Before sending your student off to school in Free Dress, please re-read the Free Dress Policy in the Parent/Student Handbook which states:

"Students must be appropriately dressed, even though not in official school uniform. The school's intention in setting out guidelines for non-uniform dress is to help ensure students are not calling attention to themselves by the way they dress.

- Tank tops, halter necks, bare midriffs, plunging necklines, excessively short or tight skirts or dresses are not permitted.
- Girls' skirt, dress and shorts may not be shorter than 2" above the knee.
- For safety reasons, closed-toe shoes must be worn, even on free dress days or Field Trips.
- Ripped, torn, shredded, etc. jeans are not appropriate for free dress."


