WSRT ESSAY RULES

1. **Eligibility:** All W.S.R.T. members in good standing at the time of the Annual Conference and all second year students attending the Annual Conference will be eligible to compete for the essay award, except commercial members and essay chairperson.

2. **Prizes:**

First Place \$350-and first place W.S.R.T traveling trophy (trophy must be returned prior to

the next annual meeting.

Second Place \$175 Third Place \$125

All members who submit an essay will receive a certificate of merit in recognition for their efforts. Prizes will be awarded during the Annual Conference.

3. **Manuscripts:** All manuscripts must be original and submitted by one author. The manuscript must have a clearly identifiable thesis statement. A thesis statement is a single sentence that formulates both your topic (central idea) and your point of view toward it. Content and conclusion should substantiate the thesis. The topic chosen shall show relevance to radiologic technology. A complete bibliography should be included and reflect the most current research available. References and bibliography should adhere to the current edition of the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association. This can be found at any library or bookstore.

Any graphic illustrations, charts, or diagrams used must be clearly labeled. No reference to a specific clinical site should be visible on any visuals used in the presentation.

Manuscripts submitted to the essay chairperson will not be returned to the author. Four copies of the essay manuscript and illustrations (three with no identification) must be submitted to the Essay Chairperson no later than the postmarking deadline during the month of February as indicated on the application in order to be eligible for an award. Copies of slides or radiographs to be used do not have to be submitted.

- 4. **Deadline:** The essay application must be submitted to the essay chairperson as indicated on the application. All manuscripts must be submitted to the postmarking deadline as indicated on the application in order to be eligible for an award.
- 5. **Guarantee:** Each author submitting a manuscript will be required to agree in writing that she/he will present the paper orally at the symposium if it is selected for presentation.
- 6. **Judging:** Three judges selected from the list by the essay chairperson will judge the essays on Parts 1, 2 and 3 of the "Essay Rating Scale-Paper". This will be done prior to the symposium in accordance with the judging instruction. The essay chairperson shall appoint three additional judges to evaluate the presentation of the essay at the symposium using "Essay Rating Scale-Presentation". The judges shall work independently and form their own opinions.
- 7. **Point Scale:** To be eligible for presentation at the symposium, a paper must accumulate a total of 78 points when judges' scores have been compiled for parts 1,2 and 3 utilizing the "Essay Rating Scale-Paper" prior to the symposium. First, second, and third place awards will be awarded to the individuals receiving the three highest point scores. The total score on each essay is determined by compiling the scores from the paper and presentation evaluations. Please refer to the "WSRT Essay Rating Scale-Paper & Presentation" forms for assessment procedures.

- 8. **Presentation at the Conference:** Once the preliminary judging has been completed the essay chairperson will tally the points and determine eligible papers for presentation based on total points accumulated. The essay chairperson will notify each entrant if her/his paper has been selected for presentation and the date and time of the presentation. Time limits will be strictly adhered to, and in the event a presenter runs over the allotted 15 minutes or under 12 minutes, points will be deducted in accordance with Part I: Time allotment of the Essay Presentation Rating scale. To enhance the presentation of the essay, speakers are encouraged to familiarize themselves with the essay content in an effort to avoid reading the paper verbatim. The only audio-visual equipment provided by the WSRT is a slide projector and screen or LCD projector. If you are using power point you need to provide your own laptop. The presenter's name will be announced prior to the presentation.
- 9. **Deviation from the Rules:** Deviations from these rules will be permitted only at the discretion of and by the action of the essay chairperson and the president of the WSRT.

WSRT EXHIBIT/VIDEO RULES

1. ELIGIBILITY

All WSRT members in good standing at the time of the Annual Conference and all second year students attending the Annual Conference will be eligible to compete. An exhibitor may submit only one exhibit at an Annual Conference.

2. PRIZES

First Place	\$350.00
Second Place	\$175.00
Third Place	\$125.00

All exhibitors will receive a certificate of merit in recognition for their efforts.

