- 3. **Torrington High School Students**: <u>Submit an application by April 30, 2014</u>, to your High School Guidance Office.

Lewis Mills High School Students: Submit an application by March 24, 2014

- 4. Submit two letters of recommendation (only <u>one</u> from a teacher) which speak to the applicant's character, leadership, ability to work with people, study habits and citizenship;
- 5. Obtain an additional letter from a guidance counselor that demonstrates your interest in higher education and academic achievement; and
- 6. Submit a high school academic transcript.


