

HEALTH SERVICES AND INSURANCE COMMITTEE

The following are some points of interest from the February HSIC meeting:

- Concerning our Extended Health Plan, prescription drugs and paramedical practitioners are the largest paid claim categories.
- The decreased value of the Canadian dollar has had an effect on expenses and travel.
- Terminations and enrolments in the plan have been steady with a slight increase in enrollments in 2012 due to changes in the retirement gratuity and the subsequent increase in number of retirements that year in Ontario.
- RTO/ERO Group Benefits hold the market share for education retirees. Of those who have an OTPP pension deduction made for their benefits premium payment, 8 in 10 continue to choose RTO/ERO.
- After the first quarter of 2015, the usage of Eldercare Select continues to increase as more members learn about the service provided. Types of assistance provided to callers include: health guidance, senior safety, transition advocacy, resource identification, senior health information, and home care procurement. (See your Plan Booklet p.23)

The key messages from an Allianz Global Assistance presentation were:

- 1. Using the pre-trip assistance provided by Allianz can help in pre-planning: telephone numbers to access Allianz in respective countries, required inoculations, travel advisories, visa requirements.
- 2. A physician's consent to travel does not establish your medical stability nor override the definition of "sudden and unforeseen."
- 3. This insurance is intended to cover you for a sudden and unforeseen medical emergency. The intent of the travel plan is to stabilize members and return them to their home province for on-going care. It is important to emphasize that members cannot remain on their trip for continued care if they are stable.

THREE STEPS TO SAVE MONEY ON YOUR BRAND NAME MEDICINE

Do you want to remain on your brand name medication, but have heard it's going to cost you more money? Many Canadians have benefited from a program allowing them to choose to remain on their brand name medicines at generic prices. The cards are free of charge; there are no hidden fees, no monthly charges and patient privacy is protected. They are a new tool that allows you to choose to remain on your brand name medicines while paying lower generic prices, thus providing you more 'room' in your \$3100 annual Extended Heath Plan allowance

- 1. Get a valid prescription from your doctor.
- 2. Pick up a RxHelp card:
 - directly from your doctor
 - visit *www.RxHelp.ca* to download and print a RxHelp Patient Choice card
 - call 1-866-RxHelp4 [1 (866) 794-3574] to have one sent to you via mail.
- Present the prescription and RxHelp Patient Choice card at any Canadian pharmacy and request your brand name medicine.

RxHelp.ca's mission is to provide Canadian health care consumers access to brand-name pharmaceutical manufacturers' "Patient Assistance Programs".

Patient payment assistance programs are run by many brandname pharmaceutical manufacturers to provide significant savings on brand-name prescription medicines. RxHelp. ca connects Canadian patients to these pharmaceutical manufacturer's payment assistance programs FREE of charge. There are 3 main types of programs:

- Patient Choice Programs Allow the patient to remain on their brand name medicine with little or no additional cost over the generic equivalent.
- Patient Assistance Programs Help offset or reduce the out-of-pocket patient costs that are not covered by the patient's public or private drug plan. Some or all of the out-of-pocket patient costs will be paid by the manufacturer of the product up to a defined maximum.
- *eSample Programs* Allows the patient to receive the prescribed medication for a certain number of days at no cost to the patient, based on reasonable up-charge, mark-up and usual customary pharmacy fee. Physician Access Only.

To use your card you must fill a valid prescription at a participating pharmacy in Canada.







The book club draws around 16-18 people per meeting with many members keeping in touch by email when they are travelling.



SWEET TREATS LILAC FESTIVAL

With surprisingly warm weather, we set out for Cobourg on May 26 to enjoy a day in the countryside.

Our first stop was to pick up Peter Brotherhood, our guide, and then it was on to the impressive new Cobourg Community Centre. Peter described the area as "rolling countryside" and he was right. The ancient glaciers had carved out the landscape leaving us The Oak Ridges Moraine. We learned about eskers, the snake like gravel deposits, as we travelled along a road built on one.

The rainwater that falls on the moraine is naturally filtered, and is so pure and oxygenated that Oprah Winfrey keeps a supply on re-order.

The clear and cold water in the creeks and swiftly running river is home to several varieties of trout and salmon, and is an internationally known area for sports-fishermen.



We arrived in Little Warkworth, an artisan community nestled in the hills. Mark Pollard's shortbread cookies are made here and are touted as the "Best in Canada". I agree. I bought three sweet and three savory varieties.



Lunch was served by the ladies at St. Paul's Church. After juice and a salad, we enjoyed chicken and beef with mashed potatoes, vegetables, gravy and rolls, followed by homemade pies and coffee or tea.



Peter explained that lilacs originated in China and Korea, and were brought to France via the Silk Road traders. From France, lilacs made their way to Canada with the settlers in Acadia and Quebec. There are over 360 plantings of 65 varieties along the park in Cold Creek.

The "Lilac Ladies" provided parasols to protect us from

the sun as we strolled along the shady banks admiring the blooms.

Chocolate was our next item on the list and we enjoyed lots of it at "World's Finest Chocolates". Our final stop was at the remaining cheese factory in Northumberland Many county. delicious samples were provided to assist in selection.

On our to return to Toronto, we snoozed and dreamed of our wonderful adventure.

On top of this, I have seen other parts of Europe with friends, colleagues and family members.

What a year it has been!! In fact, it has been such a great year that I have signed on for another one!




