## RULES

1. **ENTRY FEE STRUCTURE: Applies to entire Home Arts department (#4):**
  - **1 to 4 entries: \$2.00 per entry**
  - **5 or more entries: \$1.00 per entry**
  - **On-line entries: \$1.00 per entry plus \$1.00 service fee per transaction**

Non Livestock entry form is to be used for all Home Arts Department. Sections listed within the Home Arts Department may be entered on one form.
2. Open to Amateur Sonoma County Residents unless stated differently above specific section. **AMATEUR:** A person who engages in an event or activity as a pastime rather than a profession. **PROFESSIONAL:** Anyone who now or has ever been engaged in an event or activity as a specific occupation or as a means of livelihood. "Pay" is defined as any compensation that results in a profit above and beyond the cost of materials. This definition shall also include teachers, lecturers, and judges. Other classifications include **MASTERS, INTERMEDIATE, & NOVICES**. Please refer to the specific sections in the book for definitions.
3. Entries accepted from **INDIVIDUALS ONLY**; unless stated differently above specific section.
4. Exhibitors may bring their own display props for clothing (mannequin, etc.)
5. **All articles entered must be handiwork of the exhibitor and finished within one year of the opening date of the fair. If in the opinion of management, an article has previously been entered, the right is reserved to withhold the item from judging and display.**
6. Articles must be in good taste and suitable for family viewing or they will be disallowed for display.
7. **STAINED, SOILED, UNFINISHED, OR ARTICLES** showing obvious signs of wear or use **WILL BE DISQUALIFIED**, and will not be displayed. Fair reserves the right to reject any exhibit or entry offered in case there is anything objectionable, unsuitable or requires more space than can be given, or is in conflict with exhibit requirements. Fair personnel will either make judgements at time of entry or by official judge at time of judging.
8. Articles entered, which must be hung for exhibition, must be ready to hang with sturdy hardware.
9. **EXHIBITORS MEETING:** Do you have suggestions for class changes, judges, etc.? Please put them in writing and turn them into the Entry Office prior to the Adult Home Arts Exhibitors Meeting. The Adult Home Arts Exhibitors Meeting will be held on Monday, August 15 at noon, Sonoma County Fair Directors Room. At that time, while the Fair is fresh in your minds please bring any suggestions that you think would help in making the Sonoma County Fair the best possible.
10. Each exhibitor entering articles in this department will receive one single day outside admission credential on the day articles are received.
11. If you have greater than 10 entries, please call in advance for a delivery appointment time, 707-545-4203.
12. Any exhibit not picked up by the deadline will be given to charity.

All entries shall be completely the work of the entrant. Fiber used must be stated on entry blank and on a hang-tag attached to the garment.

All entries must be entered shown and judged in a regular class in the Fiberwork sections of the Sonoma County Fair. All entries are subject to the rules, fees, and premiums of the Sonoma County Fair.

Selection of the winner shall be made by an independent judge with strong consideration given to creativity, quality of spinning, suitability of yarn made to the fiber and use in the finished product, overall quality of work.

Entrants shall supply their own fiber for spinning, and may use any form obtainable. Use of the fiber must be a minimum of 50%

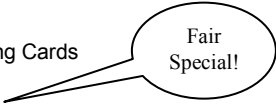

#### DEFINITIONS OF TECHNIQUES

**Counted Thread:** a term for embroidery worked on even weave fabric, whose threads can be counted.


- ☞ Counted cross-stitch – cross stitches worked on an even weave fabric.
- ☞ Blackwork-small geometric patterns usually worked in black thread on white even weave fabric.
- ☞ Drawn Fabric or pulled thread or pulled work-threads area pulled aside or removed, leaving holes that form a pattern.
- ☞ Hardanger-A Norwegian embroidery technique, worked on even weave fabric known as hardanger. It consists of rectangular groups of satin stitches, known as "kloster" blocks arranged in patterns of squares and rectangles to outline the cut spaces.

**Needlepoint:** A canvas embroidery or canvas work-embroidery worked on a canvas background. The stitches (usually) cover the entire surface.

**Surface Embroidery:** Fabric embroidery-a term for embroidery worked on non-countable fabric.

- ☞ Crewel embroidery-any embroidery worked with crewel wool on a plain-weave linen background.
- ☞ Stamped fabric embroidery – a term for fabric pre-stamped with designs.

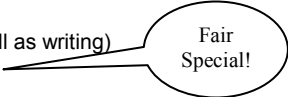

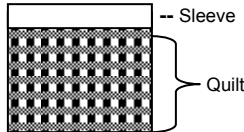

### Hooked Rug Categories

**Adaptations:** A pattern adapted from a design that is not created by the rug artist and is derived from another source (photograph, drawing or other) and the colors selected and hooked by the rug artist.

**Challenge:** Rugs hooked on a specific theme or subject.

**Contemporary:** Contemporary designs which are hooked with various widths of wool. Other materials (cotton, silk, rayon) are sometimes incorporated into the piece to bring just the right color or texture into play. Various special stitches may be used and other needle techniques may be incorporated.

**Fine Cut:** A detailed hooked piece that strives to represent a subject (flower, scrolls, birds, fruit, etc.) using graduated values of color. This category typically uses fine cut wool strips in #2,3 or 4 to achieve fine detail.

**Geometric:** The design is made up of an arrangement of geometric shapes hooked individually or in combination with each other and repeated over the surface of the rug. This includes abstract designs.

**Holiday:** The motif of these rugs is a scene or subject that depicts a holiday theme.

**Oriental:** A hooked rug in the style of Persian, Turkish, Native American, etc. woven rugs. Typically uses outlining, a limited color pallet, and vertical hooking in the background.

**Original:** A unique design that is original and created by the rug artist. May be in the styles mentioned above, but the pattern will be drawn by hand, and the colors selected by the rug artist.

**Pictorial:** The motif of these rugs is a scene that depicts a landscape, rural or urban scene (neighborhood, animal or human family). A story or portrait rug fits into this category. Can be hooked with wide or narrow strips of wool or a combination and, may or may not use fine shading.

**Primitive:** Typically these rugs are old fashioned, simply designed or contemporary and are known by their wide strips of wool. A piece may be hooked with recycled wool that is torn or cut by hand. Another piece may be made with graduated values of color that includes over-dyed plaids and cut in the bigger cuts #5,6,7,8 or 10.

**Traditional Rug Hooking Kit:** Includes a pattern on backing and died wool ready to hook.
