

# BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING (BSN) APPLICATION CHECKLIST

#### STEP 1: APPLY TO UW SEATTLE

If you are not currently attending the University of Washington Seattle campus, you will need to apply. See <a href="http://admit.washington.edu/Admission">http://admit.washington.edu/Admission</a> for requirements, fees and deadlines.

### STEP 2: APPLY TO THE BSN DEGREE PROGRAM

The BSN program application and supplemental materials must be submitted no later than **5:00pm PT on January 15.** Send the items below directly to the UW School of Nursing in <u>1</u> packet and in the following order (without staples or clips):

#### STEP 3: WRITE THE PROCTORED ESSAY

After initial review of the BSN applications, some applicants will be emailed and asked to write the proctored essay. This essay counts towards your total application score. **You will receive an email notifying you whether or not you need to write the proctored essay by 5:00pm PT on Friday, February 12, 2016.** 

If you are asked to write the proctored essay and do not, your application will no longer be considered for admission.

If you are asked to write the proctored essay and you live in the Seattle area, you must come to the Health Sciences Building at the UW Seattle campus to complete the essay.

#### AUTUMN QUARTER 2016 APPLICATION DEADLINE

#### 5:00pm PT, January 15, 2016

Applicants who submit all required materials by 5:00pm PT on January 15 and complete the proctored essay are ensured a review.

Applications received after the deadline, missing required materials (including the proctored essay), missing a signature or not meeting the minimum GPA requirements will not be considered for admission.

Applications postmarked 1/15/2016 or later will not be accepted.

**The proctored essay is scheduled for Wednesday, February 17, 2016 from 6:00pm – 7:00pm.** Directions to the Health Sciences Building can be found at <a href="http://nursing.uw.edu/about/maps-directions">http://nursing.uw.edu/about/maps-directions</a>, and the room number will be included in the email invitation to those who qualify.

Out-of-area applicants for whom it would not be reasonable to come to the UW to write the essay should provide the name and contact information for a faculty member, academic advisor, or work supervisor who will serve as your essay proctor. **Your proctor cannot be a family member or personal friend, and cannot be changed after you submit your application to the School of Nursing.** A **professional** email address is required for your proctor (no Gmail, Hotmail, etc.).

We will send a confirmation email to your proctor the Friday before the proctored essay to verify that the email address you provided is valid. Your proctor must respond by noon the following Monday.

The essay topic and instructions for administering the essay will be emailed to your proctor by 5:00pm Pacific Time (PT) on the Monday prior to the proctored essay date. Out-of-area proctored essays must be returned by noon PT the day after the proctored essay is held on the Seattle campus. Essays received after the deadline will not be accepted.

There are NO make-up sessions for the proctored essay, whether in person or outof-area.

To expedite processing of your application, please submit all of your application materials in 1 packet, including official transcripts and your letter of recommendation. You should keep copies of your application materials for your own records.

If you live in the Seattle area, you are welcome to drop your application off in person. If you are mailing your application packet to us, we recommend that you send it via Certified Mail with a tracking number.

#### E. REQUIRED PRE-NURSING COURSES

List the specific required Natural World courses you have taken or plan to take, indicating when you completed or will complete them. Enter the credits earned and decimal grades you received *for completed courses only*. At the time you submit your application, you MUST have <u>at least 3</u> Natural World prerequisite courses COMPLETE with a cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) of 3.0 or higher for those courses. If you have completed 4 or more Natural World prerequisite courses, you must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.8 for those courses.

A minimum grade of 2.0 ("C") or equivalent is required for each prerequisite course. A course does not count towards the BSN prerequisites if it was taken *Credit/No Credit* or *Pass/Fail*. All prerequisite courses <u>must be completed with a minimum 2.0 grade</u> earned before enrollment in the BSN program.

Do not list courses that received lower than a 2.0. You must successfully repeat these prior to beginning the program.

#### APPROVAL OF DISABILITY ACCOMMODATIONS FOR THE PROCTORED ESSAY

- 1. **If you are already registered for services through** the Disability Resources for Student (DRS) office (<a href="http://depts.washington.edu/uwdrs/">http://depts.washington.edu/uwdrs/</a>), you should have received an email from them, through the myDRS system, shortly after your Access Planning Meeting. A copy of the email will be located in your myDRS mailbox titled: [DRS] Eligibility for Academic Adjustments and Accommodations. This email can be printed and submitted to the School of Nursing.
- 2. If you have not yet made contact with the DRS office but have had accommodations approved at another campus you previously attended, you can provide a copy of the academic accommodation plan from that college, university or high school directly to the School of Nursing. This would only address accommodations for the proctored essay and will not necessarily apply beyond the proctored essay. You should be seen at DRS to discuss accommodations applicable to your academic courses.
- 3. **If you have accommodations approved at another campus you currently attend and plan to write the proctored essay there,** provide the name and contact information for the Disability Resource Services office in the "Out of Area Applicant Essay Proctor" section above. The School of Nursing will send the essay prompt to that office, which will provide your approved accommodation.
- 4. **If you have never been approved for disability accommodations,** you will need to submit your documentation to DRS via the myDRS website and be seen for an Access Planning Meeting (APM). If you are not in the Seattle area, a phone APM may be possible.

