland and cited in story and song as the first of 12 million immigrants to arrive at Ellis Island. Her story, as it has been recounted for decades, is that she went west with her family to fulfill the American dream – eventually reaching Texas, where she married a descendant of the Irish liberator Daniel O’Connell and then died accidentally under the wheels of a streetcar at the age of 46.

The first part of the myth seems authentic enough.

Hustled ahead of a burly German by her two younger brothers and by an Irish longshoreman who shouted “Ladies first,” one Annie Moore from County Cork set foot on Ellis Island ahead of the other passengers from the steamship Nevada on Jan. 1, 1892, her 15th birthday. She was officially registered by the former private secretary to the secretary of the treasury and was presented with a \$10 gold piece by the superintendent of immigration.

“She says she will never part with it, but will always keep it as a pleasant memento of the occasion,” The New York Times reported in describing the ceremonies inaugurating Ellis Island.

As for what happened next, though, history appears to have embraced the wrong Annie Moore.

“It’s a classic go-West-young-woman tale riddled with tragedy,” said Megan Smolenyak Smolenyak, a professional genealogist. “If only it were true.”

In fact, according to Mrs. Smolenyak Smolenyak’s research, the Annie Moore of Ellis Island fame settled on the Lower East Side, married a bakery clerk and had 11 children. She lived a poor immigrant’s life, but her descendants multiplied and many prospered.

The story of the immigrant girl who went west, however, became so commonly accepted that even descendants of the Annie Moore who died in Texas came to believe it. Over the years, several have been invited to participate at ceremonies on Ellis Island and in Ireland.

It took some genealogical detective work to find the proper Annie. After offering a \$1,000 reward on the Internet a few months ago for information about Annie Moore, Mrs. Smolenyak Smolenyak teamed up with New York City’s commissioner of records, Brian G. Andersson, and discovered the woman who they have concluded is, in fact, the iconic Annie Moore.

Joined by several of her descendants, they are scheduled to announce the results of their research tomorrow at the New York Genealogical and Biographical Society in Manhattan.

Mrs. Smolenyak Smolenyak (a genealogist’s dream: she’s a Smolenyak married to a previously unrelated Smolenyak) became interested in Annie Moore four years ago while researching a documentary film on immigration. Pursuing the paper trail, she found that the Annie who died instantly when struck by a streetcar near Fort Worth in 1923 was not an immigrant at all but was apparently born in Illinois. Moreover, she traced that Moore family to Texas as early as 1880.

“I realized it was the wrong Annie,” she recalled.

Then, what had happened to the Ellis Island Annie?

Mrs. Smolenyak Smolenyak made little progress for a few years, but her search was reinvigorated this year after she moved to southern New Jersey and visited a genealogical exhibition in Philadelphia featuring a 1910 photograph of the Texas Annie. (The photograph might also have been a model for Jeanne Rynhart's two bronze sculptures, one of which is at Ellis Island.)

She posted a challenge on her blog for information about the immigrant Annie Moore. She also mentioned it to Mr. Andersson, who she knew was very interested in genealogy.

"With the power of the Internet and a handful of history geeks we cracked this baby in six weeks," she said. "Brian found this one document, and we knew we had the right family. We had the smoking gun."

What Mr. Andersson found was the naturalization certificate belonging to Annie's brother Phillip, who arrived with her on the steamship. He was also listed in the 1930 census with a daughter, Anna. They found Anna in the Social Security death index. That identification led to her son, who is Annie Moore's great-nephew.

On her first try, Mrs. Smolenyak Smolenyak was lucky enough to find the great-nephew listed in a directory. "As soon as I said 'Annie Moore,' he knew instantly - 'That's us,' " she said. "They had been overlooked, but they had sort of resigned themselves. I think they're very happy to be found."

Her \$1,000 reward is to be split between Mr. Andersson, who is donating it, and Annie's great-niece.

As for Edward P. Wood, a New Jersey plumbing contractor who is descended from the Texas Annie Moore and has been feted on Ellis Island, Mrs. Smolenyak Smolenyak said that when she told him of her findings, he said, "I'm disappointed, but I'm not heartbroken."

The Annie Moore who arrived in steerage and inaugurated Ellis Island initially joined her parents, who had arrived several years earlier, apparently in a five-story brick tenement at 32 Monroe Street in Manhattan. (One of many problems that complicated Mrs. Smolenyak Smolenyak's search, she said, is there is also a 32 Monroe Street in Brooklyn.)

Records indicate that Annie Moore later moved to, among other places, a nearby apartment on New Chambers Street - near the Newsboys' Lodging House and the Third Avenue El on the Bowery.

The area now includes the Alfred E. Smith Houses, a public project constructed in the early 1950's and named for the governor who grew up nearby, and the Knickerbocker Village complex of rental apartments built in the 1930's.

