# Principal's Report

#### **National Literacy and Numeracy Week**

Thanks to all of the parents and carers that visited our Open Morning to view the great literacy and numeracy activities that take place at Lucknow PS. We are very proud of the work that we have done as a school to evolve the programs that we have and continue to make them more effective. Our Spelling and Maths programs have been a particular focus this year and we have seen an immediate effect in student achievement and confidence. I hope all those that visited enjoyed their morning.

#### eSmart Update

This year Lucknow Primary School is beginning to work toward eSmart accreditation. eSmart is a framework that guides the introduction of policies, practices and whole-school change processes to support the creation of a cybersafe or eSmart environment.

eSmart is a series of cultural change interventions developed by The Alannah and Madeline Foundation, aimed at creating positive, respectful and inclusive cultures which reduce bullying and cyberbullying and increase online safety.

As part of the process an updated Acceptable Use of Digital Technologies Policy has been developed for Lucknow PS. This also includes a student agreement and family information. This will go out to senior students shortly and the remainder of the school ready for the beginning of 2015.

We are also hosting Leading Senior Constable Toni Redshaw, who is the Youth Resource Officer based at Bairnsdale Police. She will be providing an information session for each of the middle and senior school classes around staying safe online.


