Julia serves as Director of Music Ministries at Trinity United Methodist Church in Wilmette and is a sought-after soprano soloist and voice teacher.

Maurice Duruflé: Requiem

One of the most intimate and monumental works for choir, the Rachmaninov All-Night Vigil has never been performed by the Choral Society. Based on Psalm 104, "Bless The Lord, O My Soul" is an a cappella wonder. The concert launches further into a celebration of the psalmody with a Bernstein classic. Chichester Psalms features lyrical, intimate settings of three complete psalms in their original Hebrew, plus verses from several other psalms. The sublimely beautiful Duruflé Requiem, a work not performed by the NSCS for twenty years, completes this stirring program. This concert will be truly satisfying for the soul.

David Stech earned a master's degree in orchestral conducting from Northwestern University and a BA in organ performance and choral conducting at California State University, Chico. David is music director of the American Opera Group and the Chicago Choral Artists. He is also music director and organist of the United Church of Hyde Park, and staff accompanist at DePaul University and the Chicago Children's Choir.

"ETHEREAL LIGHT"

Gabriel Fauré: Pavane, Après un Rêve, Requiem Sergei Rachmaninov: Vocalise Morten Lauridsen: Lux Aeterna

Explore the many facets of light through the lens of music. Bask in the masterful harmonies of Fauré, beginning with his rarely heard *Pavane*, a wordless vocalise for choir and orchestra of exceptional beauty, performed by the NSCS for the first time. Also hear the poetic and haunting *Après un Rêve* and the beloved *Requiem*, last presented by the Choral Society in 1988. Shedding their own light onto the program will be the long, shimmering lines of the Rachmaninov *Vocalise*. Another new work for the NSCS will be the luminous *Lux Aeterna* of Morten Lauridsen, a choral masterwork marked with gleaming harmonies and unexpected melodic turns. Whether addressing the subject of light textually or illuminating the wordless harmonies that light the listener's ear, this concert is certain to be a bright spot in your season.

David H. Edelfelt earned an MM degree in vocal performance from Northwestern University and a BM in music education from Crane School of Music in Potsdam, New York. He is currently director of the Chancel Choir and a women's Motet Choir at First Presbyterian Church, Libertyville, where his duties include leading choir and orchestra in major choral works. At his private studio in Chicago, David teaches voice and serves as musical coach to some of Chicagoland's most celebrated singers.
