Advice and Information

The UK Horsewatch Alliance held its annual meeting on 22 October 2011. The meeting was held at Woburn Sands, Buckinghamshire and was hosted by Thames Valley Horsewatch.

Representatives attended the meeting from a dozen Horsewatch schemes including Fiona Stuart who was representing Horsewatch Scotland.

This was a useful and informative meeting allowing those attending to :network with people who, in the main, are invariably contacted throughout the year only by telephone or via email.

There was a presentation from Datatag on their products such as Cesar (see item below) and without having to write reams on the products available you are invited to go onto Datatag's web site www.datatag.co.uk to read about the range of products they are able to provide and deliver. Datatag's telephone number is 0845 0700 440. It goes without saying that there are similar products and services available to assist you putting into place crime prevention and deterrent methods. All will have their individual merit.

Time and time again reports are received of theft of equine equipment. Invariably the items stolen have not been subject to any crime prevention measures.

Minutes of the meeting will be made available through Thames Valley Horsewatch.

Tractor thefts.....this next item follows on from what was referred to above

Information provided by Horsewatch members

There has been a marked increase in the theft of older tractors recently (such as Massey Ferguson 100 and 200 series). These have occurred mainly in the Bedfordshire and Cambridgeshire areas over the last 2 weeks.

Construction Equipment Security and Registration (CESAR) Scheme

About £1 million worth of plant and construction machinery is stolen every week in the UK, recent figures suggest. Unfortunately, the Thames Valley area ranks third on the national list of hot-spots.

Evidence suggests that the majority of these thefts are conducted by organised criminal networks that infiltrate construction sites, with theft as their sole objective. Such networks not only cause significant losses to the construction industry but can also destabilise and disrupt major building projects.

Advertising scam alert

Livery yards and equine businesses be aware of phone calls from someone claiming to be from the Crime Prevention Unit who are compiling a guide for all equestrian people in Wiltshire offering theft prevention advice. Advertising space is offered in this guide at a reduced rate but once the caller was asked to confirm it all in writing he hung up. It is suspected that the 'guide' is bogus and if payment had been made as requested, the advertisement would not have materialised.

These schemes are scams which seem to be originating out of Manchester. A few years ago builders were targeted with a similar advertising offers, followed by pseudo legal threats for ongoing payments. It is more of a trading standards issue as they do normally produce the item stated, just not in the quantities or circulation areas.

'Alert on Bogus Horse Inspector'

Horse centre managers in Northamptonshire have repeated a warning about a bogus inspector targeting riding schools in the county.

A mystery woman arrived at a centre in Northamptonshire last Thursday claiming to be a British Horse Society approval inspector, allegedly visiting to carry out an inspection and to take photos for a portfolio. After the owner became suspicious she contacted the BHS approvals team who advised him that the woman was not an inspector. However, just hours later, on Friday evening, there was an attempted break-in when burglars unsuccessfully tried to get into the yard.

The woman was in her late 20s to early 30s, with blonde hair. She was well spoken and had an accent. Chris Doran, from BHS, said, This matter is very concerning and we would urge all centres to be particularly cautious in coming weeks. If you have any concerns please call the BHS approvals team immediately for reassurance._

Please consider the following crime prevention advice and apply it to your premises;

Cut the string on small hay bales and remove netting from larger bales, in order to prevent someone easily taking them. In order for you to move the hay to where it is needed, use a wheelbarrow or you could even use builders bags. In addition, make sure that hay is always stored out of sight.

Wheelbarrows can be used to remove tack, or other equine items. Therefore, store these out of sight and securely chained up. Double chain gates, both sides (left and right) as this prevents them being lifted off their hinges and helps prevent easy access to your yard.

Don't leave headcollars/tack out, even if it is only for a short time.

Be Safe, Be Seen

Horse Watch

The following information is taken from the BHS website.

Did you know? Wearing luminous **and** fluorescent items when riding can give vehicle drivers a valuable THREE seconds extra :reaction time that could save the life of both you and your horse! To put it into context those three seconds are equivalent to a car, driven at 30 mph, travelling the length of a full size dressage arena!

Not everyone realises the importance of wearing hi-viz. The majority of horse owners work full-time to be able to afford their animals, and so have no option but to exercise their horses either early in the morning, or late in the afternoon. When the days are shorter this means riding out in the half-light, and riding a dark coloured horse in dark coloured clothing is courting disaster.

