



#### Friday 4th March 2016 WOMEN'S WORLD DAY OF PRAYER

This year we will be celebrating Women's World Day of Prayer with a service prepared by Christian women in Cuba. The theme "Receive children. Receive me" reflects St Mark's Gospel (Chpt 10 v 13-16) reminding us that everyone is a child of God and equally worthy of our love and respect. All are welcome to join us for one or both of the services this year at:

Refreshments will be served from 10.15am before the morning service and from 7pm before the evening service in our "Welcome Café".

Women's World Day of Prayer is an international, ecumenical, prayer movement that invites women, from a different part of the world each year, to prepare a worship service through which their hopes and fears for their country may be brought before the whole world in prayer.

It is estimated that from the first service held on the island of Samoa to the final service some 35 hours later as the sun sets off the coast of American Samoa 3 million people in over 170 countries and islands will have gathered to observe the day of prayer written by Christian women in Cuba. It has been translated into over 60 languages and 1000 dialects. In the British Isles alone over 6000 services will be held!

# Sunday 31st January 2016 at 6.30pm

For our first concert of 2016 we welcome back the very impressive musicians of Harrow School. Many will remember their predecessors' visit to Chinnor when they delighted us with their versatility and ability to present mature, technically assured performances. On this occasion they will be playing chamber music by Mozart, Schubert, Borodin, Elgar – and probably others!

There has been extensive discussion in the press in recent months concerning the place of music and the arts in schools and in our public examination system, where there is constant pressure to reduce their importance in the compulsory element of the curriculum in favour of subjects deemed to be of infinitely greater importance on account of their basic "relevance". Schools that are in a position to make excellent provision for the practice of music, drama, design and the fine arts have no doubts about the decisive benefits that they make in developing intellectual judgement, imagination and creativity in the context of a broadly based education. Harrow is one such school and it is of significant interest that it seeks to attract music scholars, particularly from across the Far East, who are just as likely to be A\* pupils and to study science and mathematics at university as they are to pursue musical careers.

Do come and enjoy the music-making of these talented and motivated young people. There are no charges for admission. A collection will be taken to assist with expenses.
