The St. Thomas More Guild announces its 10th annual scholarship program for students attending Catholic elementary and high schools during the 2016-17 school year.

One \$750 scholarship will be awarded to a student attending a Catholic elementary school, and one \$1,250 scholarship will be awarded to a student attending or entering a Catholic high school. The scholarship contest rules and application are attached. We encourage all eligible students to apply.

St. Thomas More was a lawyer who lived during the reign of Henry VIII of England and rose to the position of Chancellor. He lived by the principles of honesty, integrity, dedication to his profession, his family and above all, his Catholic faith. He was martyred for refusing to turn his back on that faith. The St. Thomas More Guild is an organization of Catholic lawyers that try to emulate those principles.

SCHOLARSHIP CONTEST RULES

The contest is open to all students currently in grades 6-11 who will attend in the 2016-17 academic year a Catholic school located in the Diocese of Buffalo.

All scholarship applicants must submit an essay on the following topic:

St. Thomas More was known as "A Man for All Seasons". During his life he was a scholar, an author, a lawyer, a politician, a teacher, a husband and a father. In all of his activities, he was motivated and guided by the unfailing moral compass in his life, his Catholic faith.

Identify someone that you consider to be a modern St. Thomas More and explain why you chose that person and what makes that person a modern day St. Thomas More.

- 1. The essay must be typed. The maximum length of the essay is 500 words.
- 2. The application must accompany the essay. The current grade of the student should be placed in the upper right hand corner of the first page of the essay. The essay must not contain the writer's name or school.
- 3. The Scholarship Application and essay must be mailed to:

- 4. The application and essay must be postmarked on or before February 29, 2016.
- 5. Winners will be contacted after April 30, 2016.
- 6. The judges will not know the identity of any applicant during the judging process.
- 7. The essay will be judged according to the grade level of the student.
- 8. The scholarship awards will be paid directly to the schools that the winners will attend in the 2016-17 academic year to be credited against the school tuition.

The awards will be presented at the annual luncheon which will be held at the Buffalo Convention Center May 31, 2016.

What are Sibshops?

The WNY Sibshop Program provides services to brothers and sisters of children diagnosed with special needs. Our first session was held in October, 2009 and was created for younger children, ages 6 — 12. Since that very successful first year, we have also developed teen workshops for siblings who are 13 — 18 years old. Dr. Susan Putnam of Canisius College functions as Director of the Sibshop Program.

For The Adults Who Plan Them And The Agencies Who Sponsor Them, Sibshops Are Best Described As Opportunities For Brothers And Sisters Of Children With Special Health And Developmental Needs To Obtain Peer Support And Education Within A Recreational Context.

However, For The Young People Who Attend Them And The Energetic People Who Run Them, Sibshops Are Best Described As Events
