Lanarkshire Educational Trust Scheme

Report by Head of Quality and Support Services

1 Progress report

- 1.1 Following the approval of the Educational Trust Committee on the 15th March 2002 all of the approved awards (for phase 2 of the financial year), totalling £27,350 were made to the successful applicants. This brought the total amount allocated for the financial year 2001-2002 to £44,297.
- 1.2 On the recommendation of the Educational Trust Committee that the full Committee should convene twice per annum to determine the applications, the date of the next meeting was fixed for 20th September 2002.

2 Applications for 2002-03

- 2.1 The procedure for inviting and dealing with the requests for financial assistance under the Lanarkshire Educational Trust Scheme was agreed by the Educational Trust Committee at its meeting on 29th August 1997. The key features of this procedure include:
 - requests for financial assistance would be invited in response to an annual public advertisement in the autumn of each year.
 - the respective Heads of Service for North and South Lanarkshire would meet to consider the applications against the Trust criteria
 - a set of recommendations would be drawn up for approval by the Trust Committee before the end of the financial year.
 - exceptionally, consideration would be given by the Heads of Service to urgent requests for financial assistance received outwith the above timetable. Decisions made by the Heads of Service would be submitted for homologation to the next meeting of the Education Trust Committee.
- 2.2 Applications from individuals and groups residing within the area formerly known as the County of Lanark were invited, with an imposed deadline, for the financial period, of December 2002. A copy of the relevant guidelines (Appendix i) was provided with every application form to assist applicants in determining the category best suiting their needs.

2.3 As in previous years, the applications were considered under the categories which can be broadly banded together as;

21, 22, 23	Application from individuals
24, 26, or 28	Applications from groups or clubs
25, 26, 27 or 29	Applications from EA or educational establishment

- 2.4 A number of applications seeking financial assistance were received between April 2002 and June 2002 and considered by the respective Heads of Service. Subsequently, several were given an interim award (6 totalling £1,800).
 Details of these processed applications are included (Appendix ii) to be homologated by the Trust Committee .
- 2.5 A summary of the applications received and recommendations has been drawn up for determination by the Educational Trust Committee (Appendix iii).

3 Recommendations

Guidelines

- Application from <u>Educational establishments / groups / societies or</u> talented individuals - maximum award £500
- Only one bid permitted per establishment Advisers within North and South Lanarkshire, responsible for the Visual Arts, Music or Drama, are entitled to apply for financial support of specific projects within these categories.
- Individual applicants must demonstrate exceptional talent in visual arts, music or drama (and have **evidence** to support claim e.g. recognition by a national body).

Making an Application

It should be appreciated that the nature of the Trust, by virtue of providing the income generated within any one financial year, demands that applications adhere to strict deadlines. Subsequently all applications, complete with any relevant evidence, must be submitted by the deadline shown on the front of the application form.

Completing the application form

The application form is subdivided into three parts to deal with the three broad band of applicants - individual, group and educational establishment. Every part of the section relevant to your situation must be completed, especially where evidence is required to determine financial status, acceptance to a course, intended costs etc. It is essential that additional information such as a request for or receipt of funding from another source is included.

While receipt of your application can be acknowledged it should be understood that no judgment as to the suitability or likelihood of an award can be made on an individual basis. Instead, all applications will be collated and presented to the Educational Trust Committee (which comprises of six councillors, three each from North and South Lanarkshire) which will convene in February and September of each financial year. Applicants, successful or otherwise, will be informed of the Committee's decisions shortly after each meeting. Only in the most exceptional of circumstances will applications be considered outwith these two planned meetings.

While the Trust and its terms are applicable to inhabitants of the former County of Lanark it is administered by North Lanarkshire Council . Completed application forms should be returned, by the deadline indicated on the application form, to :

Lanarkshire Educational Trust Scheme

The Lanarkshire Educational Trust and the Marshall Trust were established in the 1930s, with the purpose of providing some assistance for people, residing within the geographical boundaries of the **County of Lanark** as then was and facing financial hardship in pursuit of their education. Initially this was in the form of educational bursaries and scholarships.

These Trusts have now been reactivated under the collective heading of the *Lanarkshire Educational Trust Scheme*. The terms of the trust allow grants to be awarded for a number of educational purposes including; travel scholarships, travel grants, research scholarships, support of clubs/organisations for young people, special educational equipment for schools, provision and maintenance of sports facilities, educational experimentation, promoting education in visual arts, in music and in drama and limited aspects of adult education.

