SOUTHERN TANZANIA AND ZANZIBAR

August 25-September 9, 2014 Price \$8799

This trip has been on our horizon since our first northern Tanzanian safari in 2010, and the time to go further off the grid has finally come! We'll fly to Dar es Salaam before transferring by bush plane to wild and rugged **Ruaha National Park** for two nights, then carry-on overland to the lushly forested landscape of **Udzungwa Moun**-



tains National Park for long hikes in one Africa's most undeveloped and unique wildlife parks. Lovely Mikumi National Park is our next stop, and then it's on to Africa's largest wildlife reserve: Selous Game Reserve. We'll spend three nights alongside the Rufiji River for driving, walking and boat safaris in one of the last great remaining wild places on earth. We'll conclude this adventure with three nights at a laid-back Indian Ocean beach lodge on the island of Zanzibar! This is likely to be the most breathtaking journey we've ever taken; and we've taken some great ones. If the idea of a safari in one of the wildest, most remote corners of Africa interests you, YOU CAN SIGN UP NOW!

MEDIEVAL FRANCE

September 18-October 3, 2014 Price \$5295

Plans are underway for our 39th UW medieval studies tour. This fall's seminar will focus on the rich historical landscape and hidden treasures found in the southwest and central provinces of France and the Loire Valley. The study tour will explore the history, art, and architecture of the medieval cathedrals, churches and monasteries, castles, and towns of these regions. A number of the sites are associated with the fascinating twelfth-century queen, **Eleanor of Aquitaine**. The tentative itinerary will include visits to the medieval city of Poitiers; the castles of Chinon, Loches, Angers, Saumur, and Beynac; the Apocalypse Tapestries of Angers; the wonderful Romanesque churches of Chauvigny, Aulnay, Saintes, and St-Savin-sur-Gartempe (with its famous wall paintings); Eleanor of Aquitaine's beloved monastery of Fontevraud; the marvelous Gothic cathedrals of Chartres and Le Mans; the medieval towns of Sarlat and Domme; the prehistoric caves of Pech Merle and Rouffignac; and a few days in Paris.
