## JUST THE FACTS

• The Baltimore Ravens return home to host the San Diego Chargers in a battle between 7-4 teams this Sunday, Nov. 30. Kickoff for the Thanksgiving weekend showdown is set for 1 p.m. Baltimore, currently riding a two-game winning streak, is 4-1 at M&T Bank Stadium this season, emerging victorious in its last four games held in Charm City. The Chargers, who have also won two-straight games, are coming off a tight 27-24 win over St. Louis last Sunday. San Diego has not played in Baltimore since 2006, when the Ravens won 16-13.

• Baltimore is in a tight race in the ultra-competitive AFC North, which is the only division in NFL history to boast all four teams at three games above .500 at any point in a season. The Ravens, who have already played five of their six division games this year (a Week 17 home battle with the Browns remains), are a half game behind leader Cincinnati (7-3-1). Pittsburgh and Cleveland are also 7-4, but Baltimore holds tie-breakers over each team.

• Last Monday night, **RB Justin Forsett** rushed for a career-high 182 yards and 2 TDs, leading Baltimore to a 34-27 victory over the host Saints. The Ravens rushed for a season-high 215 yards, while **QB Joe Flacco** was an efficient 18-of-24 for 243 yards and 1 TD (120.7 passer rating). **S Will Hill** had a 44-yard INT return for a go-ahead score in the third quarter, and Baltimore's pass rush racked up 4 sacks on QB Drew Brees, including 2 by **OLB Elvis Dumervil**. The Ravens (4-0) swept the NFC South in 2014, outscoring the four teams by a combined 149-61 margin.

• Following this weekend's game vs. San Diego, the Ravens will travel to Miami (Dec. 7) and then host Jacksonville on Dec. 14.

## HARBS SAYS

"We need to be the Ravens during this stretch in the season. We can't turn the ball over. We need to convert on third downs and stop our opponents from converting. In the red zone, we need to continue to be stingy and score touchdowns when we are there. We need to bring that Ravens' physicality to every play, continue to play with intelligence and use every strength we have. Like every team, we have weaknesses, and we have to work through those. We will."

## **INJURY REPORT**

WR/RS Michael Campanaro (hamstring) has missed the past three games, while G/T Jah Reid (broken hand) has been out for the last two contests. CB/RS Asa Jackson (toe) is on Injured Reserve - Designated for Return, but started practicing last week. Key players on Injured Reserve include standout starters TE Dennis Pitta (hip) and CB Jimmy Smith (foot). Also on IR are LS Morgan Cox (knee), DE Kapron Lewis-Moore (Achilles), veteran CB Aaron Ross (Achilles) and rookie fourth-round draft pick DE Brent Urban (knee).

#### DUMERVIL & SUGGS REV UP RAVENS' PASS RUSH

Baltimore has registered 29 sacks this season, with 24 of those coming in the past six games (since Oct. 12). That mark ranks as the NFL's third most during this span and has been bolstered by the standout play of **OLB Elvis Dumervil** and **OLB Terrell Suggs**. Dumervil owns 12.5 QB drops this season, tying (Connor Barwin) for second in the NFL, while Suggs has tallied 6 QB drops and now owns 100.5 during his storied Ravens career.

Justin Tucker described you as a "salty competitor." How would you describe your competitive nature? "Salty competitor? That's probably a good way to put it, because I'm always striving to just do the best I can each and every day. He's probably pretty close to being right on."

If you could play any other position, what would it be? "It would either have to be quarterback, because I like throwing the ball – I like to spin it – or inside linebacker. I loved playing defense in high school, and I was recruited to Nebraska as a linebacker/punter-type."

How much pride do you put into controlling the battle for field position? "It's been more so this year, and that has been a little more gratifying. Rather than trying to punt the ball as high as you can and trying to angle it properly, we're doing other things this year trying to keep the ball away from the returners. We're keeping the ball low, putting it up high. It just depends on what we're trying to do for that particular game. It just makes it more enjoyable for me. I'm not just out there doing the routine thing every single punt. Even though it does make it a lot easier because you're hitting the same ball every time, this year we're mixing it up, and we're having fun with it."

