A MESSAGE FROM ARCHBISHOP AYMOND

- We are sorry to inform you of the death of Br. Joseph Webre, O.S.B., a monk of Saint Joseph Abbey who died at the Abbey on Monday, September 24, 2012 and the death of Br. Jean Sobert, S.C., a brother of the Sacred Heart who died on Sunday, September 23, 2012.

Br. Joseph was 72 years old. Throughout his 52 years as a monk Br. Joseph served in the monastery dairy, kitchen, grounds and maintenance and on the farm. He is best remembered for his 18 years of service in the Pennies for Bread and the Abbey Program where he helped to feed the poor and homeless of New Orleans.

Br. Jean taught at St. Stanislaus School in Bay St. Louis, MS and served as guidance counselor, Director of Student Activities, Director of Admissions and Director of Development and Alumni at St. Aloysius and Br. Martin High Schools in New Orleans. He was 75 years old.

PRESBYTERAL COUNCIL MEMBERSHIP ROSTER

The priests of the Archdiocese of New Orleans have elected their representatives to the Presbyteral Council. The new roster of the Council is attached. Thanks to all for their willingness to serve.

TRIBUNAL ANNOUCEMENT

The Tribunal has added two new electronic folders to its downloadable section on our Archdiocesan Website and on the Tribunal webpage. They are Pauline Privilege Cases and Petrine Privilege Cases. In the first folder, Pauline Privilege Cases, is a document titled: "How To Determine A Pauline Privilege Case." This document is intended to help procurators and parties to determine whether they have a Pauline Privilege case, and if affirmative, the documents and fee required to process it.

The second folder, Petrine Privilege Cases, has a document titled: "How To Determine A Petrine Privilege Case." This document is meant to help procurators and parties to figure out whether the case before them is a Petrine Privilege case, which has to be sent to Rome. If you determine you have a Petrine Privilege case, the required documents and fee are also included in said document.

The purposes of uploading these forms are (i) to assist procurators and parties in determining whether they have a Pauline case or a Petrine case before submitting their case to the Tribunal and (ii) to facilitate the time for processing cases in our Metropolitan Tribunal. Kindly avail yourself of the information therein. Also, print and include the aforementioned documents in your usual folder for annulment cases. And inform other procurators about these documents.

BP ECONOMIC SETTLEMENT CLAIMS

As mentioned in the Oracle last week, there will be presentations for BP Economic Settlement Claims. Two additional meetings focusing on schools have been added to the schedule – Tuesday October 16th at the Chancery, 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m.

All parish churches and schools, as well as non-profit organizations and business entities of the Archdiocese of New Orleans, potentially have economic damage claims under the recent Proposed Deep Water Horizon Economic and Property Settlement Agreement. Approval by the Federal Court is anticipated on or about November 8, 2012.

Under the provisions of the Proposed Agreement with BP, entitlement to compensation is determined by legal and economic analysis of monthly revenues and expenses from 2007 through 2011. The Archdiocese has retained legal counsel, Mrs. Susan A. Zeringue of Couhig Partners LLC, to evaluate, coordinate and present eligible claims on behalf of each entity of the Archdiocese. Mrs. Zeringue will conduct brief informational meetings explaining the Proposed Agreement and detailing the information and documentation required from each of our parishes and entities to pursue these claims in accordance with the following schedule:

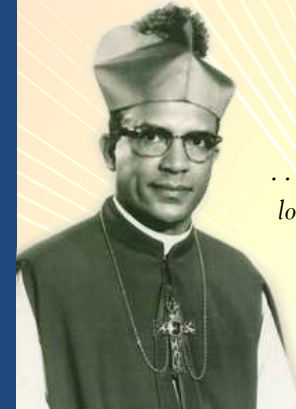


Most Reverend
Harold R. Perry, S. V. D.
 (1916-1991)

A native of Lake Charles, Louisiana, Bishop Harold R. Perry was the eldest son of a French-speaking rice mill worker and a domestic cook. At the age of 13, he entered the Divine Word Seminary in Bay St. Louis, Mississippi. He was ordained in 1944, becoming the 26th African American Roman Catholic to attain priesthood. After ordination, he served in Louisiana, Arkansas, and Mississippi for eight years. In 1952, he was sent to Broussard, Louisiana where he founded St. Joseph Parish for 1,000 black Catholics. He was named rector at St. Augustine Seminary in 1958. In 1963, he and other religious leaders were invited to the White House to discuss peaceful desegregation with President John F. Kennedy, and in 1964, Bishop Perry became the first black clergyman to deliver the opening prayer in Congress. That same year, he became Provincial Superior of the Southern Province of the Society of the Divine Word in the United States. In 1965, Bishop Perry was named Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of New Orleans becoming the first African American Catholic Bishop of the 20th century. His appointment as Bishop gave the Catholic Church the opportunity to share in the Civil Rights Movement at the highest ecclesiastical level. During his Episcopate, Bishop Perry served as pastor of two local churches, Vicar General, and Rector of the National Shrine of Our Lady of Prompt Succor. For many years, he also served as National Chaplain of the Knights of Peter Claver. He died July 17, 1991 at the age of 74.



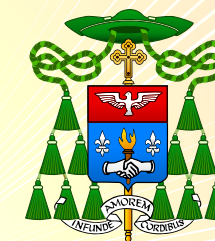
