The Dick and Aggie Levi Matching Challenge

Dick and Aggie Levi have gifted Lutheran High School with \$100,000 to be distributed to a variety of improvements to the school. Back-to-School Sales Tax Holiday August 6-15, 2010

On July 7th a Back-to-School Sales Tax Holiday was signed into law. The tax holiday will begin August 6 and last through August 15, 2010. During this window, state taxes on clothing and school supplies will be reduced by 5% to 1.25% (instead of 6.25%). Other Local County and City taxes will still apply.

ELIGIBLE CLOTHING

For the purposes of this Tax Holiday, "Clothing" is defined as all human wearing apparel suitable for general use. Each item purchased must meet this definition and have a retail selling price of less than \$100.

The list of eligible "Clothing" items includes, but is not limited to:

- School Uniforms • Belts and Suspenders
- Neckties • Underwear • Socks and Stockings
- Hosiery • Pantyhose • Coats and Jackets
- Hats and Caps • Ear Muffs • Gloves and Mittens for general use • Scarves • Rainwear • Shoes and Shoelaces • Sneakers • Boots • Sandals • Footlets
- Overshoes • Insoles for Shoes • Slippers • Steel-Toed Shoes • Athletic Supporters • Bathing Suits and Caps • Lab Coats • Household and Shop Aprons • Rubber Pants

ELIGIBLE SCHOOL SUPPLIES

The legislation defines "School supplies" as items used by a student in a course of study. Purchases of "school supplies" for any other use are not eligible for the reduced rate of tax.


"School supplies" includes, but is not limited to:

- Lunch Boxes • Markers • Notebooks • Paper, including loose leaf ruled notebook paper, copy paper, graph paper, tracing paper, manila paper, colored paper, poster board, and construction paper
- Pencils • Pencil Leads • Pens, Ink, and Ink Refills for Pens • Pencil Boxes and other School Supply Boxes • Pencil Sharpeners • Protractors • Rulers

While at times I know it's difficult to please everyone, I accepted these responsibilities and demands as this is part of the coaching process. I truly apologize to anyone if I failed to meet your expectations. With this being said, I'm hopeful that I've made a positive impact on the students lives in my 20 years of service in my roles as a church youth director and basketball coach.

At a very young age my dream was to be a coach, but God had a different path for me. Thinking my dream would not be a reality, God didn't let me down and he brought me to Lutheran. I had no idea nor planned on being here this long, but after years of perseverance my dream became real. I can't begin to put into words the thrill of emotions and joy this brought me. As I leave now, I know I'll have emotions of sadness and shed some tears, but I know and trust that God has other plans for me.

I want to thank all the current and former players and their families, coaching staff, Lutheran High School staff and students, as well as all the Lutheran community for their support and a chance to live my dream. Also, I would not have been able to do this without the sacrifice and support I received from my wife Amy, my son Derek, and daughters Gabrielle and Jenna, along with other family members and friends.

It's been a special ride full of many wonderful memories to be able to serve at such a wonderful and special place. I'm forever grateful, thankful, and appreciative to Lutheran High School. This was so much more than just about basketball, but life's lessons. I know my words in this letter don't fully describe what this has meant to me. Physical Exam Forms, Immunizations & Birth Certificates

The state of Illinois requires all new 9th grade students to submit a completed physical examination form with an up-to-date immunization record before October 1, 2009. All incoming freshman are also required to have a diabetes screening, which is included on the State of Illinois physical form. **This form must be signed by a parent to be valid.** We are required to keep those students without properly submitted forms out of school beginning October 1st until the form is on file in the school office. If new 9th grade students are also intending to participate in sports, see below.

Sports physicals must be turned in before you are allowed to practice. IHSA physical forms for grades 10-12 are available in this mailing or on the IHSA website (www.ihsa.org/forms/general/physicalcard.pdf). You will need Adobe Reader to view and print this document. Completed forms should be submitted to the school office.

The Missing Children Registration Law requires schools have a certified copy of all students' birth certificate in their permanent record. If you haven't already done so, please bring a copy to the school office so we can add this document to our files.

Locker Assignments

Each student is assigned a locker with a school lock attached. There is a \$5 deposit required which is returned when the student leaves Lutheran High, the lock is returned and the locker cleaned. Returning students who have previously paid this deposit already have a lock deposit credit on their activity account and have either chosen or been assigned a locker for the 2010-2011 school year. Freshmen and transfer students' lockers are assigned at their registration appointment.

