IMPORTANT PPSTA NOTICE TO MEDICARE PRIMARY MEMBERS

When Medicare is primary, you essentially have 100% coverage for all medical benefits covered under Medicare. However, you will pay normal PPSTA Benefit Trust/POMCO copays for basic services until you meet your Medicare Part B deductible. For 2013, the deductible is \$147. After meeting the deductible Medicare eligible retirees will not have to pay any copays.

DENTAL CARE

Trick-or-treating for Halloween candy caps off the month of October for most children, but with the sugary holiday comes the potential for something much scarier than plastic lawn ghosts—cavities and dental bills.

Whether your children are consuming large quantities of sugary treats or not, maintaining dental hygiene is an important habit to teach children. The best time to instill good dental habits is when your child is still young.

Begin teeth-cleaning as soon as teeth appear in your infant's mouth; this may include using a soft cloth to wipe your child's gums.

Start brushing when your child's first teeth appear.

Begin using toothpaste around age 2, but check with your doctor for specific recommendations.

Floss for your child starting at age 4.

Teach your child to brush for him- or herself around age 6 or 7, although you will likely need to continue supervising.

Teach your child to floss by age 8.

Why Are Clean Teeth Important?

Sugar from food is left in the mouth and on teeth, fueling the formation of plaque. Plaque is a film of bacteria that covers the teeth and gums and can cause gum disease and tooth decay. Brushing and flossing removes plaque and keeps your teeth strong.

Daily Care

Brush teeth twice a day, making sure the inner, outer and chewing surfaces of the teeth, as well as the tongue, are cleaned.

Use a pea-sized amount of fluoride toothpaste approved by the American Dental Association (ADA). Floss at least daily.



Professional Care Recommendations

The ADA recommends that a child should have his or her first dental visit within six months of the first tooth coming in, but no later than his or her first birthday. Preventing dental problems is always easier than correcting them, and your dentist can also offer suggestions for daily dental care.

After that first visit, dental visits should become a routine part of your child's health care, with a dental visit typically occurring every six months. If you anticipate your child being anxious about the first dental visit, have him or her come along and observe your visit beforehand so he or she knows what to expect.



TURNING 65?

If you are retired, when you turn age 65, you MUST enroll in Medicare. When you receive a Medicare card, please make 2 copies of both sides of it and mail one to the PPSTA Office so we can submit it to POMCO. Send the other copy to: Ellen Marble, Poughkeepsie City School District Business Office, 11 College Ave., Poughkeepsie, NY 12603. <u>This will enable you to receive a quarterly reimbursement for your monthly Medicare Part B contribution.</u>

NEWLY MARRIED?

Send copies of marriage certificate and new spouse's social security card to PPSTA Office within 31 days or else you must wait until open enrollment period to add spouse.

LEGALLY SEPARATED / DIVORCED?

A covered spouse loses coverage on the last day of the month due to loss of dependency status (legal separation or divorce). You are required to notify the PPSTA Office immediately, otherwise you are committing fraud.

HAVING A BABY?

Pregnant Enrollees **must enroll in the Prenatal Program within the FIRST TRIMESTER** by calling the Claims Administrator (866-227-9936) and completing an enrollment form. You will lose out on important benefits if you fail to do so. Check on-line for the description of benefits of The Prenatal Program at www.PPSTA.org, click on POMCO in the top menu bar, then click on PPSTA Plan.

NEW BIRTH?

Send copies of birth certificate and social security card to PPSTA Office.

DEPENDENT TURNING 26?

Coverage ends on the last day of the Child's birthday month.

DIABETIC?

You <u>must enroll in the Diabetic Program</u> by calling the Claims Administrator (866-227-9936). Check on-line for the description of benefits of the Diabetic Program at www.PPSTA.org, click on POMCO in the top menu bar, then click on PPSTA Plan.

