- To reserve a space, payment must be received at the time of registration for the workshop. Registrations will not be processed until payment has been received. Post-dated cheques will not be accepted.



Exploring Lines: A Pathway to Creativity and Literacy

> What do you know about lines? What can you do with lines?

Learn about the possibilities that a simple line can have as the provocation for an in-depth investigation.

During the four sessions of this course, participants will explore paint, wire, and other art media to grasp the creative possibilities while making and studying lines. They will learn how to be more intentional in the ways they provide and implement such experiences for children. Participants will examine, discuss and reflect upon the following:

- How did my investigation of lines inspire me?
- How can I go deeper in my exploration?
- What was the children's response to a line experience?
- How can I build on the children's response?

We believe that when adults experience the process and understand the power of the materials, it inspires their work with children to be more meaningful.

Presenters: Roni Cahen and Bev Superle

Roni and Bev are instructors in the Burnaby Early Childhood Education Program. They have studied the preschools of Reggio Emilia and visited them twice. Their many years of working with children and their understandings of these wonderful centres have convinced them of the value of Reggio-inspired practice.

*Roni and Bev's short courses are focused on showing people who work in family child care, toddler centres or with three to six year olds that adapting Reggio principles are **doable**. Each session has a hands-on component and guidelines about implementing ideas with children. These courses also reflect the vision of the BC Early Learning Framework and the significance of documentation.

Cultivating Caring Children

Guiding Children's Behaviour - Some Fundamentals

Nurturing the Roots of Natural Self-Esteem in Children

Although self-esteem has become a popular concept, the literature is vague, confusing, and full of contradictions. In putting the pieces together we will discuss not one, but three distinct kinds of self-esteem. The 'how-to' literature has perpetuated the myth that all self-esteem is good for you and that the higher one's evaluation of oneself, the better. A closer examination reveals, however, that self worth based on social approval and measuring up has shaky foundations and is subject to cancellation with every mistake, failure or rejection. Only the self-esteem rooted in healthy development can withstand the ravages of adversity and is truly capable of fulfilling and satiating. Dr. MacNamara will discuss the developmental roots of natural self-esteem based on the Neufeld paradigm and suggest how this kind of intrinsic worth can be nurtured in a child.

How to Report Suspected Abuse and Neglect

Issues around children's safety is an ongoing concern for people who work with young children in child care. Although we are required by law to report suspected abuse and neglect the actual act of doing so is difficult and in some cases confusing. Participants in this workshop will be introduced to the necessary steps to follow to recognize possible abuse and neglect, and how to report it. Signs of emotional, physical and sexual abuse, neglect and failure to thrive will be discussed, as well as the role of the Ministry of Children and Family Development. Dialogue around the BC Provincial Child Protection Act will support participants as they gain further knowledge of their position in keeping children safe. Remember that you are not alone in this.