Gym lockers also have school issued padlocks. Lockers in the gym will be assigned by the PE instructor. There is an additional \$5 deposit required for this lock as well. **PE students are required to secure all of their belongings in a locked gym locker during their PE period.**

LUTHERAN HIGH SCHOOL STUDENT DRESS CODE

The overriding purpose of Lutheran High's dress code is to maintain an environment conducive to learning and present a positive Christian witness to others. **OUR GUIDING PRINCIPLE IS THAT CLOTHING SHOULD BE APPROPRIATE, NEAT, CLEAN, IN GOOD REPAIR, AND IN GOOD TASTE.** Classroom attire is not appropriate in P.E. classes, and sports attire is generally not appropriate in the classroom. What may be offensive to some may not be offensive to others; yet Lutheran High feels the need to try to establish an environment in which all can take pride, all can sense that a quality educational environment, which is pleasing to God, is taking place.

The following is a list of specific guidelines to assist students in choosing appropriate clothing during school hours:

1. Hats, visors, bandanas and scarves are not to be worn on the head.
2. Unnatural or "kool-aid" style hair coloring is not to be worn.
3. Mohawks, unevenly shaved heads and "faux hawks" are not permitted.
4. Ponytails must be worn on the back of the head, and braids must lie naturally flat against the head. Men should not wear barrettes, ribbons, hairpins, or bobby pins in their hair.
5. Piercing jewelry will only be worn in the ear.
6. Clothing should not be extremely form-fitting, low cut, sheer or revealing. No skin or undergarments should be exposed between the bottom of the shirt and the top of the pants under normal activity including reaching up, sitting down, or leaning over while either sitting or standing.
7. "Grubby" items such as clothing that is ragged, ripped or frayed (including cut-off T-shirts) are not acceptable.
8. Camouflage or other military clothing is not appropriate.
9. Shirts or dresses must have sleeves. A sleeve is defined as an extension of hemmed material beyond the shoulder seam.
10. T-shirt logos or lettering should not directly or indirectly refer to any musical group or any controlled substances, including alcohol, cigarettes or otherwise inappropriate theme or wording.
11. T-shirts and shirts should be tucked in if the hem falls below your fingertips while standing.
12. Waistbands are to be worn at the natural waist.
13. Skirts should measure no shorter than four inches above the top of the knee when standing. Skorts are to be considered skirts. Capri pants must be two inches below the kneecap.
14. Shorts are not allowed.
15. Leggings should be worn with an acceptable skirt.
16. Athletic pants may not be worn.
17. Underwear should not be visible at any time.
18. Shoes are to be worn at all times.
19. Students may not wear shoes with cleats in the building.
20. Individual teachers may determine whether or not they allow coats in the classroom.
21. Any clothing, or lack thereof, not mentioned in the list above which is considered by the school administration to be in questionable taste or deemed to be unsafe will be corrected immediately.

Exceptions to the dress code may be made through special Student Council dress-up days, or days sponsored by other student groups.

Infractions of the dress code will be handled in the following manner:

1. The first violation will result in the student being warned; directed to immediately correct the violation, or wear school-provided clothing for the balance of the day in order to avoid absences from class. Notification will be sent to the home.
2. The second and successive dress code violations will result in the student being directed to immediately correct the violation or wear school-provided clothing for the balance of the day in order to avoid absences from class. A demerit will be issued for all second and successive dress code violations.

Parking Permits

Parking permits are required of all students and teachers driving to school and using the parking lot during the school day. Forms are available with registration forms and in the school office on the first day of school. Students will need to know their license number and insurance information. Also, a parent is required to sign this form. Students who do not display a permit will be asked to park elsewhere.

Emergency Cards

Each student must have an emergency card on file in the school office. Parents - please be sure to fill out a new card for this school year! It is very important that we have accurate information to reach you in case of an emergency, plus we are required by LAW to have a listing on this card of all medications your student takes during the school day. Please be sure to note your student's Social Security number and date of birth on the card. The school is required to have this information on file as well. A new card will be included with all registration information, so please fill one out and return it with your registration forms or fill one out at your registration appointment.

Admissions Notes

A few items of interest:

If you did not attend the **New Student Orientation** in June, be sure to come to the Parent Welcome on Thursday, August 13th from 7-8:30pm. We will meet in the Quad of the west building.

Any incoming freshman who has not yet taken the **placement test** will need to do so on August 18th (the first day of school) from 12:45-4pm.

Financial Aid applications are due by August 1st. The committee meets in early August to award scholarship funds that are still available according to a need based formula.

Which Calculator Do YOU Need?

Students enrolled in Algebra 1 and Geometry are required to have a scientific calculator - that is one with SIN, COS, TAN and square root keys.

Students enrolled in Advanced Algebra will need a scientific calculator with SIN, COS, TAN, LOG and LN keys. We encourage them to have a graphing calculator which will be used in Trigonometry and beyond so that they can get accustomed to using it. We recommend either the TI-83 or TI-84 series.

Students enrolled in Trigonometry, Analytical Geometry and Calculus are required to have a graphing calculator of their own. Again, we recommend the TI-83 and TI-84 series.
