



Last year we changed much about our presence at the Show. We emphasized America's Boating Course, offered a gift bag for those who filled out a card, and gave 8 volunteers \$25 gift cards to West Marine, had USPS fleece vests for volunteers, and more. It worked! We filled out 152 visitor cards (up from 40 the previous year) which were promptly distributed to the appropriate squadrons to assist in filling classes.

This year we will repeat those efforts and add another attraction. We will have one of the new **USPS Boating Skills Virtual Trainer** – (see this site......<u>http://www.usps.org/d12/PDF/BSVT.pdf</u>) beside our booth in our new larger location! For this we will need a minimum of three volunteers per shift.



We especially need volunteers who:

- Are very familiar with ABC- OR- are familiar with the Virtual Trainer
- Are willing to work a three hour shift.
- Will familiarize themselves with a briefing sheet sent to them before the show.

In return, all volunteers will gain free admittance to the show. Work your time slot and spend the rest of the day browsing the show! Most squadrons will reimburse your parking fees.
