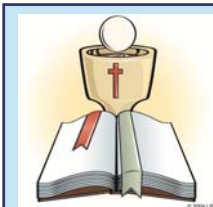

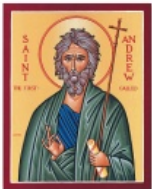

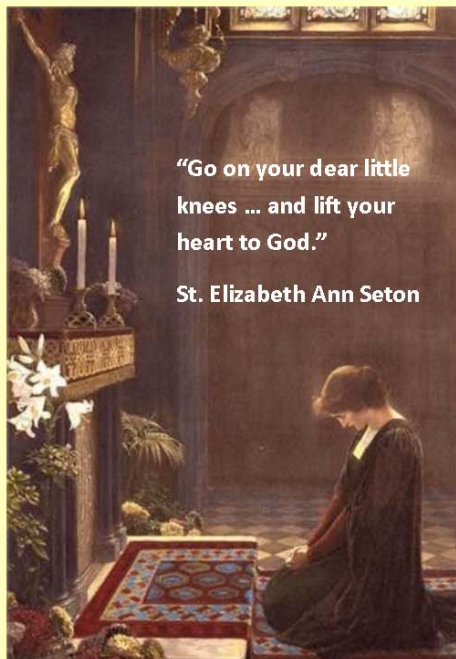

WHEN LIFE BEGINS



When Life Begins

Pro-choice advocates are invariably loathe to acknowledge the most important medical and scientific fact of all, namely that life begins at conception. Indeed, they will find no medical textbooks or scientific reference works that say that life begins at any time other than at conception.

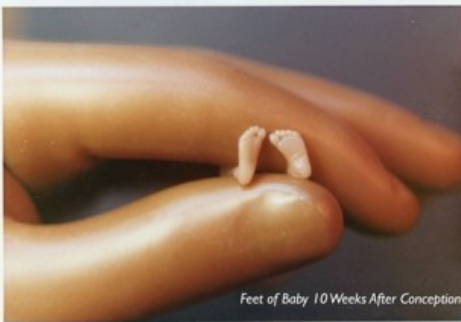

So where as the abortion industry has raked in hundreds of millions of dollars since abortion was legalized in 1973, the motive of pro-lifers, in offering their time and money to support women in problem pregnancy situations, is entirely selfless.

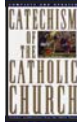

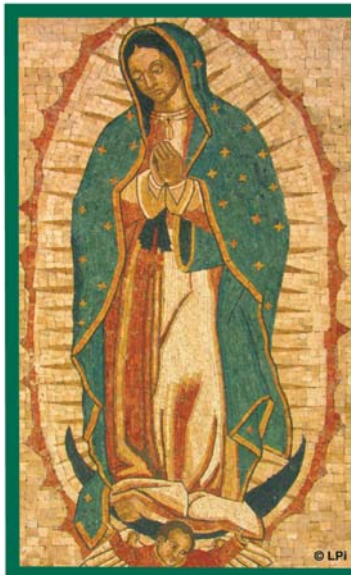

(San Juan 6,41-51).

Queridos Hermanos:

La Liturgia del Domingo pasado, nos presentaba el comienzo del discurso que Jesús pronunció sobre la Sagrada Eucaristía. Crear en Jesús significa poseer la Vida Eterna. Y para tener Vida Eterna, es necesario comer de ese pan que Cristo nos ofrece. Y ese pan es Jesucristo mismo. El nos alimenta con su Cuerpo y con su Sangre, que son comida y bebida de salvación. La única condición que nos pide Jesús, es la fe.

Muchos de nosotros nacimos y crecimos en familias creyentes y en ambientes de fe, y fuimos bautizados y educados en un ambiente cristiano, por lo tanto, hemos respirado la fe, de una manera tan natural, que pensamos, que lo más normal es ser creyente. No nos damos cuenta que la fe no es algo natural, sino un don inmerecido, un don que Dios nos ha regalado. Por eso; como creyentes en Jesucristo; es importante alejar de nuestro corazón las críticas, los chismes y las murmuraciones, y antes bien; abrimos más a la acción de Dios, dejándonos guiar por la luz y acción del Espíritu Santo.

Pero no olvidemos, que la incredulidad es una tentación siempre presente en nuestra vida, y que empieza a echar raíces en nuestro corazón, desde el momento mismo en que nos dejamos absorber por el ambiente consumista que nos rodea y le vamos dando la espalda a Dios. Por lo tanto; en la actualidad, Dios ha sido arrinconado y reducido a un segundo plano. Ya no queremos escuchar a Dios, lo vemos a El como un "obstáculo para nuestro proyecto de vida y libre desarrollo de nuestra personalidad".

Pidámosle a la Virgen María, para que Ella, nos ayude a descubrir, que la Sagrada Eucaristía, es el don y regalo más grande que Dios nos ha dejado a cada uno de nosotros. Por lo tanto, amemos a Jesús en la Sagrada Eucaristía.
