Administrative Corner

Hello Manatee Family,

Believe it or not, we've reached the end of the 1st guarter! Our teachers and students are busy working hard preparing our students for mastery of the Common Core Standards (CCS) and New Generation Sunshine State Standards (NGSSS). We will be hosting several opportunities for our families to learn more about the curriculum and teaching methods soon. Please check the website and your child's backpack for announcements.

Monday, October 24, 2011, is a student holiday. Consider giving your child the opportunity to participate in a service learning activity in the community. We would love to hear about our students exhibiting good citizenship, so let us know if they do.

We hope to see all of our families on Friday, October 28, 2011, for the annual Fall Festival. More information about festival activities, tickets and prizes is included in the newsletter so be sure to read on. Our PTA coordinates the fun for this event and we appreciate their efforts. Please show your appreciation by joining the Mason PTA before November 1st. Our goal this year is 100% participation by this date.

Finally, there are a couple of important items I'd like to remind our parents about. Parents are asked to sign in at the office and receive a volunteer badge before entering the main area of the school. We also ask that teachers are notified in advance if you plan to visit their classrooms. Visits should not occur during student contact time. This includes delivering items to class, walking students to class, and going to classes to speak with teachers in the morning.

To date, we have over 700 tardies recorded! Of these tardies, more than 50 students have been tardy 5 or more times. There is a direct relationship between poor attendance/tardiness and class failure. When your child is tardy to school, valuable learning time is lost to him/her. When your child is late, there is a disruption in the teaching/learning situation which is unfair to the teacher and the other students. Therefore, it is imperative that all children arrive at school by 8:25 a.m. All except the main outer doors are locked at this time and students must be walked into the building and signed in at the front office desk. Please do not enter the bus loop to drop students off. You must park in designated parking areas and escort your child to the office.

Your child's safety is our #1 concern. Please help us keep our children safe and teach them to be responsible, educated and caring contributors of our school and our world.

Become a Surrogate parent for an Exceptional Student in our Community

A surrogate parent is a person who is appointed to act in the interests of an exceptional student who does not have a parent who can make educational decisions. The surrogate parent works with the school to plan the child's special education services.

A surrogate parent does not take care of the child at home, like an adoptive parent or foster parent does. A surrogate parent is not financially responsible for the child. A surrogate parent is more like a "school parent"—involved only in planning and making decisions about the child's special education.
