Elvin McDonald, was garden editor at Better Homes and Gardens, and has authored around 70 books on plants, gardens and gardening

Charley Starnes, an excellent photographer in his own rite, is most respected as the "Superintendent" of the Iowa State Fair Photo Contest. Each year he must manage over 4,000 entries and cut the field down to a show of around the best 25% from which to pick the overall winners. He will give us many tips about what he and his judges look for.

Mary Chind, Pulitzer Prize winning Des Moines Register photographer will tell us the "back story" of her winning photo and talk about photojournalism.

I know you will also like the other speakers as they have provided popular programs at our club meetings and always have new ideas to present. Two of the Des Moines Club Master Photographers also have great programs prepared – Loren Brown, and Jerry Ranch. And all the winning prints, slides, and images from the monthly contests will be shown or displayed in the salon.

There is a lot to shoot in Des Moines. The field trips on Friday will stay close to the downtown area -- A beautiful Capitol building inside and out, historical building, botanical center World Food Prize Headquarters & gardens, an attractive skyline and sculpture garden to mention a few. There are no planned activities on Sunday. The traditional Sunday membership meeting has been combined with the Friday business meeting. This will let many members return home at a reasonable time on Sunday and let others visit their choice of sights before heading home. Another great place to shoot is "Living History Farms" http://www.lhf.org/. It is at I-80/I-35 exit 125 west of Des Moines. You'll want to plan at least a half day there. Watch for their special "Photography Day" events and come back September 15-16.

This will be my last article as N4C President. It has been a pleasure having this opportunity on the front page to address members. Gerald Bonsack from the La Crosse Area Camera Club will be installed at the convention. I hope you will give Jerry, other officers, chairs, and fellow members all your support that I have enjoyed during my term. POWNTOWN PLACES and FRIENDLY PLACES 2012 N4C CONVENTION DES MOINES, IOWA SEPT 6-8

A few more reasons to join us in Des Moines in September!

Elvin McDonald segued from being garden editor at Better Homes and Gardens to Friends Director at the Botanical Center the summer of 2007. He has authored around 70 books on plants, gardens and gardening--with a big one coming out in Septemberentitled "A Garden Makes a House a Home" [Monacelli Press/New York]. Elvin came to Des Moines to join Meredith in October 1995 as garden editor of Traditional Home magazine (for which he still serves as contributing garden editor). Previously he was senior editor of House Beautiful, free-lance garden editor for Family Circle, Garden editor of the Houston Post and Houston Life, and primary consultant for the PBS Emmy-award-winning TV series "Gardens of the World with Audrey Hepburn". He was a primary still photographer for the PBS series. Some 80 of his photographs are appearing in the definitive glamour book of the life of C.Z. Guest, which Rizzoli is publishing next April--along with images by Sir Cecil Beaton, Louise Dahl-Wolfe, Bruce Webber and Helmut Newton. Elvin's son Stephen is a professional photographer. Photojournalism has been a staple for N4C conventions from Speed Graphic days to our present obsession with all things digital. Our N4C tradition of bringing in the best talent to share their images has been consistent over the years—and this year is no exception. We are fortunate to continue that tradition with Mary Chind of the Des Moines Register. Mary won a Pulitzer Prize in 2010 for Breaking News Photography with this dramatic image of a rescue from the Des Moines River. Her photography, often prominently featured in the Register, will be combined with the "back story", which is the icing on the cake as they say.

Yes the elements of Technique, Composition and Interest have some purpose after all.



Speaking of which, Loren Brown, a master in the dark room and a mentor to our club for Fine Art Black and White Photography will discuss these same elements of photography with images of his own plus images from the Sioux City and Iowa City Clubs. Loren recalls the time he spent with Ray Andrews in the dark room and his many discussions about these elements of fine art photography. Loren has led teaching sessions for the past several years in our club describing the elements of fine art photography. Participants in this discussion oriented session can look forward to an interesting and rewarding time.

In addition to his work with the State Fair, Charley finds enough time for his own photography (see the two examples above) <u>and</u> an active professional career with his own photography appearing in many state and national publications.
