Baptismal Font Project Update

From the Book of Blessings:



"The baptismal font...should be stationary, gracefully constructed out of suitable material,

of splendid beauty and spotless cleanliness; it should permit baptism by immersion. In order to enhance its force as a sign, the font should be designed in such a way that it functions as a fountain of running water; where the climate requires, provision should be made for heating the water." (#1085)

Our new baptismal font will be beautifully situated as you enter the worship space of Holy Angels. It will be constructed out of natural stone to match the other sacramental items in the church, and a cross will be etched out inside the bottom of the upper and lower pools. The pool will have a "living water" feature which will prevent the spoiling of water, and will run 24/7. We will have the ability to heat up the water for baptisms! Please check out the full-color picture at the entrance of both churches. Our new font will look similar to the one pictured there.

St. Blaise & Blessing of Throats February 3 8:00 AM St John 10:00 AM Holy Angels

Older Catholics may remember St. Blaise Day – at liturgy, two blessed candles, held slightly apart, are pressed against the throat while the following blessing is said:



"Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver

you from every disease of the of the throat and from every other illness.

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen."

The traditional blessing of throats will take place at the 8:00 AM Mass at St. John Church and at the 10:00 AM School Mass at Holy Angels on Thursday, February 3^{rd} . All are welcome.

Much of what we know about St. Blaise is based on writings from the 8^{th} century.

Bishop Blaise was a good and holy man who encouraged spiritual and physical health for the people in his episcopal city of Sebastea, Armenia in the 2nd and 3rd century. The Roman Empire was newly formed, and it's Edict of Toleration, allowing freedom of worship, was not enforced as yet in Armenia. Religious persecution ran rampant. Tradition says that Bishop Blaise received a message from God, telling him to flee to the forest and back country to avoid persecution. Some infidels found Bishop Blaise living as a hermit in a cave. He was praying, surrounded by the lions and wolves whom he had befriended. Thus St. Blaise is also the patron saint of wild animals.

Legend has it that Bishop Blaise was captured and returned to Agricolaus, Governor of Capodocius. While in prison, a mother brought her young son to Bishop Blaise. The boy was dying from a fish bone lodged in his throat. At the Bishop's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and be healed.

Bishop Blaise was marty red in 316 AD for continually refusing to make sacrifice to pagan idols. He was repeatedly tortured while hanging from a tree, and finally beheaded.