The sums available under each of the above headings are limited and experience has shown that the demands for grant support in certain categories will exceed the funds available.

Details of the Trust Scheme

These notes should prove useful in completing the application form, which must clearly specify the category under which you seek a grant.

Essentially the Trust offers financial assistance to individuals or groups who reside within the area formerly known as the County of Lanark, within 9 categories (numbered from 21-29 in the Trust Scheme). These categories are extremely specific in terms of the eligibility, purpose and financial limitation of any grant awarded. A summary of these categories is included in order to assist you to decide if you are eligible to apply for a grant and to ascertain under which category you wish your application to be considered.

Categories as specified by the Trust Scheme

21.Travel Scholarships

• Financial aid to persons belonging to the County who travel beyond Scotland to University, College or Educational Institution while undergoing a course of study or to contribute towards any fees which may be charged

Guidelines

- Individual applicant maximum award £500
- Scholarship only available to matriculated students (evidence required)
- · Grant to cover cost of fees, books or instruments.

22. Travel grants

 A grant to anyone belonging to the County, enabling them to travel either in Great Britain or abroad for any purpose of an educational nature, the Council having regard to the financial situation of the applicant.

Guidelines

- Individual applicant maximum award £500
- · Details of the educational purpose of application
- Evidence of the journey undertaken
- Not considered suitable:

(i) Group applications (e.g. school trip) on the basis that needy individuals and their particular circumstances would not be identified and(ii) multiple journeys (basically a claim for travelling expenses)

23. Research scholarships

• Award scholarships for research work or special study to inhabitants of the County who graduated at a Scottish University, and who require financial aid in order to undertake such research.

Guidelines

- Individual applicant maximum award £500
- Scholarship only available to post-graduate students (evidence required)
- Details and evidence of research work or special study to be undertaken.

24. Support of Clubs etc.

• Grants to assist in the establishment and maintenance of clubs, societies and organisations which promote the educational benefit, mental or physical, moral or social, of children / young people.

Guidelines

- Group application maximum award £1000
- Details of financial assistance requested along with information regarding similar applications for and success in gaining other grants .
- Club accounts, details of fund raising and history of the club required to substantiate claim.

25. Special Equipment

• Grants available to the education authority for the purposes of improving the efficiency of education in schools by providing special equipment.

Guidelines

- Applications from **Educational establishments** maximum award $\pounds 500$
- Only one bid permitted per establishment

26. Sports Facilities

Assistance in the provision of school facilities and sports competitions as

well as financial aid for the development of talented amateur sports persons. (e.g. National recognition, with **evidence** to support claim)

Guidelines

- Application from <u>Educational establishments</u>, <u>Associations or talented</u> <u>individuals</u> - maximum award £500
- Only one bid permitted per establishment
- Lanarkshire Schools Sports Associations (e.g. Football, badminton etc.) would apply for expenses and costs under category 26b/c.
- Individual applicants would apply under 26d. but would be treated similar to those applying under 21, 22, 23, and be restricted to a maximum of £500

27. Educational Experiments

• Grant to the Authority to assist in the cost of any experiment of an educational nature conducted by the Council.

Guidelines

- Application from <u>Educational establishments / Authorities</u> maximum award £5000
- Only one bid permitted per establishment
- Projects not considered would include those initiatives already funded by the education authority e.g. Supported Study, Easter Schools etc.

28. Adult Education.

• Financial assistance for lecturers or instructors to defray the expenses incurred with the promotion or encouragement of adult education.

Guidelines

- Group application maximum award £1000
- Award strictly to cover costs of lecturer / instructor. Subsequently details of these specific costs are essential.

29. Promoting Education in the Visual Arts

29A Promoting Education in Music

29B Promoting Education in Drama

- Financial assistance to groups or individuals showing exceptional promise in the above areas, enabling them to obtain special tuition.
- Establish and maintain works of art. Organising, defraying the costs of art exhibitions.
- Establish and maintain and equip choirs, bands and orchestras. Organising, defraying the costs of concerts / musical performances.
- Establish and maintain and equip dramatic groups. Organising, defraying the costs of dramatic performances.
