Public Advocacy and Voter Protection Project 2014

WVKA was awarded a Public Advocacy and Voter Protection Project Grant (PAVP) from the LWVMI through the LWVUS. The goals were: to implement election observer programs in up to 10 communities in Michigan to help ensure all votes count and to develop a voter information campaign for use throughout the area, particularly in targeting underrepresented voters.

A regional workshop was held in Kalamazoo in late September to train election observers and also train local Leagues in the use of social media for election education campaigns. Community members Mary Ellen Glondeck and Margie Stinson along with League members Tamara Carpenter, Mary Gustas, Linda Havens, Janet Jones, Ken Manley, Paula Manley, and Merrikay Oleen-Burkey were trained. Six participated as nonpartisan poll observers on election day at several precincts around the area. They observed the voting process and recorded their observations.

Another part of the project was to educate the public about voting and Vote411.org. Michele McGowan posted the LWVKA Facebook messages encouraging people to vote and advertising Vote411.org as a voting information resource.
