A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A PERIOD OF SIGNIFICANCE AS DIRECTED BY THE STATE HISTORIC PRESERVATION OFFICE AND THE NATIONAL PARK SERVICE

WHEREAS, a large percentage of the City of Jacksonville is a National Landmark District; and

WHEREAS, the State Historic Preservation Office and the National Park Service govern that district and have directed the City of Jacksonville to establish a Period of Significance; and

WHEREAS, the Period of Significance will become the guide for historical reference for the City from which the Landmark List and historic regulations in both the Comprehensive Plan and Municipal Code will be based; and

WHEREAS, the Historical and Architectural Review Commission (HARC) had several discussions during open public meetings on December 12, 2011, December 28, 2011, January 25, 2012 and February 22, 2012 which led to the HARC recommendation attached as Exhibit A

WHEREAS, the City hereby approves the recommendations from the Historical Architectural and Review Commission in Exhibit A attached hereto;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Jacksonville, Oregon approves the Period of Significance.

EXHIBIT A RESOLUTION 1089

The State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) has directed Jacksonville to determine a Period of Significance for our Historic Landmark District. The HARC has had several discussions during open public meetings on the SHPO report and the recommendations contained therein. HARC hereby recommends the following Periods of Significance be adopted by the City of Jacksonville:

Primary Period of Significance - 1852-1884

These are the buildings described in the original 1966 nomination that set the town apart. Those structures deemed contributing to this Period will be subject to the highest level of scrutiny.

Secondary Period of Significance – 1884-1920

These buildings represent the second generation of families and businesses that continued to live in the area and are some of the more recent historic buildings.

Tertiary Period of Significance - 1920-1945

The Great Depression Era and Pre World War II

Quaternary Period of Significance - 1945-1966

Post World War II up to Jacksonville's Original Nomination as a National Historic Landmark District