3. APPLICATION

All applications for exhibit space must be postmarked by the deadline posted. Application must be made on the form provided in the Illuminator and the WSRT website or a copy of the form. The forms must be returned to the exhibit chairperson. Upon receipt of the application, a letter of acknowledgement will be mailed to the exhibitor. The exhibit chairperson will determine the deadline for application. The WSRT will provide a 6' x 30" table for each display whether prepared by one or more than one technologist/student. If view boxes are needed, participants shall make their own arrangements to have them present at the conference. As an alternative, the exhibitor may request 6' x 4' of floor space for a freestanding, self-contained display. Displays should not exceed 6' in length, 4' in depth, and 8' in height. The total display must be included within allocated space. Displays not conforming to the specifications will not be eligible for competition.

4. SUBJECT MATTER

The theme for any exhibits shall address an area related to Radiology. Exhibits must be the work of the presenter, and the names must appear on the exhibit. Names will be concealed until after judging. The name of the school may appear as a part of the exhibitor's address. Exhibitors may enlist the aid of institutional print shops and/or private printing firms. Exhibits prepared by professional exhibit companies are not eligible for competition. The exhibitor must remove or block out any markings on the radiographs as identification of the patient is not permissible. The exhibits should consist of a subject pertaining to radiologic technology supplemented by such charts, photographs, or technical factors as may be necessary (Any additional credits or resources should be acknowledged.) Exhibits displayed at other radiologic science meetings are eligible for competition, but not more than once at a WSRT annual conference.

5. TIME OF INSTALLATION AND DISMANTLING

The Exhibit Chairperson will determine the time and installation of the exhibits. The exhibitor must install the exhibit personally by the first day of the conference; however, he or she may have additional assistance. Dismantling of the exhibits must be completed by an assigned time of the last day of the conference.

6. JUDGING

Thirty to forty-five days prior to the conference, the exhibit chairperson will appoint three judges and three alternates. The judges will base their rating on the exhibit judging scale and their opinions will be final. The judging will be done during the conference, and awards will be given before the end of the conference. In the event of a tie for first place, the first and second place monies will be combined and divided equally between the winners, and the highest point total will receive the third place monies. In the event of a second place tie, the second and third place monies will be combined and equally divided between the winners. In either situation, there will be no third place award.

7. LIABILITY

WSRT will take all reasonable precautions to safeguard the exhibits during the period of display, but the exhibitors are responsible for any loss or damage to the displays. If an exhibitor fails to remove an exhibit, arrangements for removal will be made at the exhibitor's expense.

WSRT Annual Conference President's Report April 27th, 2007

Welcome to the WSRT Board, Members, Students and Friends. Another year has passed and we once again gather in the Dells for our annual meeting.

There has been progress on many fronts in the last year that is helping to further the radiologic technology profession.

The CARE Bill was passed in the Senate but did not make the House at the last minute. That means we have to work harder to get it through the 110th Congress. It is important for our patients to have trained professionals doing images on them.

Our legislative committee has been lobbying hard in Madison and making progress there. We are working hard towards a state licensure law but it takes commitment from all of us as well as the other registered technologists in the state. Tell everyone you come in contact with. Most people do not realize that there is no state or federal legislation pertaining to this matter.

The society has moved forward with corporate/group memberships to encourage facilities to join or groups of people over 6 to receive a discount on their memberships.

The WSRT is proud to offer 12 continuing on-line education credits to all of it's members. This is a 1 year trial program to see how many members take advantage of the service. If multiple members utilize the service we will continue to offer it. So, if you think this is a benefit then use the service and let us know.

I am once again helping to represent the state in the ASRT House of Delegates. It is a privilege to represent the state's technologists at the national level. We all need to be involved in the governance of our professional societies that help direct the flow of our professions.

As I move on to the next position on the Board I hope to continue to try new and innovative things to keep the society vibrant and alive.

