
## The American Civil War in Virginia (1861-1865) [Puzzle #2)

- 10) Leader of regiment of partisan rangers who raised havoc with Union troops fighting a guerrilla war in Northern VA
- 11) River from Chesapeake Bay up to the Confederate capitol used by Union troops to attack Richmond from Wash., DC
- 13) Union General who captured Atlanta and burned everything from there to the Sea
- <sup>14)</sup> City where Union troops were defeated as they attacked Confederates entrenched behind the stone wall on a hill
- 17) Confederate iron-clad which fought the Union's Monitor
- 18) City where General Lee surrendered the Army of Northern Virginia to General Grant
- <sup>19)</sup> Battle in PA where many Virginians died in an ill conceived charge on entrenched Union troops

- 2) Political Party that nominated Lincoln for a second term as President of the United States
- 3) City to which the Confederate government retreated after Richmond was abandoned
- 4) Place where Lincoln gave his famous Gettysburg Address
- 5) Act requiring return of fugitive slaves to their masters
- 7) General Grant's campaign which forced General Lee's Army into trenches at Petersburg South of Richmond
- 8) State that gained state-hood during the Civil War because it was against slavery
- 12) Union General who defeated Confederate forces in the Shenandoah Valley
- 15) Northerners who opposed the Union's draft and war with Southern secessionist states
- <sup>16)</sup> Confederate cavalry officer famous for "riding around the enemy" and failing to give warning of Union movements at Gettysburg
