## A new beginning for Scoil na Naomh Vilig

The countdown began three years ago. The date was 3rd September 2007. Scoil na Naomh Uilig had arrived in Newbridge! Six teachers guided sixty-three children onto temporary prefabricated buildings on the grounds of the V.E.C. on Station Road for the first day in their new school. Three years on and the school community, which has quadrupled in size, celebrates another milestone in its history. It has moved from the prefabs on Station Road to a brand new stateof-the art building in Rickardstown. The new building boasts of the latest cutting edge teaching tools and sporting facilities including two basketball courts, an extensive play area and a green area to cater for the wide range of sports and after-school activities on offer at Scoil na Naomh Uilig. From September all classrooms will be kitted out with interactive whiteboards. The building has a sensory garden, sensory integration room, library and kitchen/science room. There are sixteen classrooms in the complex.

Scoil na Naomh Uilig is a fully-inclusive school and operates proudly under the Catholic ethos. Children of all abilities, including children with severe/profound and moderate general learning disabilities, children with A.S.D. as well as gifted children are all valued members of the school community. Children from the A.S.D. unit and the Severe and Profound unit are integrated wherever possible into their age-equivalent mainstream classroom. The work of the school is underpinned by the school motto 'Uile le Chéile' – meaning 'all together.' The motto was truly exemplified, in particular, during the school move when parents, staff and friends of the school all worked together to move furniture and all of the contents of the prefabs to the new building. The school thanks everyone involved for their support.

On Tuesday 1st June the school was blessed and prayers were said on the playground by Parish Priest, Very Rev.

Before the ribbon was cut Deputy Principal, Valerie Kavanagh presented the Principal Noreen Duggan with a bouquet of flowers on behalf of staff. Paying tribute to Ms. Duggan, Mrs. Kavanagh thanked her "for your hard-work, leadership, vision and forward planning...we wouldn't be here without you".



## FR JOE Staying put



## Non-Violence As A Way To Peace "But I say to you: Offer the wicked man no resistance" Fr. Willie

Since 1988 Burma's opposition leader Aung San Suu Kyi has been an international symbol of non-violent peaceful resistance in her native country. Since returning to Burma in 1988 she has endured many years of house arrest and oppression by the ruling military. Her efforts to promote democracy in Burma in a peaceful non-violent way won her the Nobel Peace Prize in 1991. She once said "that the democratic process provides for political and social change without violence"

In St Matthews Gospel (Mt 5:38-42) Jesus

makes it clear that he is against us using violence as a means of dealing with people who are violent towards us. If we respond aggressively with violence to overcome violent aggression them we create an endless cycle of violence. Jesus discounts the idea that aggression is the best and only way to solve problems. Violence harms our unity, setting one person against another and making cooperation impossible.

The lives of non-violent reformers such as Martin Luther King and Mahatma Gandhi are proof that non-violence works. Both of these men have been successful in bringing about political and social change that has been lasting and meaningful, without weapons and violence. This is what Aung San Suu Kyi has been trying to do in Burma. We should support people and organisations around the world who seek an alternative and peaceful approach in dealing with political tensions.

The words of Jesus encourage us to believe that love and grace have the power to overcome oppression and to break down the barriers of suspicion and hatred that can divide people for centuries.

## Work/Experience

It is my first time in the states so the whole thing was strange. My friend Niall who was flying with me a few seats back, said it looked like I was trying to escape out the window, my face was so pressed to the glass of the airplane.

**Niall:** (Seasoned traveller, bemused) "Your face'll be mashed when you get off, relax".

But for some reason when everyone at home in Newbridge was asking me was I excited to be going to spend the summer in New York, I couldn't really say yes. I didn't actually have the ability to imagine it, New York. And in the heat of barbeques on the June bank holiday, I almost didn't want to leave.

It was flying in, when I started to make out land beneath us, that it hit me. Suddenly I was bent double trying to catch a glimpse of the Empire State Building, or the Statue of Liberty, or Barack Obama out the side of the plane. Not realising of course that JFK is practically in a swamp outside the city, and we'd need to be on the train for forty five minutes before we got into Brooklyn.

