Scholarship Information

Fujitsu Asia Pacific Scholarship Program, 2006-2007

Fujitsu Scholarships to the JEMBA, CHEMBA, and ICMP programs are awarded to approximately 18 participants from predetermined countries. The scholarship aims to provide educational and intercultural opportunities to people from the Asia-Pacific region. After graduation, scholarship recipients are expected to apply their increased cultural sensitivity and business expertise in their home country, contributing toward mutual understanding and cooperation among countries.

JAIMS Programs

JEMBA—the Japan-focused Master of Business Administration—is a full-time, 15-month, AACSB International accredited MBA program offered by JAIMS and the University of Hawaii College of Business. JEMBA includes MBA courses, advanced Japan-focused management courses, business Japanese language study, and an internship with an organization in Japan.

CHEMBA—the China-focused Master of Business Administration—is a full-time, 15-month, AACSB International accredited MBA program offered by JAIMS and the University of Hawaii College of Business. CHEMBA includes MBA courses, advanced China-focused management courses, business Mandarin language study, and an internship with an organization in China.

ICMP—the Intercultural Management Program—is an intensive four-month graduate diploma program that focuses on American business. Offered by JAIMS, ICMP includes practical management-related courses, cross-cultural studies, business English communication, information technology, and a one-week field study in Japan.

The program period of JEMBA and CHEMBA is August 2006 to November 2007. The program periods of ICMP are September 2006 to January 2007 and April 2007 to July 2007. Fujitsu Scholarship Eligibility Criteria

JEMBA and CHEMBA Applicants:

You must qualify for admission to the program. For complete information, refer to the JEMBA/CHEMBA program brochure and application documents. Scholarship qualifications include the following:

- a. A bachelor's degree or one equivalent to a four-year standard baccalaureate degree in any discipline from a regionally or nationally accredited institution. Individuals who have an MBA degree are not admissible.
- b. Grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale in the last two years of undergraduate work and in all post-graduate work.
- c. GMAT score of 500 (550 and above preferred) taken between October 2000 and October 2005. On a case-by-case basis, a GRE score may be accepted if it has already been taken or if the GMAT is not given in the applicant's area, particularly for international students.
- d. For non-native English speakers, a TOEFL score of 600/250 (paper/computer) or IELTS overall band test result of 7.00 or higher preferred from tests taken between October 2003 and October 2005. Applicants whose TOEFL score is less than 600/250 or IELTS result is less than 7.00 may be required to attend supplementary English courses. Applicants who received a bachelor's degree or an advanced degree that comprises at least two years of full-time coursework within the last five years from a regionally accredited institution in the U.S., Australia, United Kingdom, or New Zealand; or from a university in Canada, Africa, or Singapore where English is the language of instruction are exempt from taking the TOEFL or IELTS.
- e. A minimum of three years of relevant full-time work experience at the time of application.
- f. You must be a legal resident of State of Hawaii or a citizen of one of the following countries: Cambodia, China*, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar*, Philippines, South Korea, Sri Lanka, Taiwan, Thailand, or Vietnam*.

** Special conditions apply to these countries. Please contact the Fujitsu Ltd. local affiliated office in your country/area.*

Applicants from China must physically reside in China (i.e., Chinese citizens who live outside of China are not eligible for consideration).

Only online applications will be accepted from applicants from China.

ICMP Applicants:

You must qualify for admission to the program. Scholarship qualifications include the following:

- a. A bachelor's degree or one equivalent to a four-year standard baccalaureate degree in any discipline from a regionally or nationally accredited institution.
- b. Grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- c. A minimum TOEFL score of 500/173 (paper/computer), TOEIC score of 600, or IELTS overall band test result of 5.00 or higher from tests taken between October 2003 and October 2005. Applicants who received a bachelor's degree or an advanced degree that comprises at least two years of full-time coursework within the last five years from a regionally accredited institution in the U.S., Australia, United Kingdom, or New Zealand; or from a university in Canada, Africa or Singapore where English is the language of instruction are exempt from taking the TOEFL, TOEIC, or IELTS.
- d. A minimum of three years of relevant full-time work experience at the time of application.
- e. You must be a citizen of one of the following countries: Cambodia, China*, India, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar*, Philippines, Sri Lanka, Thailand, or Vietnam*.

** Special conditions apply to these countries. Please contact the Fujitsu Ltd. local affiliated office in your country/area.*

Applicants from China must physically reside in China (i.e., Chinese citizens who live outside of China are not eligible for consideration). Only online applications will be accepted from applicants from China.

** Applicants from the following countries/areas are not eligible to receive the monthly stipend: Hawaii, Hong Kong, and Taiwan.*

Application Submission

Submit your application documents to JAAMS by October 31, 2005 (see special instructions for academic transcripts and test scores on the Application Checklist form).

Note: the submitted application documents will not be returned to applicants.

Screening/Selection Procedures

1. **Initial screening:** Initial screening is based on the strength of the application documents, which includes meeting the admission and scholarship qualifications.
2. **Interview:** Applicants who pass the initial screening will be contacted for an interview on a designated date in February or March 2006. Applicants should be residing in their respective countries of citizenship (or in Hawaii for Hawaii residents) at the time of their interview.
3. **Selection of recipients:**
 - a. Final selection will be determined by Fujitsu Ltd.
 - b. Selection is based on English proficiency (for non-native speakers of English), work experience, motivation, and goals as expressed in the essay and interview, academic performance, and test scores. A key factor is the individual's commitment to contributing to the mutual understanding and cooperation between countries and to the development of his/her home country. However, no single attribute outweighs others in the selection process, and strengths in one area may be used to offset weaknesses in another.