WSRT Affiliate Delegate Report July, 2007

In June, I attended the ASRT meeting in Albuquerque with Chairman of the Board Kelley Grant and President Randy Jansiewski. The business before the House included 43 resolutions; 30 were approved. Most were verbiage changes but two generated a high level of interest and discussion.

The resolution to change the ASRT Officer qualifications was proposed by the Radiation Therapy and Dosimetry Chapter. This resolution proposed that members of non-affiliate modality specific societies be allowed to serve in nationally elected offices. The rationale stated by the sponsors is that affiliate societies do not offer the necessary education and/or support to the modalities and that many Chapter Delegate positions go unfilled because of this lack of involvement. The resolution was defeated but sparked an awareness that the affiliates need to engage the modalities. As a result of this issue, I have asked the WSRT Board to consider adding Chapter representation to address the needs of the individual modalities. This proposal was approved in June and a committee has been charged with the development of an action plan. More to come on this important topic as it develops.

Also of interest was the resolution proposed by the ASRT Task Force on New Educational Methods to recognize the associate degree as the entry level for Radiologic technologists. The rationale stated that most hospital based programs have in place) or have access to) articulation agreements with community colleges. This resolution passed but discuss about whether or not the intent was to eliminate hospital based certificate programs; they were assured that was not the intent. Rather, the desire to elevate the level of professionalism was the goal. All House activity, the resolutions and the practice standards are available on the ASRT Web site (www.asrt.org). If you have questions about specific resolutions or are interested in my voting record, please contact me directly. My contact information is available in the Illuminator or on the WSRT web site.

Of importance to future technologists was the ARRT announcement that certificates awarded in 2011 or after will come with an expiration date. All new certificates awarded in 2011 will be valid for 10 years and RTs will be required to demonstrate continued qualifications. The requirements will include: assessment, needs based activities and verification. The details still need to be finalized and it is important to note that this requirement DOES NOT APPLY to certificates issued prior to 2011. I would encourage Program Directors and students to stay abreast of this topic as it evolves. For reference, the ARRT web site is: www.arrt.org.

Legislative Committee Report WSRT Annual Conference 2007 April 26, 2007

The WSRT has continued to advocate quality medical imaging, patient safety and cost-effective health care through its support of the CARE legislation this past year. Efforts on both the state and federal levels continued. The end of the last Congressional session, the 109th Congress marked the furthest the federal bills progressed. The first nine days of December 2006 culminated both in the **passage** of the CARE bill in the U.S. Senate on a unanimous consent calendar action, and the death of the bill as time ran out in the House of Representatives to bring it to the floor for a vote. There were 135 co-sponsors to the House bill at this time, the most ever. The ASRT had been proactive in planning a strategy to continue the efforts into the current 110th session of Congress with the change to Democratic leadership after the elections. By identifying legislators that would help to reintroduce the legislation in 2007, the CARE bill had already been re-introduced on January 19 by Representative Mike Doyle (D)of Pennsylvania as bill number **HR583**. It has been referred to the House Committee on Energy and Commerce. On March 29 the bill was reintroduced to the Senate as bill number \$1042. To help streamline the legislative process, the language of both the House and Senate versions of the CARE legislation was made identical. The acronym C.A.R.E stands for a new name: *Consistency, Accuracy, Responsibility, and Excellence in Medical Imaging and Radiation Therapy* to better reflect the intent of the legislation. So far, 65 co-sponsors of the House bill have been officially added to the list, and 12 in the Senate. 2007 is off to a good start, but more support will be needed to bring it to a vote in this congressional session.