What is the most underrated part of punting? "Everybody nowadays, with the way stats are going and everything, everybody expects that 50-yard ball. Well, the underrated part is going out there in these cold-weather temperatures and hitting a ball that's cold, or the wind could be blowing right to left, and hitting a moving target every time. It's just being able to go out there and consistently do that every time. A lot of people, I think, feel like it's just easy to punt a ball."

To what or to whom do you credit your longevity and success in the NFL? "I think a lot of it comes from family, wanting to do the right thing to support them. But also being backed by such a great organization as the Ravens and all the guys that we have up front with [president] Dick Cass and [owner] Steve Bisciotti, and then all the coaches. I look forward, and I've always looked forward to going out there and proving my worth every year and doing the things that I can to help our team out. Being able to be here has just been a blessing. This is just a first-class organization."

What's it like being an NFL dad? "It's great. There are a lot of things that my four kids get to do that most kids in the neighborhood don't get to do, and it's fun to give them that opportunity. But it's also a way that we can show them a lot of life lessons through football. It's definitely a blessing."

### NOTE OF THE WEEK I

Ravens new offensive coordinator **Gary Kubiak** has either been an OC (Denver Broncos, 1995-2005) or head coach (Houston Texans, 2006-13) for 19 NFL seasons. During these 19 seasons, his offenses have ranked among the NFL's Top 10 scoring units 14 times (the Ravens are No. 7 entering Week 13 this year). Additionally, 14 running backs have topped the 1,000-yard rushing mark under Kubiak. Ravens **RB Justin Forsett**, who needs 97 yards to hit 1,000 this season, is having a career year in Kubiak's offense. Forsett's 903 yards rank third in the NFL, while his 5.83 rushing average stands No. 1 among all RBs. If Forsett can hit 1K this year, he'll notch the 12th such campaign in Ravens history and become the 15th rusher to do so under Kubiak (other RBs detailed below):

# QUOTH THE RAVENS BALTIMORE FOOTBALL

"I'll take these guys any day of the week over anybody. They do an outstanding job running the football and finding the holes and running tough. Obviously, we have guys up front that are working really hard for them, but [from] my experience with [offensive coordinator] coach [Gary] Kubiak's offense – it's built off the run. It's built off being physical that way, and then doing what we do with play-action passing and keepers, getting the ball downfield that way."

## - TE Owen Daniels on the Ravens' success running the football

## Offensive coordinator Gary Kubiak on where G Marshal Yanda ranks among the best linemen he's ever seen:

"He's as good as any I've ever been around, and I've been around some great ones. I'm so impressed with the technician that he is, how hard he plays, how tough he is – the things he plays through. He's a consistent body of work. All those guys that I've been around that, to me, achieved that type of status as a player – which, in my opinion, his has got to be as good as it could be – they're all kind of the same in how they work and how hard they play, and they're all very smart. I knew he was a good player when I came here, but man, is he impressive – not only as a player, too, but as a person – how he goes about getting ready to play."

## Saints QB Drew Brees on if he views the Ravens as one of the NFL's top pass-rushing teams:

"I do. I do view them that way, because they're built that way. [They are] one of the few defenses that is as good against defending the run as they are against rushing the passer. Most teams, they kind of sacrifice one or the other, and these guys are really good at both. I'd say that's a pretty rare combination."

## OLB Elvis Dumervil on the Ravens' pass rush and rotation among their outside linebackers:

"It's not that I don't feel I can play every down. It's just when you have a lot of talent that we have, you can just stay fresh throughout the year. It just makes sense. It's a fortunate situation we have in Baltimore. Not every team has the luxury to do that. We have this type of talent, and it helps to keep guys fresh."

## Special teams coordinator/associate head coach Jerry Rosburg on K Justin Tucker's success:

"Justin has been effective in the NFL because he took his talent and combined it with a hungry, humble mindset. He's very coachable, listens carefully and has worked hard. The best way to describe him as a kicker is that he's consistent, explosive and fearless."

## FB Kyle Juszczyk on the Ravens' offense's improvement and striving to be one of the NFL's best:

"The term that we've been saying a lot is, 'There's still some meat left on the bone.' We feel like we still have a lot of room to improve, because we feel like we've got a lot of potential here. We really feel like we can be a Top 5 offense."

