#### Solar Panels at Nardin

As part of our Green Initiative, Nardin Academy has installed 120 solar panels on the roof of our main campus building at 135 Cleveland Avenue. The school is leasing these panels through Solar Liberty, a local company founded in 2003. The solar panels are part of what is known as a grid-tied photovoltaic solar energy system. The system allows us to harness the sun's energy to power our building and send excess electricity back to the power grid.



This clean energy is good for the environment and saves the school money. We plan to reduce our carbon footprint by decreasing our greenhouse gas emissions by approximately 17 tons of carbon dioxide each year. This is equivalent to planting 671 trees each year, or reducing the emissions from a medium-size car by 31,410 miles. The school is estimated to save approximately \$2,500 per year in energy costs.

Nardin Academy's administration and math and science teachers will be participating in a workshop this month to learn more about the system and how we can track the energy in real time. In addition, the school will be incorporating information about solar energy into the curriculum.
