Two hundred and twenty-five head were exhibited from Minnesota, Wisconsin, South Dakota, Iowa and Kansas. A great young cow from Wisconsin won the show.

In September Randy Asprey and family of Havencrest Holsteins and Tracy Schaefer and Karla Smieja of Starlight Acres hosted the Minnesota Holstein Field Day. This was an excellent opportunity for Holstein enthusiasts to fine tune their judging skills while they tried to match placings with Perry Phend, official judge for the three judging classes. Perry will be the official judge at this years World Dairy Expo Holstein show. The field day was capped off with a very successful sale. The Harvest of Havencrest sale had a \$25,700 sale topper and a \$3,751 average on 86 lots.

Normen and Doris Peterson, Pete's Auction & Photo prepared the sale catalog, auctioneered and clerked the sale. Jill Schluelter, Kandiyohi-HA Club Secretary assisted in the clerking of the sale. Steve Peterson, Holstein Association-USA read pedigrees. Russ Thyen - Empty-Pockets Holstein, Reid Stransky - Stranshome Holsteins and Mike Eichler - Eichlers Cattle & Seed were selectors and served as ringmen the evening of the sale.

Fifty-five animals sold averaging \$2,128. The top seller was Jim Jamdl Nan S Storm-Red, a winter yearling bred to West Point Manix Red. She sold for \$3,700 to Ja-Knoll Dairy, Oronoco, MN. James and Jane Goeden of Wadena, prominent Red & White Holstein breeders, consigned the high seller.

James Martin of Lime Spring, Iowa consigned the second highest selling animal, JZM B-Iron Kate 143. She is a milking two-year old bred to Roylane Jordan- ET and due in January. Randy Asprey, Dodge Center was the buyer at \$3500.



## Greetings from the Minnesota Junior Holstein Association

The Minnesota Junior Holstein Association, commonly referred to as the MJHA, is a youth organization for those youth interested in Holstein cattle and the dairy industry. Minnesota has one of the strongest and most active state junior associations in the nation as well as one of the largest with almost 400 members. Juniors can hold membership in the junior association until their 21st birthday. The MJHA is a great way to meet dairy youth from across the state. Throughout the year, the MJHA hosts several events to bring membership together, such as: Junior All-Breeds Convention, State Holstein Show, Ag Olympics, the "Youth are Great Showcase" at Spring Sale, and several local events give members the opportunity to socialize.

The biggest event of the MJHA is the Junior All-Breeds Convention, which is held each year in early spring. Youth from all breeds are invited to attend this weekend event. Friday night kicks off with a pizza party, skits and mixers. Saturday morning starts with breakfast and county role call, followed by the morning activities such as: workshops, dairy manufacturing plant tours and farm tours. Saturday continues with a noon luncheon followed by the dairy bowl and speaking contests in which any junior may participate. Winners in both contests are given the opportunity to compete at the National Holstein Convention. Minnesota also sends juniors to the national convention to participate in the dairy jeopardy contest. Dairy bowl consists of four-member teams that compete against each other by answering questions about the dairy industry. Juniors are then given free time until the evening banquet.

The annual awards banquet is held Saturday night of convention highlighting the achievements of several Minnesota juniors. Each year, a keynote speaker shares some inspiration and then awards are given out. Awards include: Distinguished Junior Members, Outstanding Younger Members, scholarship winners, production winners, dairy bowl and speaking contest winners. After the banquet the juniors and chaperones socialize at the dance; which is guaranteed to be a great time for all.

Sunday morning includes breakfast, the annual business meeting, election of the new board members and door prizes for all. Junior Convention is a great time year after year. Watch upcoming Holstein and Dairy Star publications for more details on this year's convention which will be held in Rochester. The State Junior Holstein Show is another main activity of the MJHA.