## RB Justin Forsett on surpassing expectations by having a career year in Baltimore:

"I'm sure there are still some people who are surprised. I'm OK with surprising people. ... There's always going to be doubters. There's always going to be people that want to limit me and put me in boxes. It's my job to go out and try to break them."

#### Saints head coach Sean Payton on WR Steve Smith Sr.:

"He has energy. He has juice. He is a guy that obviously looks for the big-play opportunities. I love watching him play – his passion. He's tough. There is an energy that he brings with him that is very evident just on watching the tape. When you see him in person, you feel that."

## NFL Media's Gil Brandt on LB C.J. Mosley being among the leaders in Pro Bowl voting:

"It takes exceptional instincts to thrive at inside linebacker. This was true in the days of Lee Roy Jordan, it was true when Ray Lewis was ruling the field, and it's true now. Mosley does indeed have exceptional instincts. He's more of a narrow-bodied guy, but this actually makes it easier for him to drop into coverage. Mosley's an excellent tackler who plays with tons of energy and had a very good first half of the season. ... Mosley has exceeded my expectations for him."

Head coach John Harbaugh on CB Anthony Levine using special teams performance to earn an opportunity as a defensive starter: "There are plenty of guys that think they can play offense and defense and aren't good on special teams and get a rude awakening in this league, and they're usually out of the league pretty quickly. Anthony is not one of those guys. We have other guys like that: I'd put Jeromy Miles in that category, Brynden Trawick, just to name a few off the top of my head. Those guys are all going to be very good players in the secondary when they get their opportunity. Anthony is getting his opportunity now, and he's going to make the most of it."

## *ESPN.com*'s Jamison Hensley on the Ravens hitting the season's final stretch heading to the playoffs:

"The Ravens are building a physical identity with a bullying ground game and a run defense that doesn't budge. Their glaring weakness is a secondary that starts a converted safety [Anthony Levine] at cornerback and rotates safeties on almost every series. If this secondary can stay competitive, the Ravens will stay in the thick of the playoff race."

## LAST WEEK'S RECAP

#### BALTIMORE RAVENS - 34, NEW ORLEANS - 27

RB Justin Forsett scored 2 TDs while rushing for a career-high 182 yards on 22 carries (8.3 ypc) in the Ravens' 34-27 victory over the Saints last Monday night. The game opened dramatically with the Saints driving to the Ravens' 1-yard line after an end-around, 67yard sprint by WR Joseph Morgan, who was caught from behind by hustling CB Lardarius Webb. After failing to get into the end zone on three plays, Saints RB Mark Ingram tried to penetrate the inside of Baltimore's line and was pushed back by DT Haloti Ngata for a 2-yard loss on the fourth-and-goal play. QB Joe Flacco then directed a 9-play, 97-vard drive that ended when he hit WR Steve Smith Sr. with a 15yard scoring strike for a 7-0 Ravens' lead. New Orleans made it 7-7 in the first quarter after QB Drew Brees found TE Jimmy Graham for a 10-yard TD. The Ravens then drove to the Saints' 1, but a fumble by FB Kyle Juszczyk on the first play of the second quarter stopped the drive. On the Ravens' next possession, Forsett scored his first TD of the contest, a 13-yard scamper that gave the Ravens a 14-7 lead. A 20-yard K Shayne Graham field goal brought the Saints within 4 (14-10). New Orleans then completed the first half with an 8-play, 81-yard series that ended with a Brees-to-WR Marques Colston 26-yard TD to give the Saints a 17-14 advantage. The Ravens came back in the third quarter to grab a 24-17 lead on K Justin Tucker's 31-yard FG and a S Will Hill 44-yard score off an interception of Brees. Tucker increased that Ravens' lead to 27-17 on an impressive 55-yard FG 4 minutes into the fourth quarter. Graham's 34-yarder with 4:26 left in the game brought the Saints within a TD (27-20). Baltimore then consumed nearly 4 minutes before Forsett's second TD, a 20-yard sprint off the left side, giving the Ravens a 34-20 lead. Brees and Graham did combine for a final Saints' score (2 yards) with 40 seconds left in the contest. Led by Flacco, who completed 18 of 24 for 243 yards, the Ravens were 9-of-13 on third-down conversions. WR Torrey Smith caught 5 for 98 yards, while WR Steve Smith Sr. added 4 for 89. The Saints exploded for 525 yards with Brees accounting for 420 of those on 35-of-45 passing.