There are numerous hi-viz products on the market, for horse riders, carriage drivers and the horses themselves, and they can save lives! At the very least, a hi-viz tabard should be worn but other products including leg wraps or bands, exercise sheets, martingale and bridle covers for horses, hat covers, mitts and flashing stirrup lights for riders, banners across the back of a carriage, and a myriad of different styles of jacket, when worn will all contribute to ensuring horse and rider can be seen in plenty of time.

The BHS has designed a poster to highlight the importance of riding safely on the roads. The poster can be displayed in local shops, tack rooms, feed merchants, riding schools and livery yards ⁻ anywhere that riders might go.

Another scam warning

The information below has been received from Gloucestershire Police. The scam has been circulating for years and keeps resurrecting itself.

Please take care when considering entering into any agreements via the internet, via newspapers, magazines, etc. Best practice, when it is an obvious scam, ignore it. If you are tempted, discuss the matter with family or friends before doing anything. Scammers work on others on the vulnerability of others. Remember there is no such thing as a free lunch!!

Incident 416 20/10/2011 - Gloucestershire Constabulary

A horse owner in Gloucestershire was advertising her horse on Horse Mart and Horse Deals on the internet. She was contacted by a buyer who said they were from the Channel islands and agreed the selling price of £2,750. However, they sent her a cheque for £5,000. She had actually requested a banker's draft for the £2,750. The person who had made contact on line, then asked that the caller pay Weston Union, who were the Shipping Agents, and then refund them the difference. The caller was very suspicious and took the cheque to the bank, who confirmed it was not a bonefide cheque and it had originated from Nigeria .

The scam is that the seller pays the cheque into their bank, pays the Shipping costs and then refunds the remainder back to the buyer. In the meantime, the cheque is worthless and no money is credited to the seller's account.

All of the above information was forwarded to the Metropolitan Police Action Fraud Department for further investigations.

Please be aware of such a scam and do not be the next victim! If you are contacted by a similar buyer, please inform your local Police asap.

Weekly Reports

Country Watch members have been receiving information reports on a roughly weekly basis for some time now. The reports are currently created by a Police Constable and as you can imagine this is a lengthy process. The time taken to prepare them takes those officers away from patrol activity.

Hampshire Constabulary is about to launch an enhancement to the crime mapping that is already

available. <u>www.Crimereports.com</u> is a system that picks up the information from police systems and delivers it to a public website.

The system will allow you to view crime information and receive automatic updates of what is happening in an area drawn up by yourself. As you can imagine this is breakthrough system and allows officers to be freed up from preparing the reports and allows you to search the area that is significant to you.

The CW team will continue to update you about suspicious vehicles and utilise text alerts but I am sure you will agree this will be a great development. Once online if you would like some help setting up a search at home we will see what we can do based on demand.

If you are interested to see roughly how it looks search <u>www.crimereports.com</u>, the system is already in use in the USA. Search Orlando and sit back and enjoy living in Hampshire!

Operation Harrmattan

The operation is run by the Country Watch Team in the North of Hampshire. It involves officers from the local Safer Neighbourhoods Teams and the Roads Policing Unit, utilising information and intelligence supplied by Country Watch members and the latest technology available to the police with mobile data and ANPR. During the operation a member of the public called in a suspicious incident and as a result four men from the Midlands were arrested for breaking into a rural business near to the scene. A police helicopter and thermal imaging equipment was used during the search.

King's Somborne

With help from the local members of Farm Watch and residents of Kings Somborne, PC Pittman (Country Watch Team) has a rrested two people for a string of offences and anti-social behaviour in the village and surrounding areas. They are currently on bail.

Operation Harrmattan - Again during Operation Harrmattan patrolling units located a suspicious vehicle near to a garden centre. Supporting units including a police dog unit attended. The subsequent search located batteries removed from garden plant machinery and a suspect for the theft of the property. The investigation was carried out by the East Hampshire tasking team who identified and arrested another suspect. Both men were charged.

Early Doors

The Country Watch Team ran Operation Zephyr throughout August, the team specifically targeted poaching and coursing offences, but these patrols also took in locations that are vulnerable to other sorts of crime. Although at the time of preparing the newsletter the operation is in its early stages it already accounted for a number of searches and some explanations from people not expected to be spoken to so early in the morning or late evening.

Cannabis Plants?