INFERTILITY & WEIGHT LOSS PROGRAMS

APPR Info to remember:

- 1. The parties also agree, for the 2012-13 school year only, teachers will receive two (2) weeks notification of the announced formal preobservation conference as well as the proposed date for the observation. Teachers will submit lesson plans and TED documents to the administrator one week prior to the pre-observation. Within ten (10) days of the observation, a post-observation conference will be conducted. The parties also agree, for the 2012-13 school year, to provide feedback on an unannounced observation(s), which can also be forwarded electronically by the principal or other administrator within 48 hours. All Unannounced observations will be done after the Announced observations.
- 2. The parties also agree, for the 2012-13 school year only, that the Principal or other administrator will ensure that the goals collaboratively established, as well as the portfolio project proposal are submitted, reviewed and approved by November 15, 2012. The Principal or other administrator, prior to June 1, 2013, for the 2012-13 school year, will complete and post the timeline for reviewing and assessing the completed teacher portfolio and other evidence demonstrating the teacher's progress towards achievement of goals.

While this language speaks to the '2012-13 school year only, due to Triborough the terms and conditions of this language are still in effect. If any part of this language is not followed a unit member should send an email to Debbie Kardas PPSTA President (cc their CBR) who will then advise of the next appropriate step.

The Importance of Record Keeping

Whenever you send or receive a document such as a personal business day request, a time card for payment, a request for in-service credit or course approval, a formal evaluation or any other communication with the District office or administration, it is very important that you make and keep a copy. There are times that these forms are lost or misplaced or some problem arises with them. It makes it much more difficult to retrace steps and for the PPSTA leadership to argue on your behalf. Without copies of all documents, it is more difficult to make sure that you are afforded all the rights to which you are entitled.

If you submit a disciplinary referral, you should keep a copy for your files. If you have any confrontations with either administration or with parents, you should document all such encounters in writing. It is much easier to recall conversations right after they have taken place than after the fact. Always try to put exact quotes in such documents. By documenting any such encounters and making copies of all documents allows your union to represent you more effectively.

Retirees, if you would like to avail yourself of this opportunity, for a \$55 annual fee you can likewise have these documents prepared (and receive more legal services) by enrolling in the Legal Service Plan at <u>www.nysut.org</u>. You must buy the NYSUT Legal Plan before your appointment.

To request Sick Bank days:

Go to the **PPSTA.org** website, click on **forms** tab at the top, and print 2 forms:

- 1. Request for Withdrawal of Sick Days
- 2. Doctor Certification form for Sick Leave Bank

Send these forms along with a copy of a doctor's note specifically giving reason and dates to:

If possible make your request two weeks before days are needed.

You must use ALL of your allotted sick days first and then apply for Sick Bank for the remainder of the time you need to be out.

If in doubt about the number of sick days you have, contact Sheryl Small at 451-4900 Ext.4970.

The maximum number of days that can be requested is 30 days. If more days are needed then the entire process needs to be repeated.



Contract Corner

Question: I have been assigned grand jury duty. I will miss days because of this service. Is this a personal day?

Question: I have a subpoena to go to court. Is this a personal day?

- Answer: No. If you are compelled to be absent from duties by any court or official body having the power to legally compel attendance you will not be charged with **any** form of leave and your salary will be paid in full. (Article XV Section 7)
- Question: I have been told that in order for me to get paid for credits beyond my Bachelors or my Masters degree that they must be graduate level credits. Is this true?
- Answer: No, according to Article XII Section 5.4 there is no stipulation in either section (a) (BA) or section (b) (MA) that the credits must be at a graduate level. All that is mentioned is that there is a maximum of seventy five (75) credit hours for pay beyond a Bachelors degree and sixty (60) credit hours beyond a Masters degree except for inservice coursework which may be accumulated beyond the hours above. Credits are paid at a rate of \$95 per credit during this school year. (Either college credits or inservice credits)

Question: Can I leave the building during my prep period?

Answer: You may leave the building during your prep period as long as you follow procedure. You must sign out prior to leaving the building and then you must sign in. (Article XXIX Maintenance of Standards pg.40.)
