end result will be a comprehensive user-friendly school report that offers a comprehensive picture of schools' strengths and weaknesses providing a clear pathway to improvement. If you could, please take a few minutes to complete the State of Illinois' 5Essentials Survey. The state asks that we have one parent from each household complete the survey about the school. If you have students at more than one level, you may complete the survey once for each level a student attends. The link to the survey is on the home page of the school website, and the deadline for submission is March 20th. Thank you in advance for your time in completing the survey.

STUDENT TESTING

Students are in the middle of the PARCC Performance-Based Assessment. They will finish by the end of March. Please be sure your students are getting plenty of rest. They will then have to take the PARCC End-Of-The-Year Assessment May 4th-May 22nd. Currently, there is information about the PARCC on the school website. Also, the Jr.-Sr. High will be taking their final round of MAP testing right after spring break.

Reminder to Parents of kindergarten, 2nd, and 6th grade students:

Your child's dental form is due by May 15th. If they have not turned it in to the school already, please do so as soon as possible.

Beginning next school year (Fall 2015) all students entering the 6th and 12th grades will be required to show proof of recent meningococcal conjugate vaccination (MCV). All 6th graders will be required to show proof of <u>one</u> dose received on or after 11 years of age. All 12th graders will need to show proof of receiving <u>two</u> doses unless the first dose was administered after 16 years of age. In this case, only one dose after 16 years of age is required. This vaccination will protect your student from a severe form of bacterial meningitis as well as other illnesses caused by this bacterium.






Gym-NEWS-ium ☺

Dear Parents:

We will be offering a skating unit in physical education class beginning April 7th. The students will be skating a total of 5 times throughout the following 2 weeks. The PTO is paying \$2.00 of each student's rental fee to bring the cost down for us! We will be renting the skates at your cost of \$2.00 for roller skates and \$3.00 for roller blades. Students will also wear wrist guards the whole time. If you would like your student to have additional safety gear such as helmet, kneepads, and elbow guards it is an additional fee of \$2.00 for the set totaling \$4.00 for roller skates and \$5.00 for roller blading. The students will receive instruction in the proper method of forward and backward skating, cornering, turning around, and stopping.

The skates we will be renting have special polyurethane wheels that will not cause any harm to the gym floor. B.R. Sports carries product liability insurance on their skates.

We feel this is an important unit because skating is a highly beneficial aerobic activity and is a life-long activity that helps improve coordination, posture, balance, and rhythm.



PRESCHOOL SCREENING

The Orangeville Community Unit School District #203 will hold its annual preschool screening for 3, 4 and 5 year old children on Friday, April 17, 2015 at the Orangeville United Methodist Church. To be eligible to attend the Orangeville PASS program, each child must go through the free screening which is available to all children whose parents reside in the School District.

The preschool screening will take approximately one hour. All children will have their vision, hearing and general overall development screened. This service is provided by the Illinois Department of Public Health, Northwest Special Education Cooperative, the Early Childhood Consortium of Freeport, and the Orangeville School District.

If you have a child who is 2 years, 9 months through 5 years old, call (815) 789-4613 to schedule an appointment for screening. A parent or guardian must accompany the child to the screening site.

Children ages Birth – 2 years, 9 months of age may be screened by contacting Child and Family Connections at (815) 297-1041 to schedule an appointment with the Early Intervention staff.

School officials encourage all families with eligible children to sign up. A majority of learning takes place in the preschool years, and it's important to identify problems early.
