FR. RICK'S CORNER

ROLLING AWAY STONES

Early in the morning on their way to the tomb, the women were saying to one another, "Who will roll back the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" (Mark 16 v. 3) A very practical question. When they arrived at the tomb they found that the stone had already been moved back. The Risen Christ is not entombed, but sometimes we are. We build our own walls, set the stones and obstacles in places that make us less than we can be.

Easter is about rolling away stones. We roll away the stone when Easer is more than an annual spring ritual, when we allow the light of the Risen Christ to penetrate the darkness of our lives. We roll away the stone when our lives are a source of life for others, when our words encourage and give hope; when we are willing to be a more faithful witness to the words of our Savior.

What are the stones in our lives that we struggle with? Are we willing to identify them and seek help in having them removed?

After the Easter flowers fade and the Alleluia's are silent may we continue to roll away the stones and enter into the light of Christ's love.

NEXT WEEKEND'S READINGS:

SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER

First Reading: Acts 5:12-16

Moving ____

The people held the apostles in great esteem and brought sick people to them to be healed. Although some were afraid to be known, the number of Jesus' followers continued to grow steadily.

Second Reading: Revelation 1:9-11a, 12-13, 17-19
John depicts a vision of lamp-stands of gold and one like the Son of Man in a robe with a sash of gold. This apparition told John he had nothing to fear and then described himself as one who was dead but now lived again. He then instructed John to record any other visions he might have.

Gospel: John 20:19-31

Jesus appeared to the disciples and breathed on them saying, "Receive the Holy Spirit." He gives them the power to forgive people's sins or hold them accountable. Thomas, who was not present, refused to believe Jesus had appeared until he came to them once more. Jesus told Thomas to believe and added, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."