#### **PRO CONNECTIONS**

• Ravens director of player development **Harry Swayne** spent six seasons playing as an offensive tackle for the Chargers (1991-96), contributing to San Diego's 1994 AFC Championship. From 1991-95, Swayne appeared in 87 games, starting each one.

• Chargers **DE Jarret Johnson** was originally selected by the Ravens in the fourth round (109th) of the 2003 NFL Draft. Johnson spent nine seasons in Baltimore, registering 20 sacks in 143 games played. Johnson's streak of 129-consecutive games played ranks second in Ravens history.

• Ravens **DE Lawrence Guy** joined the Chargers midseason in 2013 and was claimed off waivers by Baltimore after Week 3 in 2014.

• Chargers head coach **Mike McCoy** was the Broncos' offensive coordinator from 2010-12, working alongside Ravens QBs coach **Rick Dennison** (1995-2009) and ILBs coach **Don Martindale** (2009-10). Dennison also coached with Chargers secondary coach **Ron Milus** (2000-02, 2011-12) in Denver, and Martindale worked with assistant special teams coach **Craig Aukerman** (2010) as well. Furthermore, Ravens **OLB Elvis Dumervil** (2006-12) and Chargers **WR Eddie Royal** (2008-11) played for the Broncos during this period.

• Chargers assistant strength and conditioning coach **Rick Lyle** was originally signed by the Browns as an undrafted free agent DE in 1994 and moved with the franchise to Baltimore in 1996, his only season with the Ravens. Lyle appeared in 11 games for Baltimore.

• Chargers special teams coordinator **Kevin Spencer** began his NFL coaching career as a coaching assistant under Bill Belichick in Cleveland from 1991-94. During this time, Ravens general manager and executive VP **Ozzie Newsome** was a special assignment scout (1991-92), assistant to the head coach/offense/pro personnel (1993) and director of pro personnel (1994) with the Browns.

• Chargers LBs coach **Joe Barry** held the same title in Jacksonville when he coached with Ravens LBs coach and former Jaguars DL coach **Ted Monachino** in 2009. Ravens **ILB Daryl Smith** and **T Eugene Monroe** played for Jacksonville that season as well.

• Chargers head coach **Mike McCoy** was the WRs coach (2001), offensive assistant (2002-03), QBs/offensive assistant coach (2004-05), QBs coach (2006) and passing game coordinator/QBs coach (2007-08) in Carolina when Ravens **WR Steve Smith Sr.** (2001-13) was with the Panthers. Chargers WRs coach **Fred Graves** coached Smith Sr. when he was Carolina's WRs coach during the 2011-12 seasons.

• Chargers K Nick Novak attended the University of Maryland (2001-04).

• Ravens LB C.J. Mosley (2010-13), OLB Courtney Upshaw (2008-11), Chargers T D.J. Fluker (2010-12) and NT Damion Square (2008-12) were members of Alabama's 2011 Alabama BCS National Championship team. Upshaw, Fluker and Square also won the national title with the Crimson Tide in 2009.

• Ravens assistant offensive line coach **Todd Washington** was the "O" line coach (2007-08) and offensive coordinator (2009) at the University of San Diego.

• Ravens **WR Steve Smith Sr.** (1999-2000) was coached by Chargers wide receivers coach **Fred Graves** at Utah. Graves was the assistant head coach and WRs coach (1998-2000).