"She had the typical hardscrabble immigrant life," Mrs. Smolenyak Smolenyak said. "She sacrificed herself for future generations."

According to her latest research, Annie's father was a longshoreman. She married a bakery clerk. They had at least 11 children. Five survived to adulthood and three had children of their own. She died of heart failure in 1924 at 47. Her brother Anthony, who arrived with Annie and Philip on the Nevada, died in his 20's in the Bronx and was temporarily buried in potter's field.

Annie lived and died within a few square blocks on the Lower East Side, where some of her descendants lived until just recently. She is buried with 6 of her 11 children (five infants and one who survived to 21) alongside the famous and forgotten in a Queens cemetery.

Her living descendants include great-grandchildren, the great-nephew and the great-niece. One of the descendants is an investment counselor and another a Ph.D.

Mrs. Smolenyak Smolenyak described them as "poster children" for immigrant America, with Irish, Jewish, Italian and Scandinavian surnames. "It's an all-American family," she said. "Annie would have been proud."

So far, this turns out to be one of the few cases in which historical revisionism may have enhanced a legacy instead of subverting it. As one guidebook says: "Annie Moore came to America bearing little more than her dreams; she stayed to help build a country enriched by diversity."

Does anyone know this McManus branch? They seem to have had an unusual story for their time and circumstances: riches to rags. According to the Boyle parish register and family info, my ggg grandparents James McManus and Bridget McDermott had Thomas (b. 1827), Winifred (1829), Catherine (1833), James (1834), Mary Ann (1836), and Eliza (1839). They were related to the Tighes. Family info also says the father was a schoolmaster and they left in 1839 (before the famine!?!?), stopped first in Montreal, then Lachine, and possibly northern NY, and ended up around 1850 in Troy/Albany, NY. Of that I've been able to confirm only their arrival in Troy.

Thomas married Isabella Montague and became wealthy with his own Hudson River shipping firm, but lost everything and died in a charity hospital. Winifred married the liquor dealer Thomas Behan and did well, but Catherine married Laurence Grattan and died young, Eliza married Alexander McDonald and they both died young, James died in a charity hospital too, and my gg grandmother, Mary Ann, married another liquor dealer named Robert McDonald, who also lost everything -- and in 1876 she shot and killed him.

Any information about them, and the likelihood of their emigration before the famine, would be appreciated.

I have not used their services but the examples we saw of data were very good.

Kathy and I visited Ireland in 2004 and stayed in a thatched cottage in Mitchellstown (30 miles north of Cork). We spent a charming day in Cobh and their museum. Over 2 million Irish people left Cobh for America. The Titanic made its last stop there in 1912 before its fatal departure for the US.

There are dozens of great pubs right around the museum and there is a Cathedral on top of a hill overlooking the seaport. At the time we visited Cobh I didn't know even the names of my great great grandfathers nor the year they left Ireland. I now have that info though I still don't know what county or town they came from. If I can find where they came from we'll be returning to Ireland and Cobh.

Let me know what they provide you. I don't know if I have enough for them to check but I guess they could at least tell me if any of my relatives came through Cobh.

Have you checked out their web site? If you don't know where your immigrant came from in Ireland They can't help.

If you know where the immigrant originated they apparently will save you having to travel around several county sources. For example, I found that in Dublin one had to go to each parish to check Baptismal records. I did not find what I was looking for but then I didn't get to all the parishes.

I contacted a recommended professional genealogist in Dublin several years ago and she wanted US\$60.00 to do a "preliminary evaluation". I figured that was about one hour's work and declined the offer.

John Eustace b. 1827 m to Margaret -family in Nelson, Cheshire Cty, NH 1860 census moved to Rutland, VT to work in gas house 1870 Census. Oldest son Alexander b. 1855 in Keene, NH.

Edward Eustace b.1828 m. Mary Living in Rutland, VT with his family 1880. Oldest daughter b. in Ire 1870. Oldest son Alexander b. 1872? in VT.

James Eustace b. 1830's m. Johanna Ahern living in Keene, Cheshire, NH. Oldest son Alexander b. 1863. All children work in Gas works.

Christopher Eustace b. 1819 m. Bridget -family in Nelson, Cheshire Cty NH. Oldest son Alexander b. 1850.

1889 - Alexander Eustace listed in Rutland VT directory - occupation is IRONER.

Bottom line is I think these are all brothers or close cousins. The connection between Cheshire Cty and Rutland VT repeats itself.

1) James' (Johanna) son Alexander marries Julia Foley from Rutland, VT.

2) John (Margaret) and his family move to Rutland VT at the same time Edward and Mary immigrate there.

3) There is an Alexander whose profession is Ironer in Rutland and the Alexander from Troy is an Ironer.

4) And glaringly - all oldest children are named ALEXANDER.

