Fr. Ken's Corner

Dear Sisters and Brothers of Saint Rose of Lima Parish,

There once was a little boy who loved rocks. He collected big rocks (big and heavy for a six-year old boy), little rocks (usually called pebbles), round rocks, shiny rocks, flat rocks (slate) and square rocks, light-colored and black rocks, funny-looking rocks and rocks with no real description. After being told by his parents there were too many rocks all over the place, even under his bed, he decided they all needed a new home (not back in the ground) and that he would place them all at the curb and sell them to people passing by. All morning long, the lad gathered his rocks from every nook and cranny he was storing them and began to separate them into piles. By noon, he was finished and was sitting at the end of the driveway waiting to make his first sale.

"Whatcha doing?" asked his older brother who was seven.

"Mom and Dad said I have to get rid of my rock collection, so I'm selling them and finding a new home for them."

"How much?"

"A dollar each. I have some real beauties here."

"Nobody's gonna just give you a dollar for a rock. Ya hafta have a gimmick."

"What's a gimmick?"

"Something that makes people realize they really need something that you got."

"Well, I don't need a gimmick. Everyone needs a good rock."

And with two hand-made signs, he advertised - "A good deal! Everyone needs a rock: \$1. An even better deal! Two rocks are better than one: \$1!" To the surprise of his brother (and his parents), he sold all of his rocks before the end of the day.

Pope Francis' first book came out for sale last week, *The Name Of God Is Mercy*. The Holy Father did not need a gimmick to speak of the gift of mercy. It is a gift needed by all. Even if everybody doesn't need a good rock (or two), everyone needs to receive the gift of mercy, the foundation of love. Everyone, at the same time, needs to bestow the gift of mercy. As scripture (Mt. 10:8) says, 'As you have received, so give.' The main difference between the story of the little boy and mercy is that mercy is free. Mercy is God's Name. Mercy is available to all. What is similar in the two accounts is that two acts of mercy are better than one.

The work by Pope Francis is simple and easy to read as it is more or less written in a conversational style with an Italian journalist. It runs about 150 pages, and I'm sure that many will wonder just what Pope Francis has to say about mercy that requires 150 pages! I suggest that you buy the book (I get no commission) and find out.

Some may have issue with the Holy Father for his stress on the quality of mercy rather than placing more stress on the doctrine, the teaching of the Church. But I believe that Pope Francis would simply respond by reminding everyone of the words of Jesus when he says to his challengers, "Go and find the meaning of the words, 'it is mercy that I desire, not sacrifice'." (Matthew 9:13 Jesus quoting Hosea 6:6) In the Apostolic Exhortation, "Evangelii Gaugium" – The Joy of the Gospel - the pope makes it clear that the joy of the Gospel – the Good News of Jesus Christ – is found in God's gift of salvation. This gift of salvation, our redemption through the cross and resurrection of Jesus Christ, is simply the gift of God's merciful love. Mercy is truly undeserved forgiveness. And what is this forgiveness but a practical demonstration of divine love? It is a love in which we are called to participate. It is a Loving Mercy which is free – we need only respond.



Join the Fun this Year!



The *IRA Charitable Rollover* is back and is now permanent!

What's called a rollover is actually a "qualified charitable distribution" that can be made to our Parish.

If...

- You are at least 70 1/2 years old on the date you make your gift
- Your IRA is a traditional or Roth
- You don't exceed your personal maximum of \$100,000 per year in qualified charitable distributions

You will not have to report your distribution as income. It will be free of federal and New York State income tax, and it will count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD). The best way for you to start is with your IRA custodian. Tell them you want to make a "qualified charitable distribution." In most cases, you will only have to fill out a simple form.

VERY IMPORTANT!! Your gift <u>must</u> go directly from your IRA to the Parish. If you receive the money first, then you'll be taxed on it like any other distribution.

<u>Example</u>: Mrs. Connors, age 76, has \$125,000 in a traditional IRA and would like to contribute \$5,000 to her Parish in 2016. Upon hearing of the Charitable IRA Rollover opportunity, she directs the custodian of her IRA to transfer this amount not later than December 31, 2016 directly to the Parish as a 2016 gift. She will not be subject to income tax on her \$5,000 qualified charitable distribution.

The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord

In obedience to the Old Law, the Lord Jesus, the first-born, was presented in the Temple by his Blessed Mother and foster father, Saint Joseph. This is another 'epiphany' celebration insofar as the Christ Child is revealed as the Messiah through the canticle and words of Simeon and the testimony of Anna the prophetess. Sometimes called the *Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary*, the other aspect of the presentation consists of the ritual purification of Jewish women after they had given birth. In Mary's case, this purification was not necessary, but it indicates the renewal of her total offering of herself to God for the accomplishment of His Divine Plan. In the Middle Ages, this Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary, or 'Candlemas,' was of great importance. Christ is the light of the nations, hence the blessing and procession of candles on this day.

In honor of the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, we will have a special blessing for new and expectant Mothers at all weekend Masses on January 30 and January 31.
