"In November 1916, our church celebrated its seventy-fifth anniversary. The toastmaster for the evening was Mr. A. J. Glover, Editor of the *Hoard's Dairyman*. He introduced Miss Mary Jones of Jones Dairy Farm. She said:

As Mr. Glover has said, the reason why the committee asked me to speak is because we have a hole in our front yard...It is like this, about 30 feet east of the south wing of the house is a depression in the sod. It isn't an intaglio or anything that remotely resembles a lizard or any other beast. It is simply what is left of a hole, and that hole is all that is left of my Grandfather Jones' two room log cabin, where the First Congregational Church was organized October 9, 1841, 75 years ago.

And so it was, one hundred years ago, that our church family celebrated its seventy-fifth anniversary. This year, 2016, marks the 175th anniversary of our church family. Over the coming months, I'll be sharing stories (like the aforementioned) from a book written by one of our long-time members, William (Bill) Stark, entitled: The Story Of Our Church 1841-1976. We have a rich history and legacy to be celebrated, and we need to celebrate the blessings of our past, in order to embrace the hope of our future!

I was struck by Miss Jones' description of the place where our church was chartered, in her Grandfather Jones' two-room log cabin. She called it a "hole." When our church was founded in that log cabin 175 years ago, it was done so because the pioneers, the early settlers of Fort Atkinson, believed that we had spiritual "holes" that cried out for change and transformation. Since, October 9, 1841, we have been in the business of transformation. That is our history! We have been in the business of transforming lives, filling in spiritual, emotional and even physical, "holes" in peoples lives, as we live out the gospel of Christ.

My prayer and hope, as we celebrate our 175th year as a family of faith, is that we would continue our legacy of noticing the "holes" in our lives and community, and then do the work (Continued on page 2) to fill in those "depressions." Because of our faith in Christ, these "holes" will no longer be "depressions," but celebrations of how we continue to live out the Gospel of Christ. You see, we are a tale yet to be told, and it is an important and exciting story. Help us fill in the "holes" this year, as we celebrate and continue to be Christ's family at the First Congregational Church.

Remember, you are loved, and an important person in "our story." Our story wouldn't exist without you!

We have many activities and items being planned in honor of our 175th anniversary, which will culminate with a special worship service and a catered meal in Plymouth Hall on Thanks-

VOLUNTEERS Needed for MEALS ON WHEELS from February 1 – 26, 2016 !!!

As you may know, "Meals on Wheels" is a community-supported program in Fort Atkinson that delivers a noon meal to elderly homebound residents or to those who may find it difficult to prepare meals. The meals are prepared by the kitchen staff of Fort Memorial Hospital, and then are delivered by volunteers from nine different churches that take turns throughout the year. How can you help?

February is one of the months that our church provides volunteer drivers to deliver meals, Monday through Friday at 11:00 a.m., with delivery taking about one hour. The meals are picked up from the Ambulatory Services Entrance of the hospital on McMillen Street. The schedule for each route is provided along with driving directions and a map. After delivery, the empty food carriers (hot and cold) are then returned to the same location at the hospital.

During the past few months, Meals on Wheels has delivered around 540 meals per month to our clients. Therefore, we currently are running two routes in the city. It is helpful to have two people for each route. If you can just drive, we can pair you up with someone who can do the extra walking.
