STUDENT ABSENCES

Each day your child is going to be absent, please call the Country Trails office at 847-717-8000 **before 9:30am**. If you prefer, you may email the school secretaries, Mandi Bavaro and Teri Schramer, as well as the classroom teacher to report an absence.

If we do not hear from you, it will be necessary to call you at home or work to verify the absence.

When reporting an absence, please indicate the length of the absence, as well as the reason why your child will not be at school, such as, family vacation, going out of town, or illness. If the absence is due to illness, we need to know the symptoms they are experiencing, including any flu-like symptoms, (fever, headache, and sore throat.)

We appreciate your cooperation!

TARDY STUDENTS

School begins at 9:00am. Students should be in their classrooms ready to learn at 9:00. Please remember to come into the office to **sign in your child if he/she is late.** The State requires this and they do check these lists; it causes problems for us if the parent/guardian hasn't signed in the tardy student.

NOTES TO SCHOOL

Your child's teacher needs a written note if your child is:

- a bus rider and they are not riding the bus home
- going to be picked up by someone else -please indicate who will be picking them up
- going to be taken out of school earlier than the scheduled dismissal time - please indicate the time of pick up

Please send a note to your child's teacher if your child is going to have a change in their usual form of transportation home. Be sure to include the child's first and last name in the note. The office **cannot** accommodate phone calls to change a student's transportation routine after **2:00pm**. Teachers may not have time to check their email before dismissal, so we ask that all changes be made through the office to ensure the students' safe delivery home.

If your child attends the BASE after school program or daycare and there is a change in plans, please notify the BASE/daycare **and** the school office.

SECURITY PRECAUTIONS

For the safety of the students and staff in the building, all visitors, including parents and volunteers, are required to enter through the office and sign in. To be buzzed into the office you will need to push the buzzer located on the wall to the left of the office door corridor. Please do not knock on the main doors to get students attention. We teach the students not to let anyone in.

MEDICATIONS AT SCHOOL

Parents are reminded to bring their children's medications, both prescription and over the counter, with a completed "Meds A" form to school as soon as possible. "Med's A" forms are available online at www.burlington.k12.il.us or you can pick one up in the school office. For the safety of all children, children are not allowed to transport medications to school.

PARENT NIGHTS

We love having the opportunity to meet parents to share what to expect this school year. This year, parent night will be held on two separate evenings (see attached schedule). During both evening events, you will have an opportunity to meet with your child's teacher and find out about the curriculum, classroom expectations, and more.

You are your child's first and most important teacher. We value your partnership/collaboration toward ensuring their success. When you team up a very supportive staff and an involved group of parents, the children become excited about school and it creates a positive school year for everyone.

HALLOWEEN COSTUMES

As you are planning with your child about his or her costume, please consider certain aspects in choosing their attire. The Halloween parties at school will be on October 31st. Costumes depicting violent themes or poor taste will not be allowed to be worn by students. No costumes depicting blood, involving any type of liquid or grotesque injuries are allowed. No weapons of any type should be brought to school as a part of a costume. Any items that are inappropriate for school will be taken and returned to the child's parent. We want this day to be enjoyable while maintaining a positive learning environment. If you have any questions about what is appropriate, please contact the school office.

DESTRUCTION OF RECORDS

Central Community Unit School District 301 will destroy special education records from school years 2008-09 and prior of students who graduated, transferred, or otherwise permanently withdrew from special education services.

Special education records may include reports of psychological and social work evaluations, multidisciplinary planning conferences, annual reviews, copies of Individual Education Programs and other relevant information.

If a parent or student wants those records, they should call the Student Support Services & Special Education Office at 847-464-5863 before October 31, 2014.

EARLY CHILDHOOD SCREENINGS

State law indicates that all children with qualifying disabilities between the ages of three and five years must be provided with programs appropriate to their needs. The school district must offer an annual screening of these children in order to determine need and eligibility for special education services. Eligible children must be three years of age.

Central Community School District #301 will conduct such screenings at Howard B. Thomas Grade School, 44W575 Plato Road, Hampshire, IL from August through March at pre-arranged times.

The following areas are sample behaviors that might indicate that a preschool child may be eligible for special education services:

- Does not talk or communicate as well as others his/her age
- Is always on the fringe of activities, never really involved
- Finds it difficult to play with other children
- Has difficulty with feeding, dressing and toileting
- Has difficulty putting together a puzzle, matching shapes/patterns
- Has difficulty sitting still while listening to a short story or watching television
- Does not respond to verbal cues when his/her back is turned
- Does not know names of common objects
- Cannot jump in place, appears clumsy, and/or walks into objects
- Has difficulty riding a tricycle, catching a ball or walking up stairs

If you notice that your child has displayed any of the above difficulties, or if you have other concerns, please contact Amanda Schmidt, Early Childhood Special Education Facilitator, at 847-464-6008 to arrange an Early Childhood Screening.

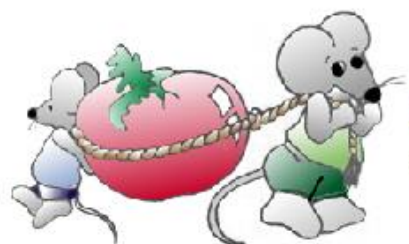

There will be no admission fee to the games for District 301 elementary and middle school students and their families.

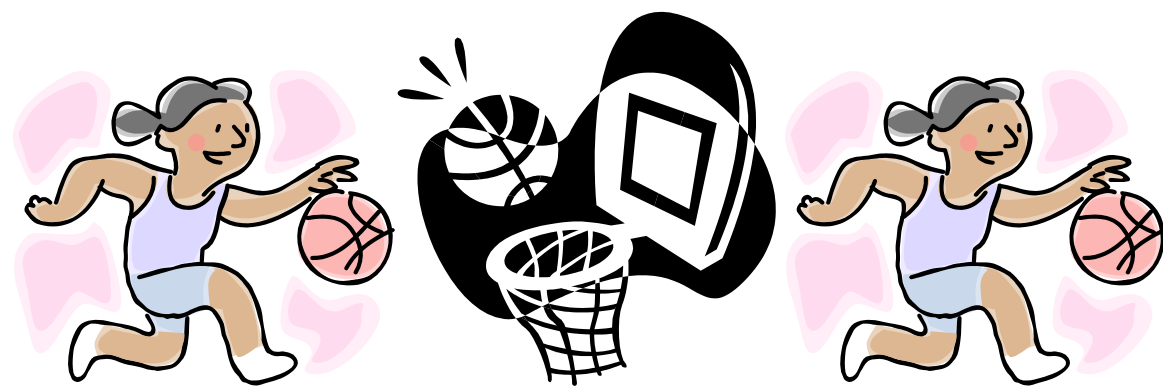