According to info online, John Eustace (in #1) married to Margaret Barnet is from Dublin, she from Cork.

I need to get Alexander Eustace from Troy, NY death cert. Does James know any death dates for his family?

According to the 1930 census, SYLVESTER EUSTACE b. June 22, 1901 in NH (?) married Hortense O'Brien McGlynn (b. Oct. 4, 1907) in abt. 1928. He was a postal clerk and they lived on 14th Street with his parents ALEXANDER and BRIDGET EUSTACE. Sylvester died in 1988 in Troy, and Hortense died August 9, 1995.

Sylvester had a brother, ALBERT EUSTACE who was born in 1896.

Although I have found some discrepancy, I firmly believe ALEXANDER EUSTACE was born in NEW HAMPSHIRE in 1878.

According to the 1900 and 1910 censuses of Troy, NY, ALEXANDER EUSTACE' parents were both born in Ireland. He worked in a collar shop as an ironer and BRIDGET worked as a stitcher in the same collar shop.

In researching all Alexander Eustaces in various censuses, there seem to be several from distinct families, but none can be found as born in or around 1878.

1) Alexander Eustace b. 1855 son of John and Margaret originally from Nelson, Cheshire, NH who moved the family to Rutland, VT.

2) Alexander Eustace b. 1854 in Troy, NY whose father was Christopher b. 1826 in Ireland and his mother was Ann. Alexander's grandfather was James Eustace b. 1784/1791 and grandmother was Jane b. 1790. Siblings were Joseph, Jane and Mary Kay. This family ended up in Elmira, NY and were the lawyers.

3) Alexander Eustace b 1862 a single man in Manhattan, NY. Parents are Alexander and Bridget Eustace.

4) Alexander Eustace b.1844 in NY and lived in DePeyster, NY with his parents George and Jane both born in Ireland.

5) Alexander Eustace married to Annabelle and lives in Cambridge, MA. He is a grocer/peddler.

6) Alexander Eustace b. 1850 in NH. Son of Christopher and Bridget b. 1821 and 1829 respectively. They can be found in the 1900 census of Cheshire, Harrisville, NH. However they appear to have had only one child - a daughter.

7) Alexander Eustace b. 1852 married to Lucy living in Harrisville, NH in 1880 - no children. Possibly person in #6.

8) Alexander C. Eustace b. 1863 in MA - likely the son of James Eustace and Johanna Ahern, Keene, NH - found in 1900 and 1910 census of Keene, NH living there and married to Julia.

What I suspect is that the Alexander that we link to JAMES EUSTACE of TROY, NY may descend from a sibling of Alexander mentioned in #6 whose parents are Christopher and Bridget. Because we know that our Alexander was born in NH, I have to zero in there. I cannot find his birth or location there in 1880. But the brothers of Alexander mentioned in #6 were Michael, Thomas* and Christopher*. I think they may be possible links.

I'm working on it.

2. Briton in Hoosic - also has male under 10 3. Loring in Stephentown - no male under 10
There is no William in 1810 Renss. Co. However there is William H. Simmons in 1820 in Sand Lake. There is a male 45+, a male and female 16-26, plus others. Could this be William Sr. and newly married William Jr. & wife living in the same household? There are at least 9 other other Simmons families living in Sand Lake in 1820, some of which could be siblings or relatives to your William.

I also took a quick look at the Renss. Co. USGenWeb page, and there are many Simmons! The cemetery list had a William H. who died in 1866, age 66 (thus born 1800). Is this William H. the same one who was in Sand Lake 1820?

Need more research to find out. There may be more than 1 William H. Perhaps deeds and probates could lend some more clues.

My great great grandfather, Patrick Melvin, lived in Troy on 136 Fourth Street. He worked as a shoemaker. He was born in Ireland and passed away on September 14th 1862 at 59 years of age in Troy.

I am going to Ireland in March of 2007 and am trying desperately to find out where Patrick was from in Ireland, so that I can see/visit where I came from, where my roots are. The Troy Librarian, Larry Kammerer helped with with some info, with exact street addresses and assumed as I had given him the naturalization numbers that I had viewed them and had all info from it. I just had numbers from a very distant relative from contact on the internet. She never saw them either. I sent Larry an email asking to refer any info from the Naturalization records that could help me.

Don't know if you would be able to help me further. But would appreciate anything you could do. I have census references from 1850 Census. Wife Ellen was born in Ireland in approximately 1815, children were born in Troy, John 1834, Ann 1837, Frances 1838, Thomas in 1840, Henry in 1842, Joseph in 1844 and Marie Lillian in 1846. I have Patrick buried in St. Mary's Cemetary in Troy. I have info on both Frances and Thomas being in the Union Army, sadly it's recorded that they both deserted one at Fort Sumpter and the other a few months later after fighting in PA.