One local land owner was surprised at a crop he found on his land and promptly called his local Country Watch Officer. PC Skittlethorpe attended and has removed 26 cannabis plants from the property. The plants were concealed in other plants and the :would be horticulturists had damaged other plants to plant them keep an eye out!

Motor Cycle -ASB

Anti-social use of vehicles on land has been targeted with operation Scrambler South of Butser Hill and a joint CW/MOD operation in Hart, a number of people have had Section 59 ASB warnings which could see their vehicles confiscated if caught again.

CW Land Rover

Land Rover magazine has recently completed an article on Hampshire Police's use of the 110 Land Rovers within force and in particular with Country Watch. The article will appear over the next few months and I am told that the feature will also highlight the CW schemes.

Other matters

From Trading Standards

Rogue Traders are currently cold calling on the telephone and at the doorstep in the Andover, Havant and surrounding areas of Hampshire offering to supply unsuitable mobility goods, stair lifts, adapted showers and beds at vastly inflated prices. In some cases customers have been left with the impression that the trader is from Social Services at Hampshire County Council which is certainly not the case.

Trading Standards would advise consumers never to agree to work that is instigated as a result of a cold call. Consumers should obtain at least 3 written quotes from reputable businesses or traders who belong to a recognised trade association, such as the Hampshire County Council Buy With Confidence Scheme. Traders who agree work at the home of an individual or at a place other than their usual business premises are required by law to provide consumers with a Notice of Right to Cancel, which gives consumers a 7 day cooling off period. Work should not commence until this period has ended, unless written agreement is first obtained from that consumer beforehand.

Please ensue you are aware of your dogs location and security arrangements including micro chipping and/or tattooing.

Quads. Christmas is coming and some people can't help themselves but to thieve. Quads are again on the increase for theft. Locally we have seen several and an attempt theft of one. However, due to the security arrangements put in place this was stopped. Record all details of your quads and any valuable property.

Dale Farm travellers. As many of you are aware the eviction of travellers in Essex has gone ahead. At this stage Police and the travellers do not know where they are going. This area of Hampshire has always attracted the travelling fraternity so please bear this in mind with your perimeter security to land and open spaces etc.

Shoot dates. Those of you who run shoots please let me know your shoot dates and locations. They remain confidential but allow me to be aware of when these are happening for both patrol routes and if complaints come in about gun shots heard.

Hunts. The same goes for any hunts. Please let me know where and when any hunts are on to add to patrol routes to keep any problems to a minimum. Again it is fully confidential.

Police Community Support Officer Hermione Pilbrow, who visited the farm following the incident, said: The stable where Alfie had been overnight was thoroughly searched to see if, somehow, the injuries had been accidentally inflicted, but there were no obvious signs to explain how this could have happened. The adult learning centre is a secure farm but witnesses reported seeing a cream or mustard coloured old style Volvo parked in a lay-by opposite the location at around midnight on Wednesday (28 September). Deliberately injuring any animal is simply heinous, but as Alfie is used to assist adults with learning difficulties it makes it even harder to understand how and why someone would want to do that. I am appealing to members of the public to help us.

Do you know who could have done this to such a friendly horse? We are liaising closely with Surrey Action For Equines and Surrey Horsewatch but I am urgently appealing to anyone with any information at all, no matter how insignificant it may seem to you, to come forward.

Paul Bradbury, Service Manager at Tandridge Hill Farm said: `Alfie has really poor eyesight, but he is such a lovely, kind and good natured horse. He is perfect occupational therapy for the adults who attend our centre. They groom him, feed him and take him out to the field which really helps the way they interact. `Since Alfie was injured he has become more skittish and does not like being approached when he is stabled. I am completely shocked by this incident and cannot understand how someone could be so malicious. How the mind works of someone who could do this is beyond me. There is no financial gain to this and I just don't understand what purpose inflicting these injuries has served.

"Cheval Liberté UK is asking customers to check their trailer floors after "an exceptionally low number" of vehicles developed rotten floors.

The warning follows an H&H report about the same problem with the floors of some <u>Robinsons Requisite</u> <u>trailers</u> Both brands are made at the same factory in Poland and company bosses blame a batch of timber used in both more than two years ago.

Arwel Davies of Cheval Liberté UK told H&H: "We urge customers to check their [wooden] trailer floors or take it to their local dealership to be checked." He said the company would replace rotten floors with another wooden floor or customers may pay for an upgrade to an aluminium floor.
