

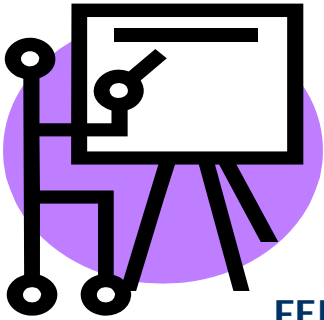


Continuing the Conversation After World AIDS Day

An interactive workshop designed to provide participants with practical activities and tools to facilitate discussions about HIV/AIDS to youth and young adults before, during and after World AIDS Day.

DESCRIPTION: According to Commissioner's Regulation 135.3, "All schools K-12, shall provide appropriate instruction concerning acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS) as a part of the sequential health education program. AIDS education should, at a minimum, provide accurate information concerning the nature of the disease, methods of transmission, and methods of prevention. In public schools, the board of education or trustees shall establish an advisory council which shall be responsible for making recommendations concerning the content, implementation, and evaluation of an AIDS instruction program."

Despite these regulations, many districts do not have a comprehensive HIV/AIDS curriculum infused into their K-12 programs. Often, education is a brief assembly on World AIDS Day or a workshop by peer educators. This DOES NOT meet the regulations and often leads youth to have more questions than answers. This workshop will provide participants with tools to talk to youth about HIV and professional resources that can be used to develop age appropriate lessons.