#### TAKING THE PROCTORED ESSAY AT THE SCHOOL OF NURSING OR AT DRS

Some accommodations can be handled within the School of Nursing. However, certain accommodations – such as use of a computer or other adaptive equipment – will need to be scheduled at DRS. When testing needs to take place at DRS, the following process will apply:

- The School of Nursing will contact DRS to verify they have approved of the application.
- The DRS Testing Center will then contact you to set up a time to take the proctored essay, in consideration of available equipment and space. The DRS Testing Center can be reached at <a href="mailto:drstest@uw.edu">drstest@uw.edu</a>.

#### H. STATEMENT OF UNDERSTANDING AND SIGNATURE

I have read and understand the *Essential Qualifications of Candidates for ABSN & BSN Admissions, Continuance and Graduation*. The School of Nursing reserves the right to recommend that an applicant be denied admission or to recommend dismissal of an admitted student whose academic record or performance in clinical instruction does not meet minimal expectations or whose performance is not consistent with these essential qualifications.

The BSN program is an upper-division course of study requiring students to communicate effectively on their own behalf. Students in this program are expected to demonstrate skills in independent decision making, professional communication, critical thinking, and problem solving.

The way an applicant/prospective student communicates with the School of Nursing may be considered as a potential indicator of the applicant/prospective student's ability to succeed in the BSN program. The School of Nursing strives to promote the benefits of direct communication. This allows the communicator to express their thoughts and the recipient to consider and respond directly to another person's words and tone. **The School of Nursing sees indirect communication through a third party, whether a parent, friend, or another party, as decreasing the effectiveness of this communication and the possibility to create a productive relationship with the School of Nursing.** If a student or applicant has a disability affecting their ability to communicate, the School does not consider needed third party assistance as "indirect" communication and will provide all reasonable accommodations for that disability.

**School of Nursing admissions decisions are final.** In special circumstances, and at the School's sole discretion, the School may discuss some information about an application **with the applicant directly**, whether on the phone or in person.

  - My complete application must be received by the School of Nursing by the deadline or my application will not be considered for admission. Applications postmarked the date of the deadline or later and/or received after this deadline will not be reviewed.
  - o In addition to submitting the School of Nursing application, I am responsible for applying to the University of Washington if I am not currently a student. See <a href="http://admit.washington.edu/Admission/">http://admit.washington.edu/Admission/</a> for application requirements and deadlines.
  - o If I am offered and accept admission to the BSN program, I will be required to:
    - Pay to run a background check through Verified Credentials, Inc. Positive checks are evaluated for continuation/cancellation of admission on a case-by-case basis with input from you. A positive check does not mean automatic cancellation of your offer of admission.     - Keep my immunizations up-to-date.
    - Complete several compliance requirements, including providing documentation of the required immunizations and having a current CPR certification. For more information, see <a href="http://nursing.uw.edu/student-resources/compliance">http://nursing.uw.edu/student-resources/compliance</a>.
    - Attend clinical rotations assigned by the School of Nursing, some of which may be scheduled on evenings and weekends.
  - An offer of admission to the BSN program from the School of Nursing will be revoked for any of the following reasons:
    - I have not completed all required pre-nursing coursework with a minimum grade of 2.0 in each course prior to the start of the program.

- I have not met all compliance requirements by the deadlines stated in my admissions letter.
- I have not met University of Washington admissions requirements and am not successfully admitted to the UW as a transfer, post-baccalaureate or international undergraduate applicant.
- I have not been exempted from an English Language Proficiency requirement, including having successfully completed any required Academic English Program (AEP) courses, prior to the start of the program.
- In some cases, a positive conviction/criminal history check.
- o If my admission to the BSN program is revoked, to be considered again in future years I must re-apply with all new materials with no guarantee of admission.
- This application and all accompanying documents, including official transcripts, become the property of the UW School of Nursing and will not be returned to you. It is strongly recommended that you make a copy for your own records before submitting your application.
