Quotes from actor Danny Glovers message at LMC on October 5, 2013

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"Don't settle for the illusion of change, when you've got the imagination to agitate for something better. I just want to see in your face the possibility that we can change. We can change, and become the architects of change." Glover said.

Glover urged his audience to think about organizing "in the real sense" based on their own visions of what a better America looks like. "They don't have to be the ideas somebody else promotes. They don't have to be the ideas of the president – even though he's black – may want you to promote. They have to be your ideas. What makes this function? Those are the centerpiece."

Mr. Glover has gained respect for his wide-reaching community activism and philanthropic efforts, with a particular emphasis on advocacy for economic justice, and access to health care and education programs in the United States and Africa. For these efforts, Glover received a 2006 DGA Honor. Internationally, Glover has served as a Goodwill Ambassador for the United Nations Development Program from 1998-2004, focusing on issues of poverty, disease, and economic development in Africa, Latin America, and the Caribbean, and currently serves as UNICEF Ambassador.

Children do better in school when parents are involved in their academic lives. Attending parentteacher conferences is a way to be involved and help your child succeed. A parent-teacher conference is a great opportunity to start or continue conversations with your child's teacher, learn how to help your kids do their best in school, and let your child know that what goes on in school will be shared at home

Parent-teacher conferences usually happen twice a year at progress reporting periods. They are brief meetings, only lasting about 20-30 minutes. If they conflict with your schedule, try to find a mutually convenient time or ask your child's teacher if you can schedule a phone conference instead.

If a problem or special need cannot be resolved by the teacher, other school staff who support your child's learning may attend the conference, too. In some cases, the student will also be asked to attend, but parents can ask for private time with the teacher as well.

Conferences focus on learning, although your child's behavioral and social development also might be discussed. You will probably hear feedback about your child's pro-

gress and areas of need. Other topics of discussion might include standardized test results, individualized education plans (IEP), and 504 education plans

Some parents may have been tracking their child's schoolwork and progress all along, and already know what issues are most important to discuss with the teacher. Some may have been talking with teachers at IEP or 504 plan meetings. For those parents, the conference is an opportunity to update each other on how the student is progressing. Other parents may be talking with the teacher for the first time.

Whether it's your first conversation with the teacher or one of many, it can help if you go to the parentteacher conference with a sense of how your child is doing and what you want to discuss. Even if you know all is well, attending parentteacher conferences shows your kids that you want to stay involved in their academic life.

Having the chance to see your child interact can give you a heads up to situations you were not aware of. Children often behave very differently in school than they do at home and it can be a very illuminating experience. Being in the classroom also shows your child that you value their education and keep it a high priority in your family's life.

School funding is often a struggle and administrators are constantly fighting for more value with limited resources. A parent volunteer, willing to spend a few hours a week, helping out is welcome support to an increasingly overwhelmed school system.

Most importantly though, you are leading by example and pitching in where your are needed. You are being present in your children's lives not only at home but away from home as well. Your time is all the investment in your children's future.