We're staying in Brooklyn. Williamsburg. All six of us. Myself, a poor writer, and five poor architects looking for work experience. And where else would you find experience but New York? How much of it will relate to work though,

I'll let you know at a later date. And poor we are to remain, as most of these internships come unpaid.

My first day here, yesterday, I spent alone. The architects had had a hard night. Two of them remained AWOL, and the one on the couch could only whisper short sentences. I left the casualties behind me and found Manhattan. Times Square, Fifth Avenue, Lexington

Avenue, Madison Avenue, Third, Sixth, and Eighth Avenue. The smell of money money money everywhere. After Fifth it'll be hard to settle for Henry Street, Dublin on the 8th of December.



Every single street in Manhattan is planned, beautiful, complex. My first morning – as one of the architects says goodbye on his way to work.

**The Architect:** (*Ignoring my anxiety, making for the door*) "Enjoy the city now today. Head into Manhattan sure"

**Myself:** (Anxious) "Will I be able to get around by myself like?"

**The Architect:** (Matter of factly) "Yes". (Pause, pointedly) "More than anywhere this city is built to get around"

After one day I saw that like the people here, the city is mish mashed and loud and crazy, but there's a comprehendable logic behind it. The city itself is friendly. It wants you to be here.

I'd absentmindedly watched Alice in Wonderland on the plane over. But when I walked into Central Park, here I was, Alice in her ginormous, surreal garden. Ponds and ducks and sunbathers and buskers and bums and elegant women and the giant skyscrapers lurching over for a spy in at us. Exhausted from walking I fell asleep in the sunshine and dreamed large colourful dreams. You can see how it all could have happened if it was Central Park where she took her forty winks.

Leaving all the lads in Kildare, I feared I'd rue the long summer of barbeques, and nights out, and weekends down in Kerry. (I've also left the poor sister in charge of the father.) And as the flowers were swelling in colour in the garden it was becoming almost impossible to leave Roseberry. But here, now, in surreal New York, I feel I'm developing the age old condition of the emigrated Irish.

I'm in New York. And this is what life is all about. Work and experience. Excitement.

## Be careful how you act; you may be the only Bible that someone will ever read!

R.L. Stevenson.

Mahatma Gandhi famously remarked once, 'I like your Christ; I do not like your Christians.' A a young man he had gone to work in South Africa. While there he studied the Christian scriptures. He was so inspired by what he read that he decided on Sunday to attend a Christian Church and join in the worship of the people.

As soon as he entered the building he was confronted by a sign which read, 'whites to the left; negroes and coloureds to the right.' He was so infuriated by the obvious affront to the message of Christ in a Christian place of worship that he never returned.

Christ poses a challenging question to his followers in Saint Luke's Gospel - Who do you say I am? And the world continues to pose that question to those of us who would claim to be His followers. Despite all the negativity which has surrounded the Church people still have a fascination with Christ. They want to know about Him; they seek to encounter Him.

Pope Paul VI said that the world has more need of witnesses than of teachers. He meant that the Gospel is

most effectively preached by actions rather than words.

Over the past few months much has been written about renewal in the Church. People has spoken about the need for more effective modes of communication. Others have spoken of the need to look at our structures. And while all of these are valid comments I suspect that the Church will only really be renewed when the lives of Christians begin to mirror the life of Christ.

Like it or not we proclaim to the world who we think Christ is by the way we choose to live our lives. It is a daunting thought that people will seek to know Christ in and through the actions of his followers. When we are brash, impatient or unkind, we distort the face of Christ for others.

Robert Louis Stevenson wrote: be careful how you act; you may be the only Bible that someone will ever read!

Christ's question in Luke's Gospel is a challenge not so much to what I say, but to the quality of my actions. *But* you, who do you say I am?

## More on our Parish Child Protection Policy

Last month we introduced our Parish Child Protection Policy. In this edition of News & Views we bring you the remaining sections of the policy covering Definitions of Child Abuse, Code of Conduct for Children/Young People, Code of Conduct for Adult Leaders, Methods of Handling a Disclosure, Recruitment Procedures and Reporting of Concerns. This policy and all Child Protection procedures currently in place in the parish will be reviewed during the summer. When children/young people return to their group activities in September parents/ guardians will once again be asked to complete the appropriate consent forms.

