13. <u>QUESTIONS ON NOTICE</u>

13.1. Hard Rubbish Collection

Cr. Trezise has submitted the following Question on Notice pursuant to Regulation 10(1) of the Local Government (Procedures at Meetings) Regulations 2000.

"Could Council have an indication about our position in relation to a Hard Rubbish Collection Service by the next Council Meeting?"

In relation to Cr. Trezise's question the following response is provided:

- 1. The last Hard Refuse Collection was provided in March 2003.
- 2. The cost of this activity in the last year of operation was \$20,730 for one collection in that year. This cost would have been made up of labour, plant and overhead costs.
- 3. Hard Refuse Collection has not been budgeted for since 2003 and is not included in Council's draft budget for the 2008/09 financial year.
- 4. Council has since 2003 been investing heavily into more beneficial waste diversion options such as green waste kerb side collection and co-mingled kerbside collection. Both these collection services are being promoted regionally to reduce the volume of waste to landfill. Historically, Hard Refuse Collection has added significantly to volumes to landfill.
- 5. Council continues to review best options for waste reduction and diversion from landfill. Waste disposal cost to the ratepayers is anticipated to escalate significantly over the next few years due to mandatory requirements imposed by the EPA on Councils at landfill as well as waste reduction targets set by the state government. Consideration of hard waste options is but a small part of the jigsaw, however there is wider call for increased levels of service relating to co-mingled and green organics collection.

Unlike some of the metropolitan Council's who currently provide for a Hard Rubbish Collection service, we do not have the population base, staff resources, budget income or facilities to cater for the diversity of services they provide to their residents. From an equity perspective, the recent initiatives Council has provided its community in terms of waste collection services have been targeted at a broader community benefit. Hard Rubbish Collection has historically provided a lesser and more targeted community benefit with significant drain on our resources.