Then-rookie K Justin Tucker kicked a 38-yard field goal with no time left in regulation to tie the Chargers at 13-13, and he then booted another 38-yarder with 1:07 left in overtime to give Baltimore a 16-13 victory over San Diego at Qualcomm Stadium. The Chargers took a 13-3 lead on K Nick Novak's 30-yard FG with 7:39 left in the fourth quarter. Ravens QB Joe Flacco then directed a 9-play, 80-yard drive that ended with a 4-yard TD toss to TE Dennis Pitta with 4:19 left in regulation to make the score 13-10. After the Baltimore defense limited the Chargers to a three-and-out, the Ravens had the ball on their own 40 following a 23-yard punt return by WR/RS Jacoby Jones. Four plays later, the Ravens faced fourth-and-29 on their own 37 when the play of the game was made. Flacco threw a short pass to RB Ray Rice, who scampered the needed 29 yards to San Diego's 34-yard line for the first down. Four plays later, Tucker tied the game as the fourth quarter ended. The Chargers had the ball twice in the overtime, the second resulting in a three-and-out before Flacco led the winning 12-play, 69-yard drive. After a scoreless first quarter, the Chargers took a 10-0 halftime lead on QB Philip Rivers' 21-yard strike to WR Malcom Floyd and a 47-yard Novak FG. The only score in the third period came from a Tucker 43-yard FG to make the deficit 10-3 entering the fourth guarter. Flacco finished with 30 completions on 51 attempts for 355 yards. Rice caught 8 passes for 67 yards, while WR Torrey Smith grabbed 7 for a contest-high 144 yards, including a key 31-yarder on the game's final series. Rice added 97 rushing yards (22 carries). Rivers completed 23 of 36 for 228 yards and was sacked 6 times, twice by DE Arthur Jones, who posted 5 total tackles.

## 2014 CHARGERS SNAPSHOT

Week 12 Recap: A fourth-quarter 29-yard scoring strike to WR Keenan Allen from QB Philip Rivers capped a 21-point second-half effort by San Diego, which held on for a 27-24 victory over St. Louis at Qualcomm Stadium. Backed by Rivers' 291 yards and the 100-yard games by Allen and RB Ryan Mathews, the Chargers manufactured an impressive 410 yards in the win.


**Mike McCoy:** The NFL's youngest active head coach, McCoy, 42, owns a 17-12 career record (.586), now in his second season at San Diego's helm. In 2013, McCoy led the Chargers to a 9-7 showing in his rookie campaign, winning five of their last six games to earn a playoff berth. San Diego defeated Cincinnati in the Wild Card, marking the franchise's first postseason victory since 2008.

**Offense:** QB Philip Rivers is the Chargers' offensive anchor, producing 2,835 yards, 22 TDs and a 101.4 QB rating, while completing 68.3 percent of his passes (third in the NFL) this season. Rivers' top scoring target, Pro Bowl veteran **TE Antonio Gates**, has dominated with 9 TDs, while **WR Keenan Allen**, fresh off a 104-yard performance, leads San Diego's wideouts with 641 yards on 61 receptions.

**Defense:** The Chargers' defense, which has allowed 14 or fewer points four times in 2014, ranks 15th against the run (108.8), but it is also the NFL's sixth-best passing "D" (221.3 ypg). **CB Brandon Flowers** leads the charge with 3 INTs and 9 PDs. **S Eric Weddle**, San Diego's leading tackler with 72 stops (56 solo), has produced 8 PDs, 1 INT and 1 FF.

#### **RAVENS' TWO-STRAIGHT TOP 5'S**

In 2013, senior NFL writer Rick Gosselin of The Dallas Morning News ranked the Ravens' special teams unit No. 5 in the league in his annual comprehensive ratings system that is based on 22 categories, assigning points according to each standing -1 for best, 32 for worst. In 2012, Gosselin ranked the Ravens' unit No. 2 in the NFL, just behind the Vikings, who finished first.

### SPECIAL FORCES



Special teams coordinator/associate head coach Jerry Rosburg, a 36-year coaching veteran, has guided a strong special teams group since arriving in Baltimore in 2008.

• Dating back to 2011, Baltimore has 7 total kick return TDs (3 PR & 4 KOR), ranking as the NFL's most.

• In 2012's Super Bowl season, the Ravens' ST units excelled. Led by Pro Bowl RS Jacoby Jones, Baltimore ranked first in the NFL in kickoff return average (27.3), also setting a team record. Jones, who became the first player ever to record dual KORs of at least 105 yards in a career, tied for a league-leading 3 kick return TDs (2 KORs & 1 PR) and averaged an NFL-best 30.7 yards per kickoff return. Jones also tied an NFL record for longest KOR in Super Bowl history with his 108-yard KOR-TD. (In 2014's Week 9 game at Pittsburgh, Jones added another 108-yard KOR-TD to his stellar resume and now has 4 total KOR-TDs over 100 yards during his career.)

