You can choose to claim $\boldsymbol{A C T U A L}$ expenses $\underline{\text { OR }}$ the CENTS PER MILE method.
For either method, you must show the following information on your tax return:

1. Year/Make/Model of Vehicle: $\qquad$

- The CENTS PER MILE method is business miles multiplied by the mileage allowance for the year: $2013=.565$ per mile, 2014.56 per mile.