#### **Definitions of Child Abuse**

Child Abuse occurs when the behaviour of someone in a position of greater power than a young person, abuses that power and causes harm to that young person. The main types of abuse that children/young people may be subjected to are as follows:

**Neglect** is the persistent failure to meet a child's basic physical and/or psychological needs.

**Physical Abuse** is where a child is assaulted or injured in some way that is deliberate.

**Emotional Abuse** occurs when a child's need for affection, approval, consistency and security are not met.

**Sexual Abuse** occurs when a child/young person is used by another person for his/her gratification or sexual arousal or for that of others.

Indirect abuse of young people occurs where young people have been photographed, videotaped or filmed for pornographic purposes or subjected to gross and obscene language or indecent images.

#### Other Forms of Abusive Behaviour

**Verbal Abuse** can include name-calling, sarcasm and criticism, making reference to some physical

characteristic, destructive criticism, derogatory remarks and gestures.

**Unwelcome Behaviour** can include favouritism, exclusion, sexual harassment and sexual innuendo, humiliating and embarrassing others, deprivation of basic rights and harsh disciplinary regimes.

Bullying behaviour can be defined as repeated verbal, psychological or physical aggression that is conducted by an individual or group against others.

As we can see, the term Abuse covers a wide spectrum of activities, not just sexual abuse.

#### Code of Conduct for Children/Young People

- 1. Treat each other with respect and kindness.
- 2. Treat leaders and adults with respect.
- 3. Be fair and do not tell lies about others or adults.
- 4. Respect the house of God by showing good behaviour.
- 5. Do not shout at, fight with or bully other children.
- 6. Children must not keep secrets, especially if secrets are harmful.
- 7. Do not use violent behaviour towards others.
- 8. Talk to the leader of your group if you have a problem of any kind.

#### Code of Conduct for Adult Leaders

- 1. All leaders will undertake appropriate training as offered, including Child Protection training.
- 2. All children and young people will be treated with courtesy, respect and dignity.
- 3. Always respect the physical integrity of children and young people and never engage in inappropriate physical contact or conversation. Never do anything for a child that he or she is capable of doing for him/herself.
- 4. Refrain from showing favouritism towards any individual and maintain appropriate boundaries when dealing with children/young people in your care.



## More on our Parish Child Protection Policy

- Ensure that consent has been received from a parent/ guardian before a child/young person takes part in any activity. Parental Consent Forms apply to all those under 18 years of age and include contact details, medical and other relevant information. All written consent forms are considered confidential documents and will be stored securely. Group Leaders and where necessary, the Parish Designated Persons, will have access to confidential information.
- 6. Ensure that adequate and gender appropriate supervision is in place for any youth activity. All activities must have at least two named adult supervisors in attendance at all times. The ratio of leaders to young people will be 1-8. If an emergency situation arises, leaders will notify parents/guardians by telephone of the need to bring a child/young person to a doctor or hospital and telephone to verify arrival at doctor/hospital.
- 7. Always keep an attendance record for each child/ young person participating in parish activities. These records are always deemed confidential.
- 8. Have a duty roster of leaders to ensure adequate supervision. Leaders will sign in for each session of the group activity.
- Accurate records must be kept of any accident or incident that gives rise to any type of concern regarding a child or young person. Incident forms will be provided to all group leaders.
- 10. Only age appropriate language, media products (such as camera phones, internet, and video) and activities should be used when working with young people.
- 11. Leaders will not work alone or travel alone with individual children/young people who are participating in parish activities.
- 12. Under no circumstances should Church personnel give alcohol, tobacco or drugs to a young person.
- 13. Alcohol, tobacco or drugs must not be used by personnel who are supervising or working with young people.

