Help-ful Tips

Off-Season Biking for Skiers

Why is biking good for keeping in shape for skiing? First, biking makes you use the quads and core muscles you use skiing, while being easy on the knees.

Second, biking is a great aerobic exercise and, like skiing, bike riding requires short bursts of intensity to

raise the heart rate. Running or jogging means maintaining a constant push on the heart rate (not to mention the knees), while biking has some downhill and flat coasting making for a great interval workout.

You don't need mountains to benefit from biking, but hills will add to the leg workout. You can vary the intensity of your ride through the mechanics of your bike. A bike with three basic range of gears can be used to ease you up the hills and to pace you through the flats.

The best workouts are the ones that won't make you bored. With a summer goal of keeping skiing muscles tuned and lungs in shape for a day on the slopes, biking offers the opportunity to both explore your world and stay fit.

If you really start to get bored, put the bike on the car and head to a state park or a municipal bike trail. Bike riding has become such a popular activity that most states have designated bike trails with no motorized vehicles allowed.

Even though the breeze you create riding feels cool, you still need to keep yourself hydrated. So, make sure you bring water with you..

CMSC Summary

- The Gelandesprung Ski Club (GSC) Board could discuss possible plans for 2017 with Dick, as our West Trip Chair, this year, based on the information we gained from the resorts. This process would form a template for future years and it might make it more conducive for potential west-trip assistants and/or trainees to become involved.
- The GSC Board might consider partnership with other CMSC clubs, or even clubs from other councils, for Midwest trips, especially those for which we have difficulty attaining the "priced census." Alternatively, we might consider using the CMSC website to advertise our low-census trips at some pre-

- determined period, e.g., 30 or 60 days, before our departure. Our more northern starting point would limit how many partners to whom we might have appeal.
- GSC could expand its membership by increasing its visibility in the community, a goal toward which our Marketing Committee is working.
- The Indian Head and Black Jack merger will likely result in a unique partnership between the Native American tribe at Watersmeet and the merged ski hills, whereby a casino and hotel will be built at the current Indian Head summit and a chair will connect the two. After feasibility studies are completed in May, the Michigan Governor will decide the merits of the

- partnership, and if approved, plans would be to have all "up and running" for the 2016-2017 winter season.
- The GSC Board might consider having multiple Domain names to attract more people. For instance, a Domain name of Notjustsnow.com could be implemented. This name would link to Gelandesprung Ski Club and might attract bicyclists to our site. They would then have an opportunity to see our skiing events as well.
- We should have at least 7 types of social media sources such as Facebook, twitter, uTube, LinkedIn, blogs, etc. The Marketing Committee is currently working on getting some of these up and running.

Squaw Valley and Alpine Meadows to Connect via Gondola

Squaw Valley has reached an agreement with the owner of the land between Squaw Valley and Alpine Meadows to create a base-to-base gondola between the two mountains to form a lift-connected area of 6,000 acres! "For decades, skiers and riders have talked about connecting these two world-class resorts," said Andy Wirth, president and CEO of Squaw Valley Ski Holdings, LLC. "Over the last four years, we've made significant improvements to enhance the skier experience at both Squaw Valley and Alpine Meadows. The base-to-base gondola will offer our guests the ability to easily explore and experience the unique attributes of these two mountains via a brand new aerial connection, while simultaneously reducing vehicle traffic between them."

Plans to connect the two mountains have commenced, and include the possibility of a high-speed, detachable gondola that would operate between the base of Squaw Valley and the base of Alpine Meadows, traveling over the KT-22 Peak. There are no plans currently being contemplated to allow skiing or other non-skiing activities along the lift route or on the terrain located between the two resorts. The estimated completion date of the project will be subject to Placer County and U.S. Forest Service approvals once applications are submitted.