In March, Connie Geier and I, Sarah Seefeld along with two colleagues from the Radiation Therapists of Wisconsin, and Lyn Mehlberg representing Nuclear Medicine and the Alliance for Quality Medical Imaging and Radiation Therapy (the Alliance) comprised the Wisconsin delegation to the ASRT RT in DC program. We met with all ten of Wisconsin's federal legislators. This by far was the most encouraging reception we've received so far in this 9 year effort to garner support for the CARE bills. The legislation is well known as concern for reduction of medical errors and cost of health care continues to be a priority. Although only confirmation of Tammy Baldwin's continued co-sponsorship of the bill has been received, it is anticipated that Paul Ryan and Ron Kind will re-sign on. I have made numerous follow up calls to their offices, and those of the others. F. James Sensenbrenner continues to oppose the enforcement mechanism of the bill, and other legislators have remained non-committal at this time. (The CARE legislation would require certain educational standards for persons performing medical imaging/radiation therapy for federal reimbursement of those procedures, through Medicare, etc.). The ASRT encouraged us to be "polite pests" in making our message heard and in providing additional information that their offices may need. The ASRT stated in this program that it will "fight to the death" to bring this patient advocacy legislation to fruition. We believe that 2007 will likely be the year that will accomplish the goal to mandate federal minimum standards of education for persons performing medical imaging and radiation therapy procedures. When it does pass, a draft of regulations will be given to the Secretary of Health and Human Services. This draft is the result of years of work by the Alliance, a group of 18 health care organizations that have come together to craft the CARE legislation specifications. This comprehensive draft is available on the ASRT website under Government Relations for those who are interested. Despite last year's progress and the encouragement we felt on Capitol Hill this year, we know there are no guarantees. This is why the WSRT is moving forward with a state effort of its own to protect Wisconsin's patients.

This past year, the team of Connie Geier, Susan Sanson, educator, and I have been meeting with state legislators to make them aware of the need for state regulations regarding medical x-ray radiation. Michael Blumenfeld has been instrumental in navigating our course. We have realized that in over 20 of these meetings, that many of our lawmakers thought that this concern had already been dealt with. We have raised quite a few eyebrows in Madison! In February, Senator Tim Carpenter responded to his invitation for a site visit at Froedtert Hospital in Milwaukee. He was impressed with the technical expertise required to perform the duties of our professions and by the complexity of the procedures involved. With the leadership change in Madison after the November elections, it took a few weeks for the legislative committees' leadership posts to be filled. After these committee assignments were finalized, February began the flurry of meetings with representatives and senators that Michael determined to be strategically beneficial to our cause. We are

proud that we have a draft of a bill that is currently being refined to refer to in our meetings. The refinement of the bill has been a careful process involving lengthy conference calls with drafting attorney. At this time, we are encouraged that we may have identified the legislators that will sponsor our bill. This is not confirmed at the time of this report, as meetings were held just last week to answer one key legislator's questions, and provide additional information to another. We believe that we have accomplished a lot on the state front this year with Mr.Blumenfeld's guidance. We have made a presence in Madison and we too will continue the efforts with the approval of the WSRT in the interest of patient protection. However, the team cannot carry this duty alone. We will need your help.

One revelation in my legislative activities throughout the year is that many people, and perhaps, many of us do not know who neither our federal, nor state legislators are. We don't know who we are voting for, or more importantly, for what ideas they represent and carry forward into law. This year, I am encouraging all of us to become more aware of those that represent us on both the state and federal levels. Please stop by the WSRT CARE Legislative Display for assistance. Don't be afraid—until my involvement with this committee, the names of my lawmakers were not on my radar screen either. Now it is exciting to follow their voting records and ideals. As legislative efforts progress, we may be asking you to contact your legislator to support the cause should he or she need an extra push to take action. Don't be afraid to contact Connie Geier or myself personally if you need help in this regard—we will be thankful for your interest.

I want to thank the WSRT for allowing me to chair the Legislative Committee and for allowing Connie Geier and I to represent our state in supporting the federal CARE legislation. I personally want to thank Susan Sanson for her dedication to the state effort and for becoming an integral part to this cause simply because she believes in it. Without her expertise in the educational regulations, our meetings would not have been so productive with our Madison lawmakers. The excitement is growing, and 2007 may just be the year that results in legislation that will finally bring medical imaging and radiation therapy in regulatory line with other patient care and public services. Our patients deserve nothing less.