#### Handling a Disclosure

If a child discloses a case of abuse to you as leader, the following procedure should be followed:





- Stay calm. Do not panic. Listen and hear.
- Let the child know that you cannot promise to keep what has been said secret, but you will only tell those people who need to know.
- Give the child the opportunity to say what actually occurred in his/her own words.
- Do not put words into his/her mouth.
- Ensure that the child knows that there is help available and that you will support him/her as much as possible.
- As soon as possible after the disclosure has been made, make a written report, detailing all that has taken
- Refrain from giving your own personal views; instead use the child's own language, making sure the details given are correct. Sign and date the document.
- Contact the Parish Designated Child Protection Person immediately. If he/she is unavailable, contact the Duty Social Worker in the Health Service Executive or the Gardai and follow their instructions.
- A full guarantee cannot be given that information received in relation to a suspicion or concern of child abuse will be kept absolutely confidential.
- Support and pastoral care will be provided for the person who receives a disclosure.

#### Safe Recruitment and Selection Procedures

To date, all priests, parish team members, sacristans and other parish staff with access to children/young people have completed the Garda Vetting process.

All those who have contact with children or young people in parish activities will be asked to fill in an application form which will include a declaration of suitability and references. These will be treated as confidential and will be stored with appropriate security measures.

### Reporting of Concerns

The Parish Designated Persons must be notified of all incidents that are recorded. These records must then be retained in case there is a need for future reference to them. All records will be confidential and will be stored with appropriate security measures.

If there is any type of incident, this will not be discussed with anyone other than the Designated Person or the Parish Priest. This is to protect confidentiality for the children and young people and for those in leadership roles. No leader will promise that they will "keep a secret".

Parents will be notified and concerns discussed with them in all situations except those which the Designated Person feels might cause risk to the safety or welfare of the child concerned.

Anyone who has a concern regarding Child Protection issues can contact the **HSE at 045-882400** during office hours or the Gardai in an emergency situation.

This Child Protection Policy for the Parish of Newbridge is effective from September 1st 2009.

## PARISH YOUTH GROUP - NOVENA

Tewbridge Parish Youth Group hosted the Novena to Our Lady of Perpetual Help on the 24th May this year. This is most certainly our biggest project each year. Many months ago we started our preparations for our Novena Mass. Our first task was to source a speaker that we felt would be most suited around us and the ideal that tonight is hosted by the youth of the parish. ## Know your rights

### Question

I'm getting married soon. I thought if you got married in a church you didn't need to contact a civil registrar but apparently this isn't the case. What are the rules?

#### Answer

Since 2007 the registration procedure for marriage is the same whether you are marrying in a registry office or by religious ceremony.

If you wish to get married in Ireland you must give three months notification in person to a Registrar of Marriages. Marriage registration is administered by the Health Service Executive and you can get a list of marriage registrars on their website (www.hse.ie). The Registrar does not have to be the Registrar for the district where you live or where you intend getting married.

You need to make an appointment with the Registrar to give the notification and you have to pay a notification fee of €150. You should arrange the appointment well in advance to ensure the notification is given at least three months before your wedding date. If there are no impediments to your marriage, (you have to sign a form stating this), the Registrar issues you with a Marriage Registration Form (MRF) giving you permission to marry. You should give the MRF to the person who will be

solemnising the marriage before the marriage ceremony. Following your marriage ceremony, the completed MRF should be given to a registrar, within one month of the marriage ceremony, for the marriage to be registered.

The person solemnising the marriage must be on the Register of Solemnisers. This lists both marriage registrars and the members of the various religious bodies who have been nominated by the bodies as solemnisers. You can inspect this at your local registration office or on the General Register Office website (www.gro.ie).

If you plan to get married in a religious ceremony you should contact the church in advance to plan the ceremony. If you plan to get married by civil ceremony and a different Registrar will be solemnising the marriage, you must also contact the Registrar's Office for the district where you intend getting married.

y tradition Joachim and **D**Anne are considered to be the names of the parents of Mary, the Mother of God. We have no historical evidence, however, of any elements of their lives, including their names. Any stories about Mary's father and mother come to us through legend and tradition.

We get the oldest story from a document called the Gospel of James, though in no way should this document be trusted to be factual, historical, or the Word of God. The legend told in this document says that after years of childlessness, an angel appeared to tell Anne and Joachim that they would have a child. Anne promised to dedicate this child to God (much the way that Samuel was dedicated by his mother Hannah - Anne - in 1 Kings).
