- 1. Open your Lesson 6 Pie Chart US Olympic Medal History file.

  - 3. Insert and format a chart of your own choosing. You may not select the Line or Pie Chart Types. Be sure that you can explain the chart.
- 4. Include your name somewhere on your Chart.
  - 5. Analyze your chart. Make observations about:
    - i. the data illustrated,
    - ii. the relationship between the variables depicted (i.e. illustrated or shown),
    - iii. observations about who (person or group) might use this graph (be specific), and
    - iv. how they might use the graph (again, be specific.)
- 6. Word process a paragraph with your analysis. Save the analysis as Lesson 6 Advanced Chart Analysis.
  - Upload your Excel file to your Google Drive. Be sure to keep the file in the Excel format; do NOT convert it to a Google sheet.
    - 8. *Turn In* the following:
      - i. Advanced Chart Assessment list face up (Please detach from the directions page.
      - ii. Your Advanced Chart Excel file, Lesson 6 Charts Advanced Activity.
      - iii. Your analysis, Lesson 6 Advanced Chart Analysis
