The Catholic High schools recently held their entrance exams. For the past few years, OLP students have placed in the top 10 and this year is no exception for OLP at both Villa and Prep.

on the Prep entrance exam and Maddie Anthony (center) who placed 4th on the Villa exam. John and Jordan have been offered a \$500 scholarship Cathedral Prep Maddie has been offered \$1.000 scholarship to Villa.

Each of the students is one of three children in their families. Jordan the oldest, Maddie the middle child and John the youngest. All of them were a little nervous about taking the exam. Maddie said, "I was not sure I would finish the exam and it was early in the morning." When asked what was on the test, Jordan indicated, "Mostly math, so it seemed pretty easy. It was things we had learned so it was mostly review." John went on to explain, "There was also reading comprehension, listening and vocabulary."

DOGMATIC CONSTITUTION ON THE CHURCH *LUMEN GENTIUM* SOLEMNLY PROMULGATED BY HIS HOLINESS POPE PAUL VI ON NOVEMBER 21, 1964

## CHAPTER II ON THE PEOPLE OF GOD

10. Christ the Lord, High Priest taken from among men, made the new people "a kingdom and priests to God the Father". The baptized, by regeneration and the anointing of the Holy Spirit, are consecrated as a spiritual house and a holy priesthood, in order that through all those works which are those of the Christian man they may offer spiritual sacrifices and proclaim the power of Him who has called them out of darkness into His marvelous light. Therefore all the disciples of Christ, persevering in prayer and praising God, should present themselves as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God. Everywhere on earth they must bear witness to Christ and give an answer to those who seek an account of that hope of eternal life which is in them.

Though they differ from one another in essence and not only in degree, the common priesthood of the faithful and the ministerial or hierarchical priesthood are nonetheless interrelated: each of them in its own special way is a participation in the one priesthood of Christ. The ministerial priest, by the sacred power he enjoys, teaches and rules the priestly people; acting in the person of Christ, he makes present the Eucharistic sacrifice, and offers it to God in the name of all the people. But the faithful, in virtue of their royal priesthood, join in the offering of the Eucharist. They likewise exercise that priesthood in receiving the sacraments, in prayer and thanksgiving, in the witness of a holy life, and by self denial and active charity.

# ADVENT PROJECT: CELEBRATING 25<sup>th</sup> ANNIVERSARY OF GIVING



It began in 1987, when a representative from the Erie City Mission spoke to the fourth grade, telling them about less fortunate children in other parts of our city. It was difficult for students to imagine children who wished not for toys, but for new mittens or warm socks. Teachers Elaine Cleary and Joni Blackman suggested they could show real Christmas spirit by foregoing their own Kris-Kringle gifts and giving to others. Parent, Roberta Geib enlisted the support of other parents who helped their children have a direct role in choosing and wrapping gifts, making cards and supplying homemade cookies. That year, while students in all other grades were exchanging gifts, those fourth graders stood alone, proud and satisfied they had done something good for others. Their gift sent the message of what Christmas is really about and by 1989 this became a school-wide tradition at OLP.


