PROGRAM INCLUSIONS

Return and internal flights; twin share accommodation; meal plan; travel insurance; airport transfers; tuition and material fees with partner institute; language program; organised excursion and activity costs; contribution to study tour leader costs; \$250 administration fee.

Students will be required to arrange their own visa (if identified), passport (with 6 months validity) and cover their own personal spending/incidentals ie meals and in-country transport not included.

Ten x \$3,000 student grants funded through the Department of Education Endeavour Mobility program will automatically be awarded to the top students to assist in reducing costs for the program.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Students will have the opportunity to visit Beijing and Jiamusi in China as part of this tour. First, students will also be accompanied on a range of cultural tours in Beijing to visit major attractions such as the Great Wall, 2008 Beijing Olympic venues and a variety of palaces. A meeting with Trade and Investment Queensland is also arranged to expose students to networking opportunities.

Students will then travel to Jiamusi to where the Heilongjiang Province Linye College of Health Professions will put on an opening ceremony for the group as they experience the folk custom and quintessence of Chinese culture. Students will then participate in lectures over the next three days, delivered by Heilongjiang Province Linye College of Health Professions on topics such as Chinese traditional medicine (acupuncture, manipulation, food therapy) and will also visit a traditional Chinese Medicine hospital in Jiamusi. Students will also have the opportunity for free time and a tour in Hezhen scenic spot before returning home.

This program includes basic language classes prior to departure and upon arrival in China. Basic language classes will occur 2 hours per week and commence approximately 2 months prior to departure. Further information will be provided at your information session.
