College Board Recognition

COLLEGE BOARD NAMES GRANDVIEW HEIGHTS CITY SCHOOLS

TO 4TH ANNUAL AP DISTRICT HONOR ROLL

The College Board has named Grandview Heights City School District to its 4th Annual AP District Honor Roll. The College Board recognized 477 school districts in the United States and Canada for increasing access to college-level Advanced Placement (AP) courses while simultaneously maintaining or increasing student performance on AP exams.

Selection is based on meeting the following criteria:

Examination of three years of AP data (2011, 2012, and 2013) from all students who took AP Examinations in May of those year;

Achieving an 11 percent or greater increase in student participation in and/or access to Advance Placement courses (small school category);

Maintaining or improving performance levels when comparing the percentage of exams scoring 3+ in 2011 to 2013.

Grandview Heights High School has consistently increased opportunities for students to be involved in AP coursework and has maintained and/or improved the percentage of students who earn test scores of 3 or higher. "Additional time and great commitment are required by staff members who prepare for and teach these courses with increased rigor. This continues to be extremely important as competition for employment and college acceptance grows more challenging," said Ed O'Reilly, Superintendent of Schools.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. The purpose of the Essex School is to provide enrichment experiences for rising eleventh and twelfth grade students who are academically gifted and/or talented.
- 2. The School will operate June 15 June 21, 2014 on the campus of Otterbein University. All meals will be provided in dining halls or will be catered by local restaurants.
- 3. Those registered will participate in a **WEEK-LONG RESIDENTIAL** summer enrichment experience that includes activities such as seminars, workshops and extended projects focusing on a variety of subjects, such as science, sustainability, the arts, and literature.
- 4. The School will explore academic and/or artistic pursuits at a level not always possible in the typical high school classroom. The topics addressed by the seminars and workshops will reflect the interests of the students, and will have an eye especially on salient contemporary issues.
- 5. Neither grades nor credits will be given; however, students will receive a certificate of participation at the conclusion of the School.
- 6. Students will have the chance to enroll in a one-credit hour course at Otterbein University during the autumn semester. In this course, students will deepen their engagement with the issues at the heart of a book that all students in the School will read and discuss—Naomi Benaron's Running the Rift. All students will be sent a copy of this book after registering for the School.
- 7. The cost of the Essex School for 2014 is \$650.00. This cost can be assumed by family, district, and/or community of applicant. Financial assistance may be available for those who qualify. See registration for more information. A \$100 non-refundable deposit is due at the time of registration. Payment #2, totaling \$275, is due no later than March 16th and the final payment of \$275 is due May 16, 2014.
- 8. Because time at the Essex School is limited, students will not be granted leaves of absence from the School; attendance at all of the School activities is mandatory.
- 9. All students must adhere to the rules and regulations as prescribed and communicated to them. Any violation of these rules may result in the student's immediate dismissal from the School.
- 10. Students who complete the School will earn a \$1000 scholarship to Otterbein University and will become eligible to compete for a full scholarship.

Hello from the 2014 GHHS Yearbook staff! This letter is regarding senior materials for the yearbook. We know the senior year can be pretty hectic, so we wanted to make sure everyone knows what is coming up. **We will send out order forms with more specific instructions in early November.** This letter is to simply make you aware of certain deadlines and basic information so you can plan ahead.

First – Senior pictures - due January 31st. Pictures should be head-and-shoulders shots and will be printed in color. If you have your pictures taken through a professional photographer, ask them if they are sending the pictures to us or if you need to; not all photographers automatically send pictures in. Also, if you do not plan to have pictures taken, we can accept any good, recent picture of your Senior, in any size up to 8"x10". Additionally, we can arrange a free portrait session for your senior if needed, please contact Mrs. Kelsey at katherine.kelsey@ghcsd.org

Second – Baby pictures - due January 31^{st}. These can be any pictures of your senior before they started school, and will be printed in color.

Third – Senior Dedications - due March 30th These are ads placed by parents to congratulate their students on their hard work, to celebrate their achievements, and to wish them well in the future. Dedications can be bought as full pages, for \$110, half-pages, for \$60, and quarter-pages for \$30. You can design your ad yourself or have our staff design it for you. Senior dedications will be printed in color.