• In 2013, Pro Bowl K Justin Tucker set franchise records in FGs made (38) and FGs attempted (41). Going 38-of-41 on FGAs, Tucker produced a franchise-record 140 points (tied for sixth in NFL), while his 6 FGs of 50+ yards tied (several players) for the NFL's most. Tucker kicked an impressive 3 game-winning FGs on the season, including a 61-yarder at Detroit.

• Additionally, in 2013, the Ravens' KOR unit averaged 26.4 vards per return, ranking second in the NFL. Baltimore's punt return unit averaged 14.2 yards per return, the NFL's third-best mark. The Ravens posted an NFL-high 20 punt returns of 20+ yards.

• Prior to Baltimore, Rosburg built a successful NFL special teams resume with both the Browns (2001-06) and Falcons (2007). Under his leadership. Cleveland's special teams units were consistently ranked among the NFL's best. Over a five-year span (2002-06), the Browns' special teams were ranked as the top NFL unit in Rick Gosselin's annual comprehensive special teams report.

• Four Ravens players have earned Pro Bowl honors while playing for Rosburg: ST Brendon Ayanbadejo (2008), K Billy Cundiff (2010), RS Jacoby Jones (2012) and K Justin Tucker (2013).

## A STRONG RETURN

Dating back to 2008 when Jerry Rosburg became the Ravens' special teams coordinator, Baltimore has produced the NFL's No. 1 kickoff return average (25.4) and second-most (tied) KOR-TDs (6).

## **COORDINATORS NOTES**

## THE KUBIAK ATTACK



**Gary Kubiak**, a 21-year NFL coaching veteran who spent the past eight seasons (2006-13) as head coach of the Houston Texans, was hired as the Ravens' offensive coordinator on Jan. 27. Under his guidance, Houston earned back-to-back AFC South crowns from 2011-12 and two playoff berths.

Kubiak owns a Texans' franchise-record 63 total wins, posting a 63-66 overall mark (61-64 regular season, 2-2 postseason). Prior to his time with the Texans, Kubiak spent 11 seasons (1995-2005) as the Denver Broncos' offensive coordinator, also coaching the quarterbacks during his first eight seasons. Under his guidance, Denver's offense reached new heights behind the likes of QB John Elway, TE Shannon Sharpe and RB Terrell Davis, with the team earning seven postseason trips and back-to-back Super Bowl titles (1997-98) during that span. As Denver's offensive coordinator, the Broncos averaged NFL bests in yards per game (365.0) and points per game (25.2) from 1995-2005.

## **TEXANS SUCCESS**

Under **Gary Kubiak**, the Texans earned their Top 6 all-time offensive outputs in scoring, total offense and passing yards from 2007-12. During this time, the Texans also boasted the franchise's Top 3 rushing outputs, including the NFL's No. 2 ground attack in 2011 when they posted a franchise-record 153.0 yards per game. From 2008-12, Kubiak's offense was one of only two teams (Denver) to have its total offense, passing offense and rushing offense each rank in the Top 5 at least once during that span.

## SMITH WAS SCINTILLATING

WR Torrey Smith excelled in 2013. With 6 receptions for 121 yards in Week 5 at Miami, Smith became the first Raven since Qadry Ismail in 1999 to post back-to-back 100-yard receiving games. (Ismail had three straight that year.)

• In Week 15 at Detroit, Smith (now 42) moved past Derrick Mason (35) to produce a franchise record in receptions of 25-or-more yards.

• Smith had 13 catches gaining 25-plus yards in 2013, just 1 shy of the franchise single-season record set by WR Michael Jackson (14) in 1996.

• Smith's 1,128 receiving yards in 2013 were the second most in Ravens single-season franchise history (Jackson – 1,201 in 1996).

• Smith, who produced a 17.4-yard receiving average in 2013, pulled in a 42-yard bomb in Week 16 vs. NE, marking his eighth catch of 40-or-more yards in 2013.

