Emergency Drills: Students should quietly walk to the designated area and form a straight line as a class facing the school. Students should remain quiet in order to hear further instructions from school personnel. Students who misbehave or conduct themselves inappropriately will serve after school detention with the teacher the following day.

Grading: Student grades are calculated as follows:

- · 80% Projects, Tests & Quizzes: assignments that are completed over several class meetings.
- · 10% Daily Assignments: assignments that are completed in one class meeting.

 This includes appropriate computer utilization (i.e. keyboarding, saving, spell-checking) and class participation.
- · 10% Homework: written, as well as returning of items requiring a signature.

RMS Grading Scale: A+ 97-100, A 93-96, A- 90-92, B+ 87-89, B 83-86, B- 80-82, C+ 77-79, C 73-76, C- 70-72, D+ 67-69, D 63-66, D- 60-62, F 50-59.

RMS Promotion Policy: Students must pass all subjects in order to be promoted to the next grade. This includes this class. Students that fail may be asked to complete a remediation packet to demonstrate mastery of the competencies taught in the class.

Class Participation: Students are given a grade for class participation. This includes being prepared for class everyday. Students are expected to do their best and participate in all areas of class: discussion, computer usage, proper keyboarding techniques, working together, cooperating and returning materials to the proper location.

Homework: Homework is due on the assigned date. Late work will be collected and evaluated; however, minimal credit may be given. If the student is absent, homework is due the day the student returns to school.

Student Absences: Attendance is important since the majority of assignments are completed in class. Outside computerized assignments are not accepted for work that should be completed during class time. Additional computer time is available after school by scheduling an appointment with the teacher. Please note: The teacher is not available during TEP due to other obligations in her schedule.

Teacher Absences: In the event that the teacher is absent, students should be on their best behavior. An after school detention will be scheduled with Ms. McGough upon her return to any student who is reported as violating classroom rules and/or being uncooperative with the guest teacher.

Passes: Take care of personal needs prior to reporting to class. Passes are for emergencies only and are issued after the instructional period of class when students are working independently. The student planner is the preferred pass. If you are injured in class, the teacher should be notified immediately.