Head Coach John Harbaugh on Torrey Smith: "In my opinion, he's a premier player in the National Football League. ... He works his rear end off. He has a great attitude. You have to pull the guy back. You have to grab him and say, 'Hey, man. Take a blow!' You have to do that, because he's like a horse – he'll run himself until his heart explodes. He'll do it. He's just a great, great young man."

## TORREY'S COURAGEOUS NIGHT

**WR Torrey Smith** played in the 2012 Week 3 Sunday night victory over New England after his brother, 19-year-old Tevin Jones, passed away in a motorcycle accident that morning. Smith posted 6 catches for 127 yards and 2 TDs in the come-from-behind win, producing the third 100-yard game of his young career.

## SMITH BIG IN SUPER BOWL RUN

In the 2012 thrilling, double-overtime Divisional Playoff win at Denver (38-35 on 1/12/13), **WR Torrey Smith** caught 59-yard and 32-yard TD passes, helping mark the first game in NFL playoff history that a QB (**Joe Flacco**) threw 2 TDs of 59-plus yards (the other being to **WR Jacoby Jones** on a 70-yarder). In the 2012 postseason, Smith recorded a 21.2 yards-per-catch average, reeling in 11 passes for 233 yards.

## LONG BALL LOVE

No doubt, **WR Torrey Smith** is a big-play threat. The fourth-year wideout has 25 career TD catches (including a team-high 6 in 2014). Those career scoring strikes have gained 599 yards for an average of 23.96 yards per touchdown. Here is a breakdown of Smith's career touchdowns:



**CB Jimmy Smith**, one of the NFL's top cornerbacks and the Ravens' 2011 first-round pick, suffered a foot injury in Week 8 at Cincy and has been placed on Injured Reserve for the rest of the season. Even though he missed the past three games, Smith is still first on the team with 8 PD, also racking up 28 tackles.

• In Week 6's 48-17 win at Tampa Bay, Smith had 5 tackles and 1 INT, which he returned 31 yards to help set up a Ravens' TD.

• Smith has been outstanding over the past couple seasons. In 2013, he had 16 passes defensed (third on the team), adding 2 INTs, 2 FFs and 58 tackles in his first year as a regular starter for the club.

## FORSETT HUGE IN NOLA

**RB Justin Forsett** posted a career-high 182 rushing yards and 2 TDs on 22 carries in the 34-27 win at New Orleans. Here are several fast facts about his performance:

• Forsett had 115 first-half rushing yards, matching the NFL's top opening half this season (DeMarco Murray against the Titans in Week 2).

• Forsett's 182 stands as the ninth-best single-game rushing output in Ravens history, while his 8.3 average ranks eighth (min. 10 attempts).

• The 182 ranks as the NFL's third-best single-game mark in 2014, only trailing a 201-yard game by Jonas Gray and a 204-yard performance by Le'Veon Bell.

• Only three times before in Ravens history has a back rushed for at least 180 yards and 2 TDs in a game: Jamal Lewis (295 & 2 on 9/14/03 vs. Cle.), Jamal Lewis (205 & 2 on 12/21/03 at Cle.) and Ray Rice (191 & 2 on 1/1/12 at Cin.)

Two-time Pro Bowl **TE Owen Daniels** has made a reception in 98-straight games, tying for the longest active streak among NFL TEs. In Week 2 vs. Pit., he had his 5th-career 2-TD game, finishing with 5 catches for 28 yards. Daniels has been one of the NFL's most productive TEs since his 2006 All-Rookie season. Tucker had a franchiserecord 140 points (tied for sixth in NFL), while his 6 FGs of 50+ yards tied (several players) for the NFL's most.

• In addition to his 2013 Pro Bowl honor, Tucker was named Special Teams Player of the Month (November) and AFC Special Teams Player of the Week three times.

• Tucker made 33-straight FGs at one point during the 2013 season, ranking as the NFL's fourth-longest streak of all time.

• His 6 FGs made on 12/16 at Det. set a team record and were a singlegame NFL high in 2013. Against the Lions, he became the first NFL kicker ever to connect from the 20-, 30-, 40-, 50- & 60-yard range in a game.

• Tucker kicked 3 game-winning FGs in 2013, including a franchiserecord 61-yarder at Detroit. (He now has 7-career game-winners.)
